"Ballintra village is in the Rural Districts of Ballyshannon and Donegal and therefore we are willing to join with Donegal Rural District Council to provide a water supply for the village"

The Foot & mouth Disease (movement of animals) Order of the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland, dated 16<sup>th</sup> December 1912, was laid before the Council.

It was directed that Mr Steadman prepare Regulations under Sect. 23 of Public Health Act, prescribing construction of House drains to join main sewer also that he have the septic tank put in order as soon as possible for Bundoran

It was directed that notice be served on all occupiers to connect with sewer in accordance with regulations to be prepared for Bundoran Sewerage

It was decided that Bye-laws in the matter of Bundoran Sewerage be adopted on this day two weeks.

The consideration of applications for the position of waterworks and sewerage caretaker was adjourned till septic tank be put in order.

Townsend v Ballyshannon R.D. Council

Dear Sir,

The Civil Bill heard in above heard at Ballyshannon County Court yesterday was for a sum of £22-2-0. £2-2-0 thereof was for a specification for the lighting of Bundoran and the balance of £20 for work under the Labourers Act.

The Judge gave a Decree for £16-2-0 being £2-2-0 for the specification and £14-0-0 for work under the Labourers Act.

It is matter for the Council whether there should be an appeal in the case.

Several members of the Council were

present during the hearing, and will be able to inform the Council as to the entire matter

From Mr P J Kelly Engineer date 3<sup>rd</sup> January 1913 stating that the Rent Collector has reported to him that damages has been done to Cottages in the recent storm, and he desires to know if she should make an inspection and have the necessary repairs carried out.

No order

From Mr J Steadman Engineer stating that Mr Callan, Contractor for Bundoran Sewerage has suspended work till fine weather sets in. Regulations will be prepared when quarterly meetings are over. He points out that he considers that a mistake is being made in allowing parties to connect with main sewer, without going through any of the necessary formalities. This course will cause injurious effects in a short time

The Inquiry is all the more necessary and important in view of the fact that no case of the disease has occurred in the South Division of the County Donegal for over 50 years and we call on the Member of Parliament for our Division to press for an Inquiry in the matter.

From Local Government Board date 9<sup>th</sup> January 1913 stating they have appointed their Engineering Inspector Mr. Price to hold a local Inquiry with respect to the Application of the Council for sanction to the supplemental loan of £400-0-0 for the purpose of completing Bundoran Sewerage Scheme. Inquiry to take place on 21<sup>st</sup> inst. at 12 o.c. noon.

The Bill of Costs of Mr R H Reid submitted at last meeting was laid before the Council and requisition for taxation was duly signed and sealed.

Read letter from Messrs:- Robert Hipwell & Co. date 18-1-13 stating they have arranged with Messrs:- Lemon & Enniskillen to connect the drains of Mrs. Shaper's 4 houses in Bundoran with main sewer. They request to be allowed to proceed with work on 20<sup>th</sup> inst.

"To be replied to stating that Mr Crawford has been appointed to superintend connections"

It was unanimously decided that Mr Arthur Crawford (who has been Clerk of Works) be appointed to inspect the sewerage junctions - and that all sewerage connections be carried out

under his supervision - at ~~10~~ 2-10-0 p.w.c.

Read letter from Lt. Nt. Ryboy regarding insufficient light near their premises in Bundoran.

"To be notified that Contract for Street lighting is not yet expired but that the matter will be considered at next Contract"

Read letter from Mr H Allingham, Manager Provincial Bank, Ballyshannon, date 10<sup>th</sup> January 1913, stating that the water passing through the large pipe sewer running by his premises runs into the foundation of his dwellinghouse. He requests that the present pipe drain should be replaced by a watertight 9" sewer pipe with the view of preventing further injury to his premises

A 9" sewer pipe to be laid at Mr. Allingham's house

Dr. Corcadden of Ballintra Dispensary District forwarded notification of outbreak of Enteric Fever in the house of Elizabeth Harren of Ballintra on 11<sup>th</sup> January 1913. The steps taken to prevent the spread of the disease were isolation and disinfection

Stubbs Ballyshannon requesting that his client [Mrs Ellis] (from whom Labrs. plots have been acquired and the compensation - £335, lodged in Court) may be paid the Compensation and Interest thereon same as other like cases. Mr Maguire points out that there will be nothing wrong in the Dividend being paid to the persons entitled as there will remain in Court the Principal of £335.

