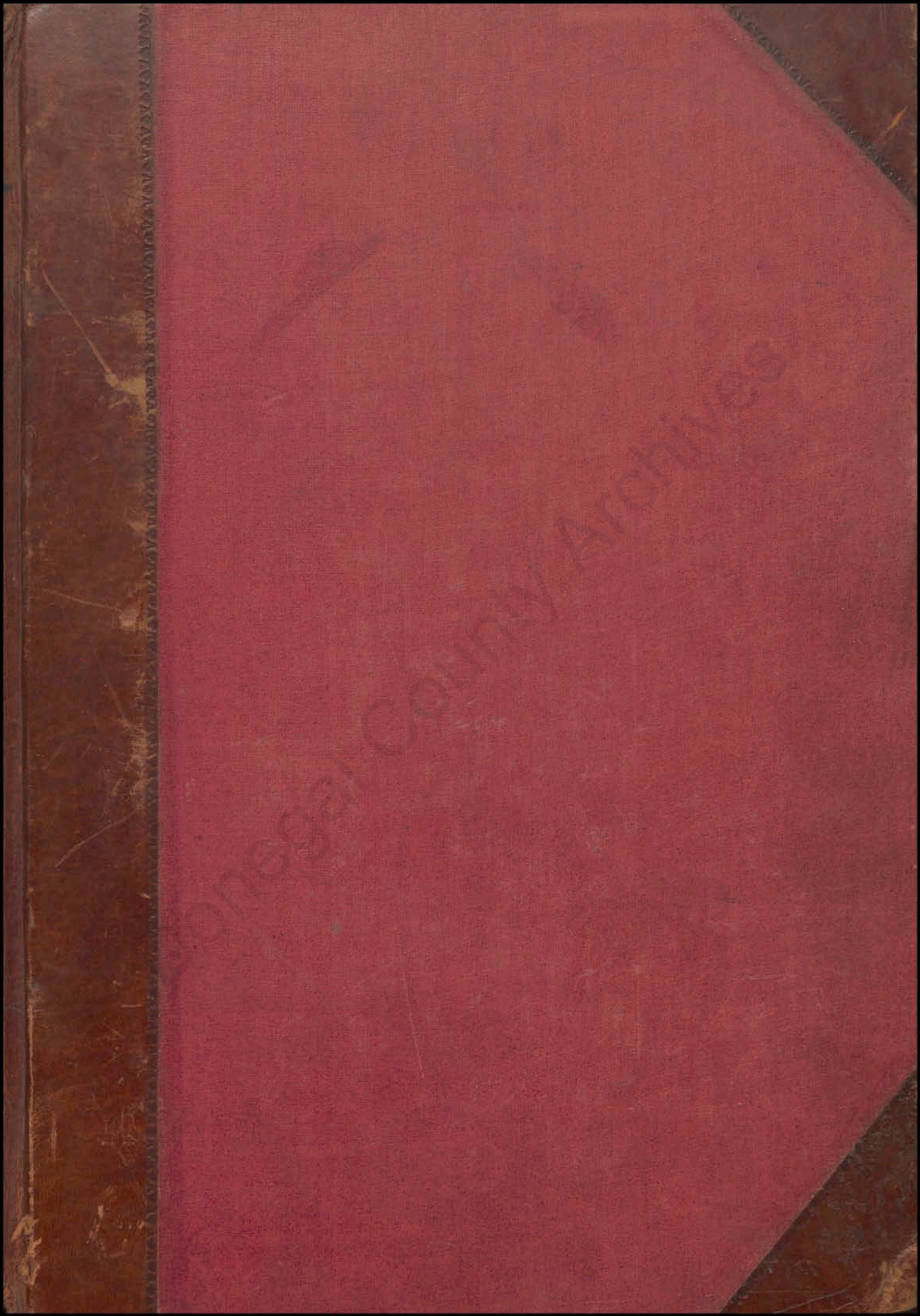

No. and Date 106/29/1923 From The L.G.B. dated 10<sup>th</sup> May 1923 relative to the yearly report on the Cottages and pointing out that the Council should instruct the Tenants of Cottages to till their plots and request for particulars as to the condition of McGloskey's Cottage at Dallylongran

