The Council is satisfied that this is the best arrangement can be made and the lowest tender to be got owing to the increased price of material since the estimate was made out. The Council decided to leave it optional with the contractor whether to build all together or in two blocks of 3 and they request the L. G. B to sanction the extension of time to be allowed this contractor to complete the work.
