Read letters dated 26<sup>th</sup> Nov. and 4<sup>th</sup> December 1919 relative to the Criminal Injury claims of Sarah Jane O'Neil, others and Thomas Lorrigan. Stating the evidence of some of the witnesses in the latter case would not be much use and suggesting that a witness to prove that the wound on the honey was an old one would be desirable.