The Clerk reported that he visited ~~all~~ all the cottages in the district during the month of May to see if they had complied with his instructions in the tillage of their plots and he finds that most of them have complied with the directions. 5 tenants out of 79 have now failed to till their plots. It is now too late to take any action on these 5 tenants. Some of their plots are not good

McGloskey's Cottage, I was prevented from inspecting it the last time I found that it is in need of painting for all the external wood and iron work. The slates and tiles require mastic cement. This house is in a very exposed place. The plot attached to this Cottage is in a very exposed place and is made for tillage. The tenant is at present in the farm. He keeps a few goats on the plot to provide milk for the family



The Council had before them a tender for the necessary repairs to the Cottages in the Killybegs District from Bill Doores Contractor Spout St-Killybegs for the sum of £30

The Council decided to accept the tender of Doores at the sum of £30-00 as the repairs are urgently required to be attended to.

The Council had before them 4 tenders for the repairs to the Cottages at Dungloe No. 164. 65. 66. 67 and 68 as pointed out by the C. Clerk. For a sum of £23-00 from James McCallaghan

The Clerk stated he thought this tender too high for the work to be done.

The Council decided to adjourn the consideration of this tender

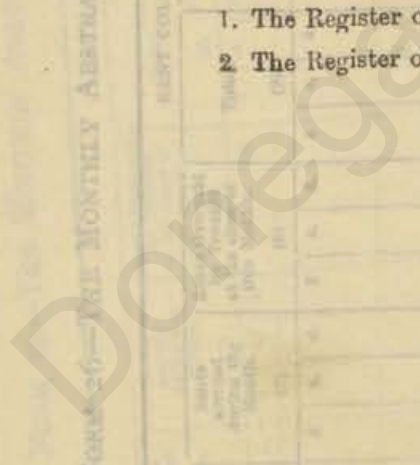

After a full discussion on the circumstances and the state of the Clerk's health for the past year it was unanimously resolved on the motion of Patrick Doherty seconded by Con. B. Mulholland:

"That this Council unanimously grant the Clerk his full Pension. As the Council at their meeting on the 12<sup>th</sup> April accepted the Resignation of the Clerk owing to ill health and the Local Govt Inspector accepted the Clerk's resignation on March 8<sup>th</sup> 1924 we respectfully request the Ministry for Local Govt to sanction same and to approve of the Pension due to the Clerk after almost 25 years faithful service. This Pension with 50% added he is now entitled to  $\frac{3}{5}$  of his Annual Salary and emoluments. We hereby grant same and ask the Ministry for Local Govt to approve of it from July 1<sup>st</sup> 1924

Michael McNeil Clerk of Council appointed on the 20<sup>th</sup> January 1900 Salary paid by Council and approved of by the L.G.O. English and the Ministry £330. The Auditor however holds he is entitled to only £310-15-0. For 24 years & 5 months service to this add 50% in accordance with Civilian total 36 years.  $\frac{26}{60} = \frac{3}{5}$  of £310-15-0 = £186-9-0 per year.