From Mr. R.P. Delaney Local Government Inspector asking for particulars in connection with Improvement Scheme.

It was decided that Inspector be requested to hold Inquiry by 18<sup>th</sup> inst or as soon thereafter as possible.

It was unanimously resolved on the motion of Mr J. Gorman, seconded by Mr J. Gorman Jr. "That Mr P. McPhelim Rent Collector be instructed to serve notices to Quit on tenants of Labourers Cottages whom the Rate Collectors return as being in arrears of Rates.

"Passed unanimously"

From Local Government Board date 29<sup>th</sup> January 1913 stating that they have not issued any model Bye-laws regulating the connection of House Drains with Main Drains in Rural Districts - They enclose a copy of their model Series of Byelaws as to new Streets and Buildings (Urban District) and draw attention to the Byelaws respecting the drainage of Buildings &c. which might be found on pages 39 to 51 & might, if the Council so desire be adapted to the requirements of the <sup>Rural</sup> District.

Mr. James Steadman Engineer for Bundoran Sewerage Scheme forwarded Regulations respecting the connections of Drains &c. in connection with Bundoran Sewerage

It was proposed by Mr J. Gorman, seconded by Mr J. Havigan and passed unanimously - That we adopt the Regulations submitted by Mr Steadman to-day in connection with Bundoran Sewerage.

It was decided that the Council adopt Byelaws contained in pages 39 to 51 of L.G. Board's Series of Byelaws in connection with Draft Regulations of Mr Steadman.

From Local Government Board date 21<sup>st</sup> January 1913 enclosing copy of a report which they have received from Dr. Lorcaddan notifying the occurrence of a case of Enteric Fever at Ballintra

They also enclose an extract from Minutes of Proceedings of the Donegal Rural District Council on 11<sup>th</sup> (inst) in regard to the responsibility of that Council for the condition of the water supply, and sewerage of the locality in question - and request the Council to take action to remedy the sanitary defects in Ballintra which have been pointed out by the Medical Officer of Health

The extracts referred to of Donegal Rural District Council point out that that Council has made the following minute on correspondence giving the substance of minutes of this Council on 21<sup>st</sup> Decr 1912.

"Minutes of Donegal R.D. Council - We have already provided a suitable water supply for our portion of the district at considerable expense and are not aware of any complaints in our portion of the village"

Minutes - "We are willing to join with Donegal R.D. Council in providing a water supply but don't think that this Council should be at the cost of providing both districts"

From Local Government Board date 14<sup>th</sup> July 1913, stating that they have had before them the report of their Inspector, Mr. Price, on the Inquiry, recently held by him into the application for supplemental Loan of £400 for completing Bundoran Sewerage, and in reference thereto, the Board point out that it would be well to appoint a competent man as caretaker to attend to the working of the sewerage system, and the Council should urge the owners of houses to put their drains into order and to connect them with the sewer at once - the work to be carried out in accordance with Regulations of the Council and under the supervision of the Clerk of Works.

Mr. J. Steadman Engineer wrote date 14<sup>th</sup> inst. stating he had interviewed the applicants for position of Bundoran Sewerage Caretaker, and recommends Mr. Michael Travers as being most suitable for the post, but appointment should be made subject to dismissal at short notice should he not attend properly to his duties.

Mr. Michael Travers was unanimously appointed caretaker at £15 per year as recommended by Mr. Steadman on the motion of Mr. J. Gorman Sr., seconded by Mr. J. Gorman Jr. - he being subject to dismissal on one week's notice.

The Council's Solicitor was directed to prepare agreement embodying his duties.

