In nearly all cases they have had the manure heaps removed and are making arrangements to store the manure at a proper distance from the Cowsheds - They have all had their Cowsheds lime washed and in most cases they have made arrangements for the proper drainage of same -

From Andrew Fanning, tenant of a cottage in Ballinacarrick, date 18th February 1911, complaining that the Cottage is very smoky and repairs are wanted to the back door, as it has rotted away at the bottom.

Patrick Daly to be employed to repair the Cottage, Messrs. Mulhern and Breslin to superintend the work.

A Memorial was received from the occupants of Cottages in Sminver requesting the Council to fill up and coat with broken stones the Lane leading to the Cottages in Townland of Sminver.

Messrs. Maguire, Mulhern and Daly were appointed as a Committee to examine the Lane.

With reference to the complaint made by Michael Travers tenant of a Labourers Cottage in Magheracar, that the fence on the plot attached to the Cottage had been moved, Messrs. Gorman, the Committee appointed to report on the matter informed the Council that the fence had been changed from the position in which it was originally placed.

Bryan Doherty the adjoining tenant to be written to informing him that unless the fence is changed back to its former position, notice to quit will be served on him.

From John Cleary, Bundoran, date 3rd Feby. 1911. caretaker of Bundoran Waterworks and Sewerage, stating that he had performed the duty attached to the office during ^{past} quarter.

On visiting the reservoir he found the gravel on the filtering beds put up in ridges having the water only flowing in the furrows, in his opinion this was done by some person, as it was evident it could not have been done by the floods. The surplus gravel had been removed leaving the bed quite level and the water flowing over all parts causing a much stronger output.

The report was approved of.

Mr. Cleary was appointed on 5th Novr. last. The Board have not yet approved of his appointment. Salary £15 a year. The Board's approval of Mr. Cleary's appointment is respectfully requested.

From Bryan Doherty tenant of a cottage in Magheracar, stating in reply to a letter from the Clerk that he wants no land but what he is entitled to, and that is all he has, so if the Council send out a man to measure his plot he will assist him all he can, he is sure he is 20 perches short of his acre.

The tenant of the adjoining cottage having alleged that the fence on his plot was changed the Council ordered that Mr. Townsend G.E. be instructed to measure the plots.

From Local Government Board date 28th Feby. 1911 referring to an entry on the subject on Council's Minutes of 18th Inst. the Board inform the Council that their sanction to the proposed appointment of a caretaker to Bundoran Waterworks is not requisite.

From Local Government Board date 2nd Mar. 1911, referring to Council's Minutes on 18th Ult. the Board state that they have approved of the remuneration viz. £10. a year proposed to be allowed to the Clerk by the District Council for his services as Registrar under the Dairies, Cowsheds, and Milkshops (Ireland) Order 1908, in the Rural District.

A copy of the Order is enclosed for the information of the Registrar, and his particular attention is drawn to Art. 1 thereof (Registration).

From the Census Commissioners date 3rd Dec. 1911 acknowledging receipt of Council's resolution of 18th Inst. Ult. relative to the town of Bundoran and stating that the same area will be adopted for Census purposes as that recognised as the Sanitary area.

From Local Government Board date 3rd March 1911 stating that the Board have had before them for consideration the Report of their Engineering Inspector Mr. A. D. Price on the Local Inquiry held by him on 31st January last into the petition of the Ballyshannon Rural District Council praying for a Provisional Order to enable them to put in force the powers of the Land Clauses Acts for the purpose of taking otherwise than by agreement, certain lands required in connection with a scheme for the Sewerage of the town of Bundoran in the Rural District. And with reference thereto the Board further state that they have decided to comply with the prayer of the Petition and to make the Provisional Order sought for, a copy of which will in due course be sent to the Council and to the Irish Office, London, for introduction into Parliament. If however it is decided that there should be inserted in the Bill confirming the Provisional

Order a clause extending the borrowing powers of the Council in respect of the Area of Charge fixed for this scheme so as to enable them to borrow the full amount which may be found necessary for its completion the Board desire to state as pointed out in previous correspondence that it will be necessary for the Council to employ a Parliamentary Agent to act on their behalf and to take such other steps as may be necessary to secure the insertion in Parliament of such a clause in the Confirming Bill.

The Board observe that the Scheme as outlined at the inquiry does not provide for the Sewerage of several important villas at the Western end of the town, and the Council would do well to have the plans and estimate amended so as to have the drainage from these residences dealt with in the Scheme.

As a result of his inspection of the outfall works already provided, the Inspector reports that owing to neglect and want of proper flushing the inlet to the tank had become choked, so that none of the sewerage was entering the tank, or reaching the outfall sewers, and that all the contents of the sewers were overflowing into a small river and giving rise to a serious nuisance.

The Council should at once take steps to have this condition of affairs remedied and care should in future be taken to maintain in proper order the Works so far as they

have been completed with a view to obviate any inflow of sewerage into the river.

In conclusion the Board state that the Council should also strictly enforce the provisions of the Public Health Acts, so as to secure the abatement of nuisances, and they should make bye-laws to regulate the Sanitary condition of houses & yards.

A memorial was sent in from inhabitants in the East End of Bundoran complaining of the unsanitary condition of a right-of-way leading from the main road to the sea and requesting the Council to send the Sanitary Officer to inspect it, and take steps to abate the nuisance.

The last inquiry was held on 31st of January of this year, for the purpose of promoting a provisional Order, ascertained the urgency for completing the Works and procuring a Loan for the purpose.

We now beg the Local Government Board to grant the Loan without further inquiry and on the maps/plans and applications already lodged.

As the Bundoran Season is now over, the sooner the works are commenced the better so as to have same completed and in order for the opening of next season.

The Local Government Board will remember the small outbreak of Typhoid Fever in Bundoran in the season of 1910 which created great unrest at the time and the Council will now feel grateful if the Local Govt. Board will treat this as an urgent matter.

From Mr. L. R. Lipscomb, Solicitor date 7th Sept 1911 stating that he had been instructed by Mr. Pat^r O'Connor cautioning the Council not to interfere with the Water Supply in Currickboy in the Lane adjoining his land by directing the Water Supply and depriving his cattle of water and trespassing on his

property.

An application was made by residents in the locality to have a well near Mr. O'Connor's premises repaired and the Council carried out the repairs required. It is stated that Mr. O'Connor distributed the repairs.

The Council agreed to take action in the matter.

Dr. Gordon Medical Officer of Health, Ballyshannon reported a case of Scarlatina at Templenew, a child named Dickson. Some cases occurred in an adjoining District during the Summer, and this child has probably come in contact with them. The child is isolated at home.

felt compelled to refuse their sanction to loans where rates were exceptionally high, or where there has been unpunctuality in payment of the instalments of loans already made.

In the latter case their Lordships before making any further loan, require an undertaking to pay the instalments on existing or future loan punctually on gale days on which they come due. In conclusion the Board state that application should be made to the Commissioners of Public Works for the loan if the Council desire that it should be recommended under Section 246 -
