 I beg to submit the following Report for the Quarter ended
 31st December 1915

Roads:- The roads under the jurisdiction of the Council
 may be said to be in fair order. Many places
 require attention at present and it will be
 necessary to apply metal even in the absence
 of a Steam Road Roller. I have ordered the
 Contractor to apply additional gravel to the footpath
 leading from Bundoran to Kinelough

Steam Road Roller:- I would suggest that the Council

 of the built drain which served as a sewer
 before the introduction of the new Sewerage system
 has in many places fallen in, and instead
 of the drain having been cleared and
 properly re-covered it appears that the places
 where these breaches occurred were filled in
 with road scrapings and other rubbish, thereby
 interrupting the free flow of surface water
 and some sewage matter. It would be
 highly desirable if the Council give this matter
 their serious consideration.

The Septic Tank is now undergoing cleansing
 and repairs as ordered by the Council and

The drain from Public Urinal near the Septic

A small pipe about 8 feet long has been made

Mr. J. Caffrey, County Surveyor, Donegal intimated through Town Surveyor that he would require the Road contractor to repair old built street sewer, already reported on.

A letter dated 5th February 1916 was read.

from Messrs. Robert Lipsitt and Co. Ballyshannon with reference to Notice requiring "Abatement of Nuisance" served on Messrs. Lipsitt & Ramsay Solicitors, stating, amongst other things that "we believe if anything is now required the necessary requirements should be done either by all the tenants in Hamilton Terrace or else by those responsible for the sewerage in Bundoran"

Town Surveyor stated that before Bundoran was created an Urban District a sewer was made, with which the drainage from the houses in Hamilton Terrace was connected. This new sewer was connected with an old one, joining the last two manholes on Mr. Hamilton's property.

The intercepting traps should be removed from present position and set at the sewer side of manholes, where they ought to be.

A report from the San. Sub. Officer stating that a pipe in Mr. Conlan's field empties on Mrs. J. Hamilton's land near the strand, was read. Council took no action on this report dated 6th March 1916.

A report of Medical Officer of Health stating that Constable Wm Fleming R.I.C. was removed to Fever Hospital suffering from enteric fever, was read. Barrack disinfected and foul drain was closed up. Report dated 9th February 1916.

A report was read from Medical Officer of Health stating that "Mary Scollen, The Girls Orphanage Bundoran, was sent to Fever Hospital suffering from Diphtheria; also that eighteen girls from Orphanage were sent to Fever Hospital because the skin was peeling off them, although none of them had been ill. Orphanage was disinfected. Report dated 10th February 1916.

Sanitary Sub Officer reported that the recommendations of the Medical Officer of Health have been complied with by Rebecca Hamilton, Seaview House and Wm M. Villy, Bundoran, and work is in the hands of contractor in the cases of Mary Anne Ward and Anne Jane M. Villy and that the nuisance is removed from premises occupied by John Moran (Landlord Mrs Rafferty, West End, Bundoran). The recommendations of the Medical Officer of Health have not yet been carried out by Christopher George Hamilton and George Moffitt.

Councillor Barty stated that George Moffitt was a very old man and is very ill now. Sanitary Sub Officer was ordered to intimate to these occupiers that legal action is pending.

A report dated 15th February 1916 from Medical Officer of Health was read and stated that a drain from Mr. J. Rogers houses on the strand is causing a nuisance and recommending the construction of a cesspool. Town Surveyor informed Council that he interviewed Mr Rogers who stated that "the level of the main sewer is higher than the level of his yard, and that the work of

Rogers drain on to strand

draining his premises into Main Sewer appears to him impossible, but he will make a cesspool." Council considered that this arrangement is best under the circumstances

The Trustees of the Orphanage Bundoran applied for, and got permission to connect drainage of caretaker's house with the Main Sewer.

Permission was given to Wm. McVitty Bundoran to connect 1/2 inch communicating pipe to Council's main supply pipe.

Drainage of Artizans Dwellings

The consideration of the estimate for the Sewerage of Artizans Dwellings was deferred to adjourned meeting of 21st March 1916.

Clerk stated that the appointment of Mr. Michael Travers as Sanitary Sub. Officer of Bundoran Urban District had not yet been finally sanctioned. The Council were of opinion that the permanent appointment of Mr. Travers depended on the report of the Medical Officer of Health.
