Malicious Injuries.

Read Letter from Bernard McFadden Esq., Secretary of Donegal Co. Council, dated 31st Aug. 1905, No. 414, stating in reference to the claim of the Representative Church Body for £60 compensation for Tombstones damaged in Donagh Churchyard on 28th or 29th of June last, that the claim being over £40 will in accordance with a resolution of the Co. Council be opposed.

A report was read from Mr John Shields, City Monumental Works, Derry, dated 28th August 1905, who valued the damage on behalf of this Council, stating that 8 stones were thrown down, and another damaged, and offering to repair them to the satisfaction of any qualified Architect for £23-18-0; or if the three broken stones have to be replaced for a total cost of £51-10-0.

It was Resolved that this Council do not oppose the claim when the Co. Council is opposing, but that the Solicitor for the Co. Council be instructed to summon Mr John Shields as a witness in the case, and also that he request the judge to make the amount of decree (if any) leviable off Londonderry & D.

Mr. P. Doherty, S.P.O., reported that Mr. John Longley of Dravilla had failed to comply with notice served on him to connect his 3 sub-tenants houses with the new main sewer, and a Prosecution ordered. ...
 Read Report from Mr. Doherty, S.P.O., dated 2nd Sept. 1905, stating that he had made exhaustive enquiries re the outbreak of typhus fever in this district, & could find nothing to build on. The house in which it began was always kept clean & free from cattle & the occupier denies having purchased any old clothes within past year, but that he (the Doctor) was not inclined to believe them. The houses are now thoroughly disinfected & there has been no fresh case for past 4 weeks.

Mr. Doherty moved pursuant to notice that the L.G. Board be called upon to hold a sworn inquiry into the cause of the outbreak of fever in Buncrana, & that all communication between the fever hospital and Buncrana & the body of the House be stopped & the inmates of the House are coffining & burying the dead, and that the body be taken to the top of the hill & buried.

No person recorded the notice and it was not passed, the members considering that the precautions are being taken.

