authority making temporary arrangements for the discharge of the duties of an office rendered vacant by the absence of any employees who joined His Majesty's Forces until the conclusion of the war.

Letters from A.G. McNulty no. 3 Hamilton Terrace Bundoran and from Laurence Storey no. 4 Hamilton Terrace Bundoran pointing out that the premises occupied by them were in an unsanitary state. Both letters were dated 10th April 1915. Letter dated 12th April 1915 from Thomas Gallen 8 Brighton Terrace applying for a tenancy of Artisans Dwelling.

The reply to letters from Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction forwarded by Clerk stating that the Council was not in a position to participate in Co. Donegal Joint Technical Scheme was approved of. The Clerk was directed to reply to letters from occupants of nos. 3 & 4 Hamilton Terrace stating that the Medical Officer of Health would be communicated with in reference to alleged nuisances existing; also to reply to Thomas Gallen stating that consideration of his application was deferred. Medical Officer of Health to be communicated with relative to alleged unsanitary state of nos. 3 & 4 Hamilton Terrace.

Mr Kelly raised the question of the control of the Labourers Cottages in the district and the Council unanimously agreed that three members would wait on members of Ballyshannon Rural District Council to arrange matters of adjustments and liabilities consequent on the urbanisation of the Town of Bundoran; members of both Councils to meet on Saturday 17th April inst at the Board room Ballyshannon.

The following resolutions were passed unanimously. Proposed by Mr J Gorman (Sen) Seconded by Mr J. Carty V. Chairman "That the Local Government Board be asked to sanction an arrangement whereby the same person may act as Poor Rate collector and Town Rate collector."

Proposed by Mr H Kelly Seconded by Mr J. Carty. "That a sum not exceeding three pounds be expended in repairing the dangerous breaches in the Town side paths: work to be done to the satisfaction of Chairman and Clerk."

Proposed by Mr Kelly Seconded by Mr Thos. Gorman (Sen) "That the Provincial Banking Company Bundoran be appointed Treasurer of the Bundoran Urban District Council"

Proposed by Mr H Kelly Seconded by Mr John Carty V. Chairman That Paying Orders to the amount of £25-10-8 be issued as follows:- To Herald Printing works for Books forms &c £5-6-0 To Edward Daly for Election Expenses £8-19-10 To Edward Daly for Clerks Salary £10-0-0 To John Gorman for Cleansing Street 10/- To Edward Daly for Office Expenses 14/10

Owing to the large amount of work before the meeting it was unanimously agreed to adjourn the meeting to Wednesday 14th April inst at 7.00 pm. The meeting fixed 28th April 1915 as the date on which the Rate for the Financial Year is to be made and a requisition signed by five Councillors to this effect was handed to the Clerk. Thos Gorman Esq (Jun) P.P. presided. Others present were: Messrs Jos. Cusack; Pat. Daly; John Carty V. Ch. Jas Ward. The following resolutions were passed unanimously. Proposed by Thos. Gorman Chairman seconded by John Carty V. Chairman. "That the Annual Salary of Clerk of the Council be fixed at £60 (Sixty pounds Sterling). Proposed by Mr Jas Ward seconded by John Carty V. Chairman. "That the Annual Salary of Town Surveyor of the Urban District of Bundoran be fixed at £40 (Forty pounds Sterling)". Proposed by Thomas Gorman Chairman seconded by Mr Jas Ward. "That the salary of Sanitary Sub Officer for Bundoran Urban District be fixed at £20 (Twenty pounds Sterling) per annum". Proposed by Pat. Daly seconded by Jos. Cusack "That the poundage for the collection of Poor Rate and Consolidated Town Rate be fixed at eight pence in the pound on the amount of each rate. Proposed by Mr Thos. Gorman (Jun) Chairman, seconded by Mr John Carty Vice Chairman "That Mr Edward Daly the present Town Clerk be appointed Clerk of Bundoran Urban District Council" Proposed by Thos Gorman Chairman seconded by John Carty Vice Chairman. "That Mr Michael Mulhern the present Rate collector be continued in the position if willing to act." Proposed by Mr Pat. Daly seconded by Mr Jas Carty V. Chairman "That the salaries fixed and appointments made be subject to the approval of the Local Government Board. Proposed by Thomas Gorman Jun Chairman seconded by Pat. Daly. "That we hereby fix Monday 3rd May 1915 as the date on which applications for offices under the Council which are now vacant will be considered and appointments to those offices made; the meeting on above date to be held at 7.00 pm in Townist Lodge main Street Bundoran". Proposed by Thos Gorman (Jun) Chairman seconded by Patrick Daly "That the Quarterly meetings of the Council be held on the first Tuesday of each of the months of January, April, July, October, Proposed by Mr Pat. Daly seconded by Mr J. Carty. "That the Clerk be directed to advertise for Sanitary Sub Officer and Town Surveyor for Bundoran Urban District". Proposed by Thomas Gorman Esq J.P. Chairman seconded by Mr John Carty V. Chairman, "That we hereby request the Local Government Board to assent to the sanction of a loan to meet the liabilities and expenses of the Bundoran Urban District Council till 1st September 1915 and to allow interest at the rate of four per cent on amount of loan to be paid from the Consolidated Town Rate" Proposed by Mr Pat. Daly seconded by Mr J. Carty. "That we hereby agree to take over possession of the Bathing machines owned by the Bundoran Beach and Town Improvement Committee. A card dated 6th April 1915 was read from Robert Myles C.P. Sessions Ballyshannon requesting to be informed what the Commissioners intend to do re portion of fines claimed by the Authorities. Clerk directed to reply stating that Local Govt. Board had not given its sanction for refund. The Clerk was asked to write L. G. B. requesting sample bye laws and he was asked to, if possible, procure more suitable offices.