From Local Government Board date 14<sup>th</sup> July '13 sanctioning supplemental Loan of £400 for completing Bundoran Sewerage repayment to be spread over unexpired period of original Loan of £2000

The Board point out that the final decision as to whether a loan will or will not be made from public funds rests with the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury who have in some cases felt compelled to refuse their sanction to loans where the rates were exceptionally high or where payments of instalments of loans already made has not been punctual. Application should be made to the Commissioners of Public Works for the loan if the Council desire that it should be made under Section 246.

It was unanimously resolved that the Commissioners of Public Works be requested to grant us above loan of £400.

From National Health Insurance Commission date 5<sup>th</sup> February 1913 enclosing copy of Circular that has been sent to Local Authorities that have formally applied for certificates of exception under Schedule 1 part 11 (b) of the Act.

From Mr. R. H. Reid date 11<sup>th</sup> July 1913 enclosing form of Preliminary Notice of Application for compensation for Criminal Injury to property viz: Two walls fencing fields also two gates, being thrown down and two trees cut on the lands of Mr. Pison Anderson at "The Camp". The damage being estimated at £11-5-0.

"To be defended"

Regulations in connections with Bundoran

sewerage were submitted and duly signed and sealed on the motion of Mr J. Gorman Sr. seconded by Mr J. Gorman Jr.

It was ordered that notice be served on each household in Bundoran, by Rate collector requiring them to connect with sewers according to Regulations

Labors Acts

Read letter from Mr R. H. Reid Solicitor enclosing copy of an order made by the Judge in reference to the Award made by Mr J. W. O'Malley on 9<sup>th</sup> March 1909. under the Labourers Acts to Edward M. Dermott. The Order directs the Council to pay Mr R. H. Reid £3-13-6 as Solicitor for Mr E. M. Dermott on whose behalf the compensation awarded was lodged in Court.

"To pay"

The Resolution of the South Dublin Rural District Council, at their meeting on 5<sup>th</sup> February 1913, urging the Government to provide an additional sum of at least £1,000,000 was unanimously adopted

From Mr A. P. Delany Local Govt. Inspector stating he will hold Inquiry for Ballyshannon Rural District (under Labors. Acts) at Workhouse on 25<sup>th</sup> July 1913. and Inquiry at Belleek Courthouse on 4<sup>th</sup> March 1913 for Belleek Rural District

It was decided that the appeal in the case of <sup>Townsend</sup> Ballyshannon Rural District Council be withdrawn

With reference to the Local Govt Board's letter of 8<sup>th</sup> January 1912 Mr M. Maguire Council's Solicitor attended in reference to fees under the Labourers Acts, and it was agreed on the suggestion contained in that letter that the Solicitor's fees be £3-10-0 per plot or per Cottage acquired or erected

From Local Government Board, date 23<sup>rd</sup> May, 1913, forwarding extracts from Returns Formsh of Medical Officers of Ballintra and Ballyshannon Dispensary Districts for half year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March last and requesting that the matters referred to therein may receive the Council's careful consideration at an early date.

'Extracts' as follow.

Ballintra Dispensary District: - The village of Ballintra is practically without a water supply. The main sewers of the village are blocked and require to be opened and cleaned.

Ballyshannon Dispensary District: - There are no registered common lodging houses in the District but there are houses used as such.

The houses of the labourers in Ballyshannon and Bundoran are very bad.

'Left over'

The caretaker of Bundoran Sewerage and Waterworks wrote, date, 16<sup>th</sup> May, 1913, pointing out that the septic tank is not working and the outlet got choked.

The matter was referred to Engineer on 17<sup>th</sup> May and he has since visited the place.

The caretaker also wrote that there was a leak on the main water pipe.

"This has since been repaired by plumber."

Dr Gordon, M.O.H. forwarded report on occurrence of case of Enteric Fever - Patient Mrs John Cleary. The patient was removed to Fever Hospital and dwelling was being disinfected.

Read letter from Local Government Board, date, 19<sup>th</sup> May, 1913, sanctioning payment of £27 to Clerk of Council for work under Labourers Act Scheme.