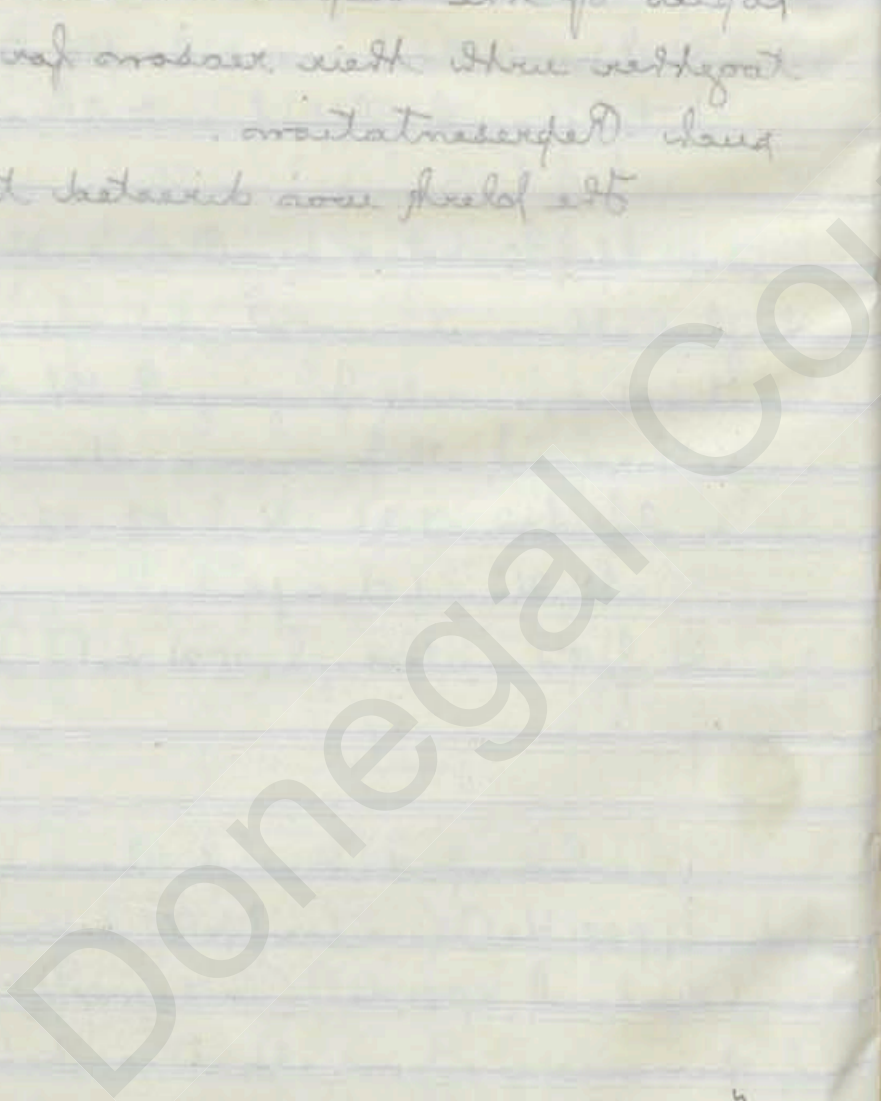

Read Letter from the L.G. Board dated 13th Sept. 1905, N 55183 forwarding extracts from the Report of their Medical Inspector Dr. Macfarthy, relating to the sanitary conditions of certain houses and their surroundings in the Clonmany & Puncrana Superintending Districts in which cases of Typhus Fever recently occurred, and suggesting that full reports be obtained from the Medical Officers of Health upon the sanitary condition of the houses in the District, and that the Sanitary Sub-Officers should be directed to report to each meeting all nuisances or sanitary defects in connection with the dwellings of the people.

Dr. Macfarthy stated that careful enquiries failed to show how the disease could have been imported from outside, but that the houses in which the disease occurred have many sanitary defects, notably clay floors, windows small & not made to open, sleeping rooms too crowded and not ventilated, & bedding & wearing apparel unclean, also that the surroundings of the houses are not kept clean. He recommended that all houses should be regularly inspected and the people instructed as to the necessity of light and ventilation and of cleanliness both of house and clothes.

Ordered that the Sanitary Sub-Officers be directed to inspect the houses in their districts regularly and systematically, visiting every house at least once in each half-year, and not devoting all their attention to premises along the main roads, and have all nuisances reported, & urge the people to improve their dwellings.