Thomas Gorman Esq JP (Junior) Chairman presided and the other Councillors present were: John Carty V. Chairman John Doherty (Owen); Henry Kelly; Jas. Ward; Joseph Busack Patrick Daly; John Conlan; Thomas Gorman (Sen) and Pat' Meehan Mr C. H. O'Doherty, Secy Co. Donegal Joint Committee for Technical Instruction attended and asked that a rate of 1^d in the £ be levied on the Urban District so that Bundoran could participate as heretofore in the operation under the County Donegal Joint scheme for Technical Instruction. The Chairman said that as this was a special meeting the Council could take no action in the matter but promised to have it considered at next monthly meeting.

Thos. Gorman Esq J.P. (Jnr) presided and the other present were: Councillors Jas. Carroll, John Barty V. Chairman Joseph Busack; James Ward; John Doherty Jr. Patrick Daly John Doherty; Henry Kelly; Patrick Meehan.

The minutes of last meetings were read and signed.

The following letters were laid before meeting:—

Poor Rate & Town Rate Collectors

From Local Government Board no. 20,811:1915 dated 20th 4/5 forwarding copies of model Bye Laws. Letter no. 20 617:1915 stating that Board will consent to offices of Poor Rate Collector and Town Rate Collector being held by same person provided sub article (f) of article 86 of the Public Bodies Order 1913 is observed, and forwarding form of queries to be filled up respecting person appointed as Rate Collector. Letter no. 21121:1915 forwarding copy of Boards Sanitary Order no 2 and calling attention to terms of Article 4 thereof. Letter no. 21342:1915 stating that their sealed order of 12th May 1914 fixing the time of meeting on the first Monday of every month remains in force. From County Council of Donegal forwarding Demand on Urban District for £ 642.18⁰⁰ first Quarterly instalment to be paid on or before 1st June prox. Letter no. 355 dated 21st April 1915. no. 327 stating that the adjustments of property and liabilities would be made later on. From Ballyshannon District Council stating that Messrs Ward and Garigan were appointed to meet two members of Bundoran Urban Council with a view to go into adjustments between the Councils letter was dated 1st May 1915. From Ballyshannon Union dated 1st May acknowledging receipt of Rate Book. From Michael Mulhern Bundoran stating he was prepared to accept positions of Poor Rate and Town Rate Collector on same terms as given by Donegal County Council to each Collector.