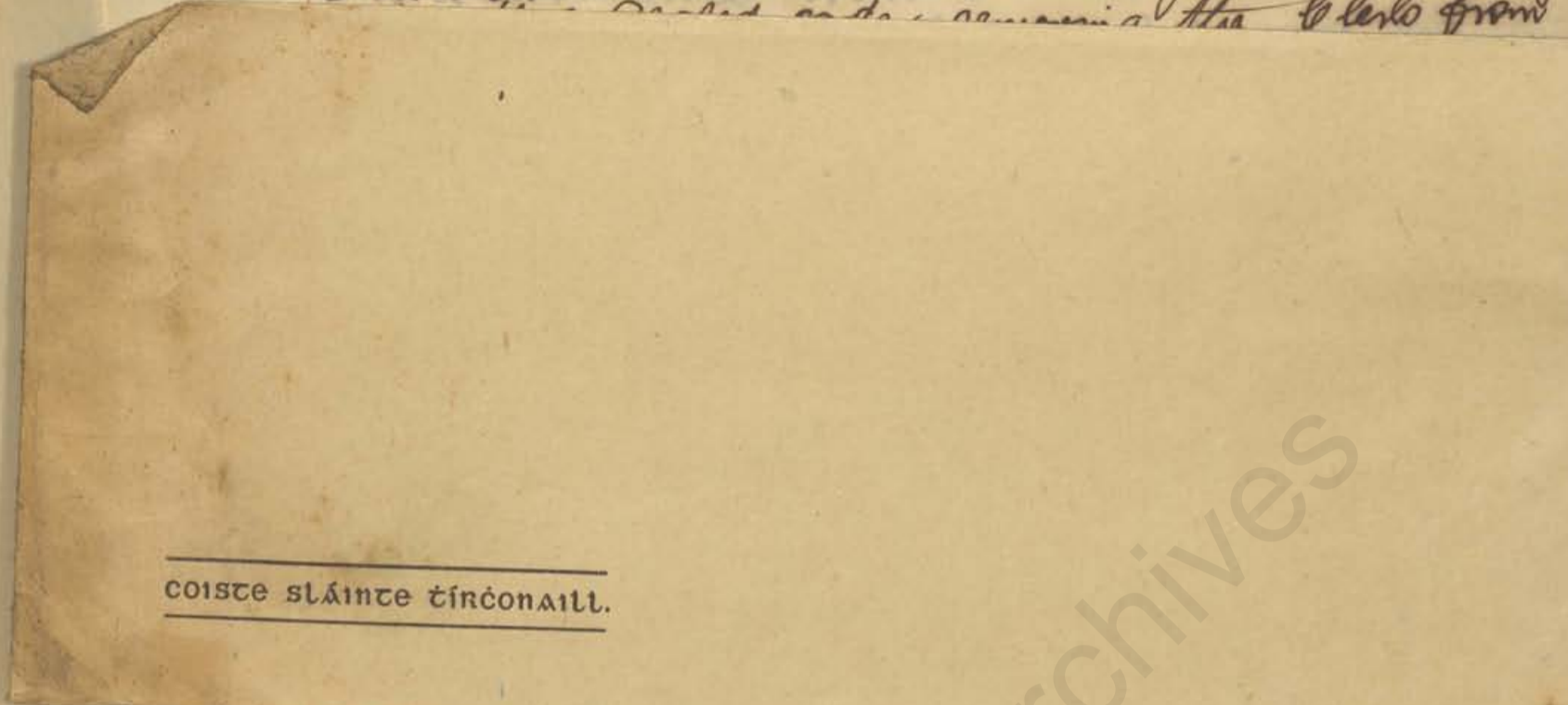

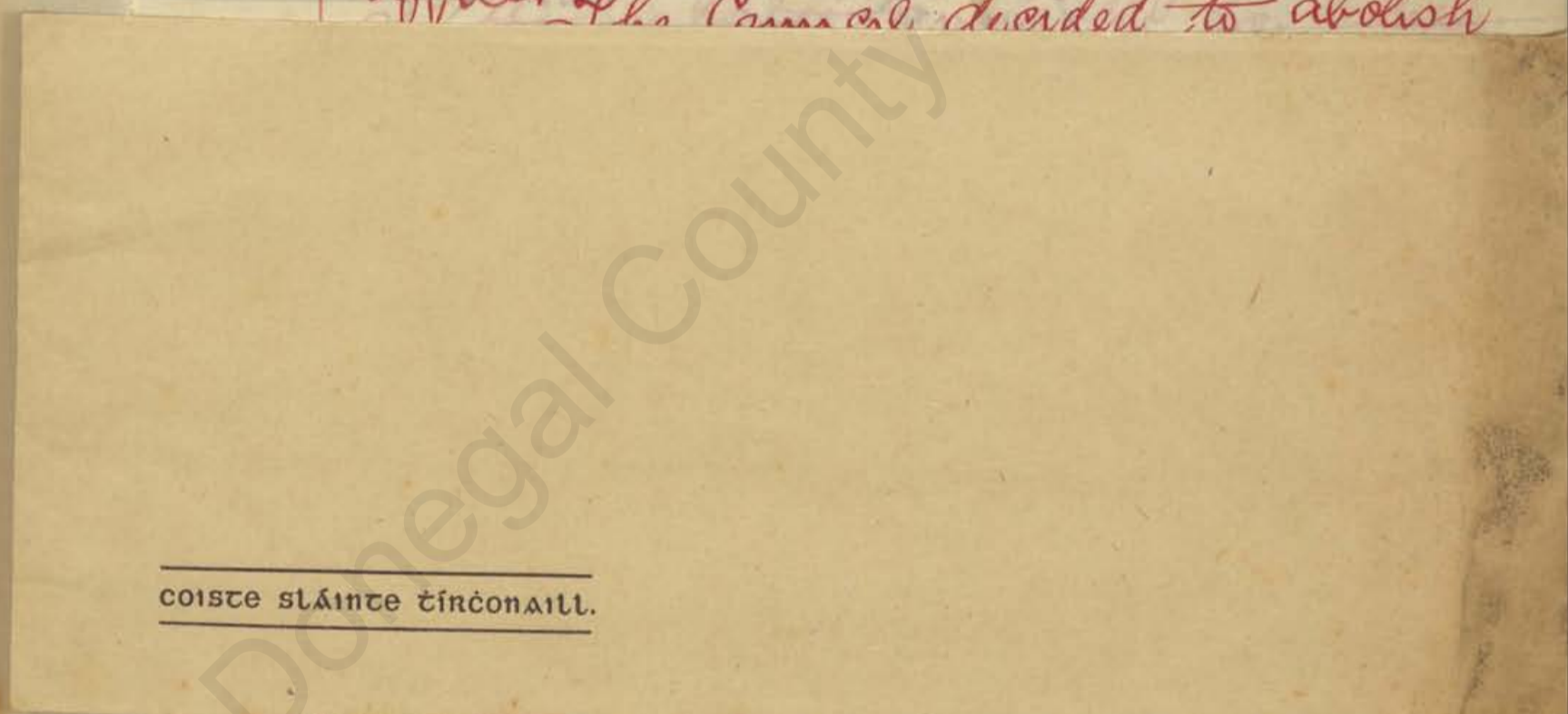

After discussion it was unanimously decided to defer acceptance of same, until an Inspector of Cottages had been appointed. The Clerk stated that he understood from Mr. Meegan, Housing Inspector, who had called on him, that the L.G.B. would not sanction more than £ per annum per cottage for an Inspector.

It was unanimously decided to advertise for an Inspector of Cottages at a salary of £20 per annum. Appointment to be made at next meeting 13<sup>th</sup> October.

It was unanimously decided to hold the ordinary meetings of the Council in future on the 12<sup>th</sup> of each month or if the 12<sup>th</sup> fall on Sunday the 13<sup>th</sup>, this being the date of Glenties Fair, and more members would probably attend, provided the L.G.B. have no objection.

On the proposition of Mr. McGill (Chairman) seconded by Tom Ballaghan and unanimously agreed to, it was decided to request the L.G.B. to fix the Quorum of Glenties R.D.C. at 4 members (instead of 7) owing to difficulty of getting the present Quorum, as practically one third the Council are disqualified for non-attendance.

The above sums for Salary have been calculated in accordance with the findings of Mr. O'Keefe when he audited the accounts in March 1924.

The Council have a difficulty in ascertaining the correct amount of late Clerk's Salary in order to find how much is due to him for the following reasons

Mr. Barry who audited the accounts in July 1923, seemed to think that the Salary was £329-5-0 yearly. Mr. O'Keefe who audited the accounts in March 1924 seemed to arrive at £310-5-0 as the correct sum, while Mr. Foley at the last Audit in October 1924 places the Salary at £269-15-0 per annum but he left the matter open for revision, as Sanctions were not before him which might increase the Salary. We don't know if we are interpreting the Auditor's work correctly, and we have adopted Mr. O'Keefe's figures so far as we understand them.

The Clerk <sup>stated</sup> that at the last Audit by Mr. Foley, no Sanctions for Rate of Mr. M. Nelis's <sup>Salary</sup> were available, as he stated that he had removed them and sent them to his Solicitor. Mr. Foley instructed Mr. M. Nelis to return Sanctions to Clerk, and instructed the Clerk when Sanctions were produced, to pay Mr. M. Nelis any Salary due to date of Removal from office at rate as sanctioned. Mr. M.