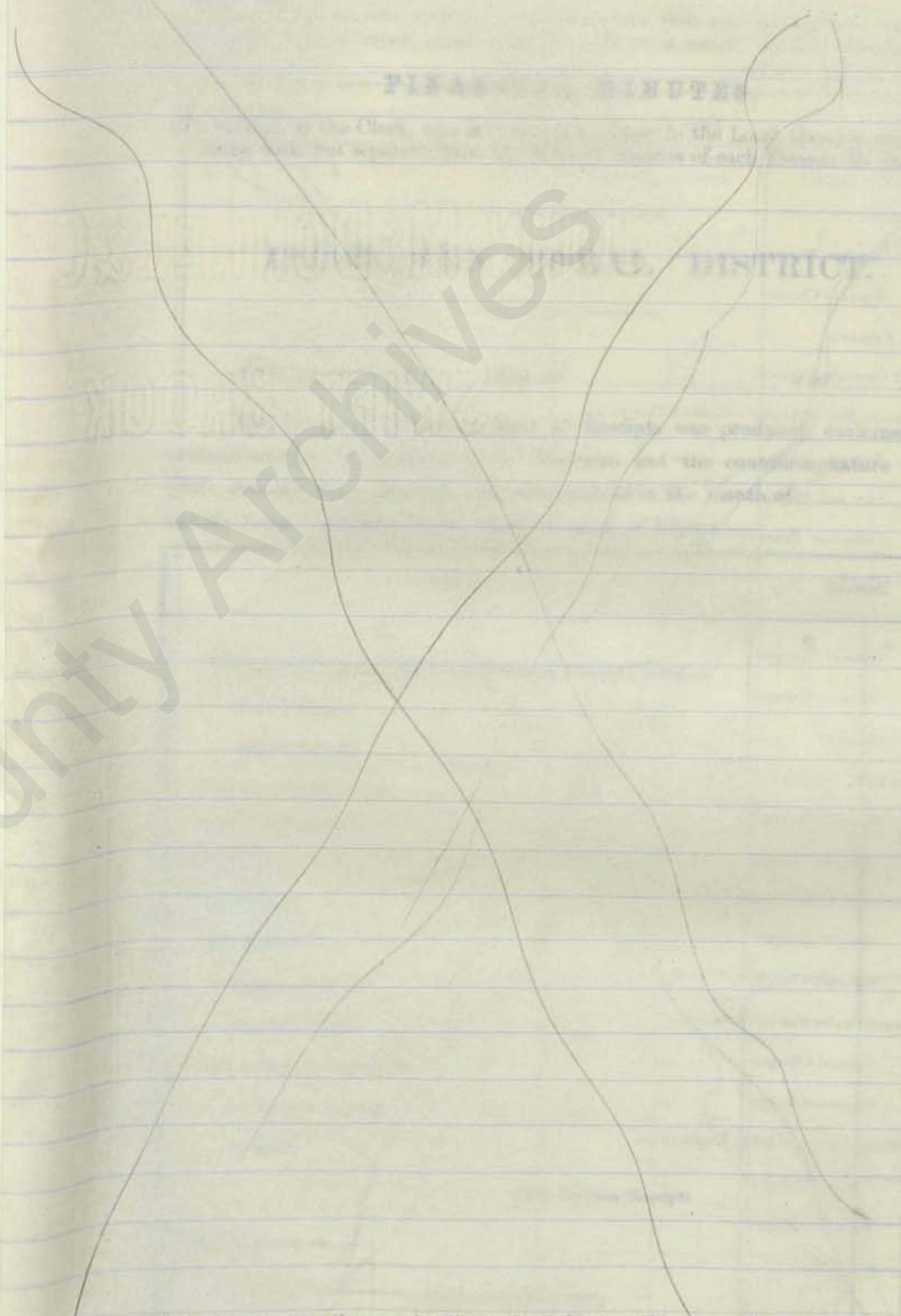

Mr. Patrick Doherty, S.S.O., reported that the case against Mr. Wm. J. Rand was before the Magistrate Petty Sessions on 7th Nov. for the second time and was further adjourned, pointing out that the expenses incurred will be £3:10:0, and suggesting that the Council should be represented by their Solicitor at next hearing on 5th Dec. 1905.

It was decided that Captain Cochrane, the chairman of the Petty Sessions, be written to pointing out the great expense the Council is at owing to these adjournments and requesting a decision at next hearing.

In the case of John Doherty of Tonduff, for failing to comply with the notice to have his house cleaned & limewashed & the roof repaired, a prosecution was ordered, D. Nelson to appear for the Council.

The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland, or others, were read, and directions given thereon, as follows:—

Read reports of Bandonagh Public Health Committee, dated 18th + 28th Aug. 1906, from which it appeared that Mr Jas. McDonough & Mr W. J. Brown were appointed Chairman & Secretary respectively. That the L.G. Board's letter of 16th May 1906, No 21700, forwarding copy of Memorial from inhabitants of Bandonagh re discharge of sewage into the river, & their further letters of 20th July 1906, No 41505, enclosing for observations a letter received from Sir John Keir of Tinnahogue, relative to the water supply of Bandonagh, Dr O'Callaghan's report of 4th July 1906 concerning Bandonagh water supply, & Mr Nolan's specification for sewers in Bridge St. & Chapel St. were considered by the Committee who are of opinion that the grievances complained of can never be satisfactorily removed until the town is provided with waterworks, but they would not think of recommending the adoption of a water scheme under the present Local Government Act as the expense would be entirely too heavy on the local ratepayers. The Committee, however, point out to the L.G. Board the necessity that exists for such improvement in the Act as will extend the area of taxation, and so enable the town to be provided with a proper supply of water at a reasonable charge to the inhabitant ratepayers. That having inspected the yards in Bridge St. & Chapel St. which the proposed sewers would serve and taking everything into account, including the memorial as to pollution of river by sewage, the Committee decided not to make these sewers at present. (The enclosures to above letters of L.G. Board are returned herewith) No order was made regarding this report.

Notice of the occupation of Workshop in Malin Road, Malin, for Dressmaking was given to Mr Mackey through the Inspector of the Factory Belfast.