Meehan "that we the members of Bundoran Urban Council hereby emphatically protest against the unjust taxation about to be imposed on one of our few and remaining industries and we call upon our Irish representatives without distinction of politics to resist its imposition by every means in their power" Passed unanimously

Proposed by Mr H Kelly seconded by J. Doherty Sen "that we beg to tender our very deep sympathy to the family and relatives of the late Mrs Agnes O'Gorman of Bundoran in their recent sad bereavement" Passed in silence.

Three reports from Medical Officer of Health were laid before meeting.

No. 1 dated 15th April 1915 on Mrs J. Daly's House Bundoran stating it was in a filthy condition and recommending removal of hens and lime washing of premises. The Clerk reported to Medical Officer that his recommendations were carried out.

No. 2 & 3 date 16th April 1915. reporting serious nuisance in Houses no 3 and no 4 ^{Hamilton Terrace} and recommending Council to ask owner to repair drains and connect

with sewer and noting if the request is not complied with immediately to compel owner to do necessary work.

Clerk read letter dated 19th April 1915 addressed to Messrs Lipsitt and Ramage Ballyshannon the supposed owners of Houses no 3 and no 4 Hamilton Terrace asking them to have medical Officers recommendations carried out, and their reply dated 21st April 1915 stating that they would get the matter put right on receiving particulars from Mr Crawford.

The Council directed the Clerk to forward by registered letter to Messrs Lipsitt & Ramage a notice requiring the abatement of nuisance, on the motion of Mr Carty seconded by Mr Doherty.

Clerk to notify P. McCaffrey West End Bundoran to Council house drain to Town Sewer.

On the motion of Mr John Carty seconded by Mr Jas. Carroll it was decided to adjourn meeting to Wednesday 5th May inst. at 7⁰⁰ pm

Report of Town Surveyor for Quarter ended 30th day of September 1915.

To the Chairman and members of the Bundoran Urban District Council
Gentlemen,

In accordance with Article 8 paragraph 2 of the Urban (Transferred 'Business Procedure) Order 1906 I beg to submit the following Report for the Quarter ended 30th September 1915.

Roads.

The continuous heavy rains during the months of July and August, have had a most injurious effect upon the roads under the Council's jurisdiction. The injury caused by the washing away of binding material was most noticeable on the inclines where many furrows were formed. The heavy traffic especially of motor cars and lorries, also is accountable for the rapid wear of the metal. Hollows and furrows have been kept filled with screenings and the general state of the carriage way may now be regarded as fair. At one hollow place owing to defective drainage the roadway has been repeatedly flooded and I beg to suggest that a suitable pipe be constructed to carry away all the surface water.

Cleansing

The cleansing of the Town Streets has been attended to carefully and regularly and their general cleanliness has given the greatest satisfaction. The great bulk of the inhabitants cooperated with the Council in the effort to keep the town clean but there are still many who persist in defiling the streets with dust and rubbish swept from their houses. I may again point out that the cleansing of the Township as a whole cannot be effectively carried out in the absence of a suitable dumping ground; it would be well too if some means of allaying the dust were provided before the ensuing Summer months.

I have written asking if Donegal County Council will hire out the services of the Steam Road Roller when operating in the Township and received a reply that the matter will be brought before the members in due course.

Owing to tenders not having been received for works nos. 2, 3, and 4 on Proposal lists of last Quarterly meeting the work no. 2 was executed as directed by the Council under my superintendence. Works nos. 2 and 4 in consequence of the high prices of materials and the difficulty of procuring workmen still remain undone but fortunately these works are not urgent.

Footpaths

Generally speaking the flagged footpaths in the Urban Area are far from satisfactory. In very many instances the flags are displaced and fractured - their edges projecting awkwardly while the crossings to entries and public rights of way are both uneven and unsightly - not to say dangerous. I should recommend a gradual replacing of these footpaths by concrete the old flags removed being re-dressed and placed in the less prominent parts of the town.

Water Supply

During the Quarter the pressure of water has been well maintained a plentiful supply reaching to the highest levels in the township.

In consequence of the recurrence of great drought and I must repeat to the evident avoidable wastage of water the pressure has appreciably decreased and if these conditions prevail much longer the water cannot reach the lavatories at the highest elevations.

