There is no doubt that she is qualified by reason of her being employed for payment not above the maximum fixed by the Acts to occupy the cottage and it would be very unbecoming for a democratic Council like ours to act the part of a tyrannical Landlord towards one whose connections both in Glenties and the Provinces contribute largely towards the Rates of the District. If we start to scrutinise the Tenants' qualifications and treat them the same I fear many of the Cottages now let to good Tenants will become

white elephants on our hands resulting in a big loss to the ratepayers Mrs Kelly will I have no doubt be one of our best tenants therefore it is our interest to adhere to the letting made by acting otherwise we will be doing an injustice to those whom we represent.

After a considerable amount of discussion the following resolution was unanimously arrived at Messrs John Quinn and Michael Doyle dissenting

"That as Mrs Kelly has satisfied the Council that she is eligible to become tenant of a Cottage by reason of her employment. That housing works for payment not exceeding 2/6 a day. We decline to exercise our arbitrary power of Ejection and further so because of her inability to get a suitable house elsewhere in the locality and of the G.D. Board refusal to give a site for a house on their unencumbered lands at Glenties altho of her having to live for the past 3 1/2 years in part of another man's house the whole of which is now the size of one of our new Cottages. To evict Mrs Kelly and throw her out on the roadside would be a harsh and vindictive proceeding on our part and so she belongs to a respectable connection who contribute largely to the Rates of the Union and District we are the less inclined to act the part of cruel landlords honestly believing that by her employment at the principal industry of the County she has qualified to become a tenant."

8. 2. 1916 From John Caffrey Esq. In accordance with the terms of your appointment and the conditions set forth in the L.G.B. letter No 1445 dated 23rd July I took up the duty of inspecting the Cottages I have made a general inspection of all the Cottages and plots and I herewith enclose you a detailed statement regarding the condition of each Cottage in your District. I have been trying to impress upon the Tenants the great necessity for working their plots. Some of the Tenants seem to realize the usefulness of the advice others seem to treat it with contempt. I intend to visit again the Tenants who refuse to work their plots in a fortnight or so and I would ask you to give me the necessary authority to serve them with a Notice to quit unless they are making some attempt to comply with the instructions. I am getting some freeholds for some of the Tenants. If I had been appointed earlier I could have done better for the Tenants in that line.

"The Council consider the Report most satisfactory and made the following order. The Contractors who have not completed their contracts to be warned also their covenants to have their contracts finished on the 31st March and the Architect to take them over and finish them at the Contractors expense. The Clerk to make another visit and serve a Notice to quit on any Tenant who is not working his plot and also to try to get tenants who will work their plots. The Clerk to make out an estimate of the repairs which he thinks should be carried out by the Tenants and the Council during the summer."

 (b). Workmen have become scarce hence the demand for higher wages.
 (c). Horsework has become more expensive. In the case of Mr Mullin Bros I estimate the timber has advanced on each cottage about £12-10-0 cement approximately £1-0-0 labour skilled and unskilled about £5-0-0 per cottage, cartage and lime approx 10/- and £2-10-0 respectively. From these figures I reckon that since the Contractors commenced the works there has been an advance of at least £21-10-0 on each Cottage. There was a delay in commencing the works but since they were started fair progress has been made. The above applies in all respects to Cunningham's contract but in addition he was involved in at least £10 expenses for extras on Foundations in excavation and building.
