National Volunteers.

Councillor Lafferty moved and Councillor P. McGinley seconded the adoption of the following resolution received from the Limerick County Council:—

That owing to recent political events, and particularly to the attitude of the Army on the Ulster question, we, the members of the Limerick County Council consider that the time has come when every effort should be made to organise the Irish Volunteer Force in every parish in Ireland.

We are convinced that such a force, wisely led by whom our indomitable leader Mr J. E. 

County Surveyor's Report.

The County Surveyor's Report for the half year ended Sept 1914 as follows was read:—

" During the half year ending Sept the weather was on the whole, favourable for the maintenance of roads and Contractors had therefore a good opportunity of getting their annual quantities of metal ready for measurement. There are many however considerably behind with this work and the result is reflected in the pay sheets by the amounts deferred or struck out.

The attention to surface work generally has not been sufficient even the loose rolling stones in many cases not being removed with regularity. Putting out a mixture of coarse stones and fine material greatly aggravates this nuisance. The coarse stone should be applied separately and none measured until reduced to 2" gauge.

It is most important to get water tables and outlets opened upon all roads—where this is not done (and particularly where the road is low in centre) they suffer more from the effects of heavy rain than from the public traffic.

It is now the time for cutting hedges and the contractors must send in the names and addresses of all occupiers having hedges next along their roads.

For the financial year ending March 1916

The annual limit of expenditure will be required to meet the outlay re maintenance contracts and other works."


