Memorandum of an Agreement made the 5th day of October, One Thousand Nine Hundred and fourteen between Rev. H. Brennan, Adm. Local Manager of the St. Brendan's B.N. School (hereinafter called the Manager), of the one part, and Joseph Murray Teacher of the said School (hereinafter called the Teacher), of the other part:

I. The Manager agrees to employ the Teacher as the Asst Teacher of the St. Brendan's B. School, from the 10th day of Sept^r, 1914 henceforth until the expiration of three calendar months from the date at which notice in writing shall have been given by either side to the other to determine the said employment.

II. The Manager shall have absolute power to determine the said employment at any time without previous notice to the Teacher; but in every such case (not coming under Article III.) he shall be bound to pay to the Teacher three months' grade salary, recoverable as a debt.

III. The Manager shall also have power to determine the said employment, without previous notice, for misconduct or other sufficient reason; in which case the Teacher shall not be entitled to any compensation.

IV. In case the Teacher shall determine the said employment at any time without giving three calendar months' notice, as hereinbefore provided (except for good and sufficient reason), he shall pay to the Manager three months' grade salary, recoverable as a debt.

V. The duties of the Teacher shall be such as are in accordance with the Rules of the Commissioners.

MADAM,

In connection with the general revision of the salaries of the teachers of national schools under the terms of the agreement arrived at in November, 1920, between representatives of the National Teachers, the Commissioners of National Education, and the Treasury, we are directed by the Commissioners of National Education to inform you that your proper placing in the new scale, as from 1st April, 1920, as determined in accordance with the provisions of Section X of the agreement, is £ 230.

Section X of the Agreement provides that the placing salary shall not be reached until 1st April, 1922, but that, in the meantime, a standard increment shall be added to the salaries of all teachers as from 1st April, 1920, and that the remainder of the amount required to raise the teacher's salary to his proper figure in the scale shall be added, half as from 1st April, 1921, and the other half as from 1st April, 1922. It is further provided that a teacher who, under the operation of the rules hitherto in force, would have received an increment in his present grade or ordinary promotion to a higher grade on any date during the year ended 31st March, 1921, shall be eligible to receive an increment of the new scale on the same date, but that teachers not so eligible for increments or promotion shall not be eligible for any increment in the new scale before 1st April, 1921. Increments from these dates will be granted only to teachers placed below the maxima of the new scales, and in whose cases the conditions specified in Sections I. and II. and III. of the Agreement are fulfilled.

In accordance with these provisions the revised rates of salary in your case are as follows:—

(a) Rate of salary (including standard increment) from
1st April, 1920 £ 208

(b) You have been awarded an increase of salary amount-
ing to £ 12 from
1. 8. 20 in respect of
increment which raises your rate of
salary from that date to.... £ 220

(c) Rate of salary from 1st April, 1921 (made up of rate
at (a) plus increases specified at (b), plus half
the difference between placing salary and (a)) £ 231

(d) On 1st April, 1922, provided the average attendance
at the school in which you are then serving is
sufficient, you will be eligible for payment at your
placing rate, augmented by any scale increments,
special increments, and bonuses for special quali-
fications, which may have been awarded to you
from 1st April, 1920, up to 1st April, 1922.

The payments which have already been made to you for the year ended 31st
March, 1921, will be examined in due course, and any difference between the amount
actually paid and the sum which should have been paid will be adjusted with as
little delay as possible. 45