Payment was deferred pending receipt of Inspector's Order also Engineer at £64-10-0

From Mr Wm Carson, Dumnuckrum, tenant of a labourers cottage and plot, stating that a neighbouring tenant (James Doherty) allowed a gap to be made in his fence, and allowed cattle on the plot. Mr Carson

fears these cattle will break through the wire fence into his (McCarsons) crop. He asks the Council to give the matter their attention.

"The Rent Collector, who since visited the place, reported that the gap in fence had been repaired and the cattle removed.

The reports of Medical Officer of Health to Gordon on insanitary premises, showing requirements repairs removal of rubbish etc, were submitted.

"It was ordered that notices be served requiring recommendations of Medical Officer of Health to be carried out."

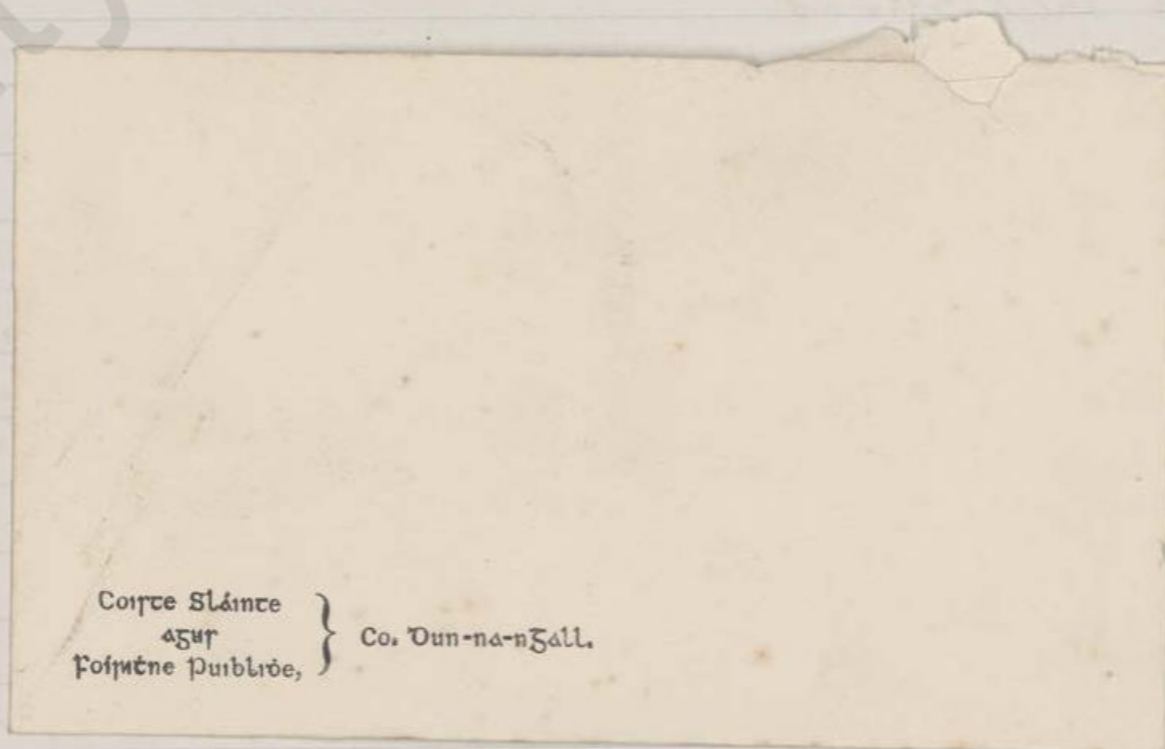

Dr Gordon submitted reports showing three cases in Bundoran where waterclosets required to be put up and the owners of premises required to connect with main sewer

notices to be served requiring recommendations of Medical Officer to be carried out.

As directed at special meeting on 23<sup>rd</sup> ult Mr James Gallagher reported as follows:- dated 4<sup>th</sup> ult.

