That the Donegal District Council having had the proposal of this Council as to the Ballintra Water Supply before them a second time, and while willing to assist in providing the people of Ballintra with even a better supply than the Donegal portion of the village has at present, the Donegal Council is quite determined only to do so on the distinct understanding that the charge is limited to the locality immediately benefitted. A deputation of the Council was appointed to lay the Council's views before the inhabitants, but the inhabitants it appears do not want water on these terms, and as the Council is satisfied that their end of the village is pretty well supplied with water, they do not propose to take any further action at present.

The Donegal District Council having declined to proceed further with the proposed joint scheme for the Water Supply of Ballintra it was ordered that Mr. P. J. Mully C. E. be instructed to proceed at once to prepare plans &c. for the Water Supply of the portion of Ballintra village in Ballyshannon Rural District.

Mr. Steadman C. E. reported, date 18th Inst, on the necessity for rendering water tight the service reservoir of Ballyshannon Water Supply Works as there is at present a great loss of water owing to leaks in same. To effect this object he recommends lining the inner slopes with concrete, the probable cost of the work would be about £85.

Mr. Steadman further reports. That as the Council are under an obligation to pass down the stream leading

from Ardpatton Lake 5 cubic feet of water per minute to meet Mr. Atkinson's requirements, in an exceptionally dry summer like the present the condition of things at the Lake does not enable the Council to fulfil that undertaking, unless some provision is made to have a larger volume of water under control at the commencement of a dry season. To accomplish this it would be advisable to raise the level of the lake by means of a small concrete dam at the present outlet with a weir at top of same, the level of the crest being such that no overflow will take place until all the land owned by the Council is submerged. Then by placing a valve in the dam the water supply passing down the stream could be regulated. The cost of the work would be about £178.

The Council agreed to proceed at once with the lining of the service reservoir at the Ballyshannon Water Works with concrete, the other work recommended is postponed for the present.

The Clerk to advertise for tenders for carrying out the work. Tenders to be considered on 2nd Sept. prox. Mr. Steadman to be instructed to prepare a Specification for the work.

An application for an instalment of the loan for Bundoran Sewerage, amount £1000 was signed by the Chairman and Clerk, and ordered to be forwarded to the Board of Works.

From Local Government Board date 11th August 1905, stating that they have recommended the Board of Works to issue to the Council (on their making application therefor) a further instalment of £500 out of the

Loan of £3320 granted them under Labourers Acts.

The Board also forward an extract from the report of their Engineering Inspector Mr. O'Brien Smyth on his recent inspection of Cottages erected and in course of erection under this loan -