By careful supervision on the part of the Council and more consideration on the part of the people supplied (many of them gratis) there appears to be no reason why there should be any apprehension that sufficient water for the use of the inhabitants of the Township should not be available.

There is still a leakage in the supply pipes at Guba Creevy Cross roads and the pipe to fountain at Mr. Sharps, East End requires to be cleared. The supply pipe to public fountain at Drumalavin Cross Roads has been losing some water but as the repairs to these pipes will necessitate cutting off the supply from the town I have got temporary fixtures made and shall proceed in a short time to have all the defects remedied. Some fountain heads need repair or replacing. The intake at the mountain has been carefully attended to and regularly inspected during the Quarter. It is now in good order.

Sewers

The public sewers have been examined (the last general examination having been made on the 6th September 1915) and flushed periodically with the result that the foul odours which emanated from them in the early Summer have been completely removed.

The channel in no. 1 manhole seems to be

rather wide and a deposit of sewage matter occasionally accumulates in it. The manhole opposite gate of Roman Catholic Church often was found not to have been thoroughly cleared owing apparently to the insufficient fall of the pipes at this place. A flushing tank would be useful on this sewer.

The public sewer running through John Magill's garden was stopped up and on its being opened the workman found the disc of an intercepting trap some cement which appeared to have come from between the pipe joints and a large quantity of sand deposited. It is now working satisfactorily.

The Septic Tank gave no trouble since it was cleaned last Spring.

I would recommend that the contaminated water seen often near the public Urinal at Septic Tank be conveyed in a proper drain to the main sewer.

A large number of house drains including those from the two blocks of Labourers Cottages recently erected, require to be laid and connected with the main sewer.

If this work were carried out, disagreeable sights and smells quite convenient to some of the most frequented public walks, would be removed with much advantage to the health of the inhabitants.

Lighting

The lighting of the Town is satisfactory. Two additional lamps have been placed by direction of the Council opposite Antrim House West End and Irish Lane respectively.

I beg to suggest the advisability of removing the old oil lamp standards and heads now a source of danger and of erecting them in suitable places on the public roads leading to the beach.

Public Conveniences

The misuse of the Urinals, now erected in the Township has been a source of serious nuisance and there were numerous complaints made regarding their filthy condition and of the absence of proper sanitary accommodation near the foreshore.

Suitable conveniences containing proper water closets to connect to main sewer could be erected at places on the cliffs where they would not be conspicuous in any way.

Labourer

The constant services of a labourer will be required in the Urban District and it appears desirable that the Council should immediately arrange to appoint a suitable man for general work. (over)

Fire Engine

The provision of fire extinguishing appliances is a matter for consideration by the Council.

I may point out that the removal of obstructions and also their prevention on public roads in the Township are matters requiring your attention.

Foreshore

I have had correspondence recently with the Dist Rent Office relative to the powers of the Council over the Foreshore and in order that your powers may extend to this part of the Urban Area it will be necessary for you to obtain an Order from the Local Government Board or Chief Secretary extending the whole or part of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act 1907 to the Urban District.

In submitting this report I take the opportunity of pointing out that it is not nearly so comprehensive as it might be. Many matters which I purpose to bring under your notice later have been purposely omitted.

Considering that the valuation of the Township is very small and the present Rates so high and also that this is a time when economy should be rigidly practised I have refrained from making recommendations involving any considerable outlay. Consequently

I recommend that the following works be carried out. viz.

- ① To make about 8 feet of flagged pipe provided with suitable grating, properly set on left hand side of road leading from Bundoran to Kinkough between Christ Church and Roman Catholic Church according to Town Surveyors Specification. Cost not to exceed £1.
- ② To make about 12 feet of glazed stoneware drain from Urinal at Septic Tank to connect with main Sewer. Cost not to exceed £1.
- ③ To repair about 30 yards of flagged footpath according to directions of Town Surveyor. Cost not to exceed £4.
- ④ I recommend that Bryan Doherty Bundoran be paid six pounds on foot of amount of Contract no. 1. entered into the 14th day of June 1915.