In obedience to the orders I received from the Ballyshannon District Council I made a complete inspection of all the fountains and taps in the town and as far as possible all connections on the 27<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup>, 29<sup>th</sup>, + 30<sup>th</sup> August, and on the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, + 3<sup>rd</sup> September 1913 and the following are the defects which I discovered:-

- (1) Joseph Gildea, New Row, Tap leaking
- (2) Francis Doberty, " Badly leaking tap
- (3) Mrs Brown " Leaking tap
- (4) Ballyshannon Brothers School, Leaking tap, which was at once remedied
- (5) Police Barracks, two defective taps
- (6) Head Constable Lydon, one defective tap
- (7) Daniel McMulty, Castle St. one defective tap which was at once remedied.
- (8) Mrs Lipssett, Castle St. Defective tap
- (9) Andrew N. Anderson Defective tap. This has often been reported and continues to be a source of great waste, some drastic measures should be taken as no notice is attended to
- (10) John Swan, The Mall, Very defective tap, great waste
- (11) Michael McKeown, Main St " "

- (12) James Cleary Bishop St Leaking tap
- (13) David Vaughan Main St Very defective tap
- (14) Miss Humphrys Main St Tap requires repair, a little waste
- (15) Edward Roger, Publican, East Port, very defective tap, continually running, great waste.
- (16) Alexander McMullen, East Port, one running tap, waste
- (17) Constable McKenna East Port, one leaking tap.
- (18) Thomas Gibroy, East Port, one leaking tap, waste.
- (19) D Kelly Burns, Rockville three leaking taps
- (20) Dr Gordon, Rock, one leaking tap
- (21) A fountain, near Miss Thompson's, West Port requires repair
- (21<sup>9</sup>) James Meehan, Bridge end, one bad tap
- (22) One fountain in Back St requires repair
- (23) The drinking fountain near the bridge requires repairs
- (24) A new stop tap is required at the Manual near the bridge

In addition to the above defects I am bound to point out that an extensive waste of water goes on at the Vindicator Newspaper Works which the promoters of the town water scheme never contemplated. A pipe of large dimensions has been connected with the main for the purposes of running machinery. By means of this pipe and having regard to its situation at the lowest point in the town the entire supply in the reservoir can be drained off in a short time, and it is a matter of common knowledge that the supply collected on the Saturday and early days of the week is nearly exhausted before the following Saturday morning. During the Thursday, Friday, and Saturday in each week the pressure is reduced to a minimum at all the higher elevations of the town

While this state of affairs continues the supply of water in the town is almost entirely in the control of one individual.

The owners of motor cars should be cautioned against a continuance of their present extravagance in the use of water.

I also visited the source of supply at the lake and I recommend that a plumber be employed to open the sluice house, and inspect the valves etc and where necessary to have the works cleaned. The sluice house, and the auxiliary supply tank etc. have not been examined or tested for some years past. The reservoir has not been washed out recently.

I cautioned the owners of defective taps, and warned them as to the necessity for repairs.

Minute "It was directed that all persons having defective taps etc be notified to have same remedied otherwise water to be cut off in cases where waste is allowed to continue. The valves at sluice house to be examined and works cleaned as suggested above."

Payment of £1 was ordered to Mr. Gallagher for inspection etc in connection with above report."

From Mr. Francis Gilverry, tenant of a ~~Labourer's~~ Cottage at Buncrana, date 29<sup>th</sup> August, 1913, pointing out that the Labourer's plots at Buncrana have cut off his pass to the well at Brandra from which he got his water supply. He requests the Council to allow him a proper pass to this well otherwise to have a lead pipe put in to convey the water through these plots.

- (4) Not one of the dwellings at present on the sites has any proper closet or privy or other sanitary conveniences
- (5) The property, referred to in petition, purchased

at £1,500, does not form any portion of the plots sought to be acquired.

- (6) The local government Board Inspector has approved of these sites.

As suggested at last meeting the Council propose to exchange sites nos 33, 34 and it was accordingly resolved, on the motion of Mr. J. Gorman seconded by Mr. O. McGowan

"That we request the Local Government Board to make an order authorizing exchange of sites nos 33, 34 of The Ballyshannon Rural District Labourers Order (No 1) 1913 for the following reasons - The proposed new sites are more suitable and enables the Council to close insanitary dwellings as recommended by the Medical Officer of Health.