Read Report from Buncrana Public Health Committee dated Aug. 24th Sept 3, 17422, 1906, asking the District Council to obtain a loan

The following letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland or others were received and directed as follows:

loan of £300 to carry out the necessary and urgent work of cleaning and increasing the capacity of the Town Reservoir and raising the breast of same as far as can be done with safety; repayment of same to be charged to Buncrana Water Area; and requesting the preliminaries to be hastened so that the work may be soon started, the early winter being the only time of the year when the like would be possible, and recommending that Mr John M. Robinson B.C. be employed as Engineer of the scheme, his remuneration to be 2½% on the amount of estimate in the event of the works not being proceeded with, or if the works are gone on with 5% on that amount of the contract. Also reporting that Mr John Grant had made an unauthorised & primitive connection with the main sewer without proper traps and recommending the Council to prosecute, but further stating that as Mr Grant had afterwards come and offered to open the sewer and make the connection to the Engineer's satisfaction legal proceedings would not be necessary. Also forwarding resolution recommending the Council to accept the Tender of the Buncrana Electric Supply Company for lighting the streets and roads of Buncrana for year ending 30th Sept. 1907 on same terms & conditions as current year, also their tender for altering the position of three of the lamps - bridge arc lamp and two incandescent lamps.

On the motion of Councillor E. Kearney seconded by Councillor O'Connell it was Resolved that the reports be approved and adopted except the paragraph relating to the acceptance of a tender for changing position of lamps it having been understood when the lamps were put up that if found to be in unsuitable positions they would be changed by the company at their own expense. That the L.S. Board be asked to sanction a loan of £300 for increasing the storage capacity of the reservoir and that Mr John M. Robinson be appointed as Engineer of the scheme on the terms mentioned in Committee

report and requested to prepare plans, specifications & estimate for submission to L.S. Board. That the Tender of the Buncrana Electric Supply Co. to light the streets & roads of Buncrana by electricity for year ending 30th Sept. 1907 with same number of lamps, same candle-power and terms as current year for the sum of £80, payable quarterly, be accepted.

Read Letter from the L.S. Board dated 4th Sept. 1906, N.P. 50713, forwarding a form on which the Council may apply for a loan to improve the Buncrana Reservoir, and stating that the Application should be accompanied by Plans, a specification, and an estimate to enable them to determine whether a local inquiry will be necessary. Also stating that the terms of repayment would be thirty years.

Read Letter from the L.S. Board dated 22nd Sept. 1906, N.P. 54885, with reference to the proposal to carry out an extension of the Buncrana Sewerage Scheme from Glenoe House to the north corner of Victoria Road and to defray the cost of same out of the Loan of £3000 sanctioned for the scheme, and stating that they will raise no objection to this proposal and asking that certified copies of the Plan and Specification be supplied for deposit in their office.

Ordered that the necessary copy plans be obtained from the Engineer for the Local Govt Board.

Read Letter from Mr Thos. Johnston B.C. dated 5th Sept. 1906, stating that the third instalment of the Sewerage Loan may be applied for as it will be wanted shortly.

Resolved that an application be now signed to the Board of Works for the third instalment, £500, of the Loan of £3000 for Buncrana Sewerage Scheme.

Read Letter from the L.G. Board, dated 4th Sept. 1906, N^o. 48662, respecting the issue of a sealed Order defining the area of charge for expenses in connection with the construction of a lead pipe from the water main at Quay St, Droiville, to the urinals on the Quay and stating that if the work can in any way be connected with any of the works for which the area of charge has been fixed no new order would be required. Also pointing out that the Council do not appear to have been invested with Urban powers to enable them to make such expenditure for water supply to urinals.

On the motion of Councillor Jas. O'Shaughlin, seconded by Councillor John Smith it was Resolved that the L.G. Board be informed that the Council only extended this branch pipe along the public road towards the Quay, the Harbour Authorities making the usual connection and taking the water into the urinals, and that the Council consider the work may reasonably be connected with the works authorised in sealed orders N^o. 25826/1879, N^o. 35 N^o. 1899, and N^o. 47477-18/2/1902.

Read Report from Droiville Public Health Committee dated 4th Sept. 1906, asking authority from the Council to employ Mr. Nolan B.E. to report on the cost of making a filter for Droiville Waterworks as the water is becoming so bad, & requesting that the Reservoir be cleaned as soon as possible.

On the motion of Councillor Jas. O'Shaughlin, sec^d by Councillor Smith, it was resolved that the Report be approved & adopted & the Committee authorised to employ Mr. Nolan B.E. to draw up Plans, Specification and Estimate for the works, including the cleaning of the reservoir and that a loan of £150 be applied for to clean & improve the reservoir & construct a filter.

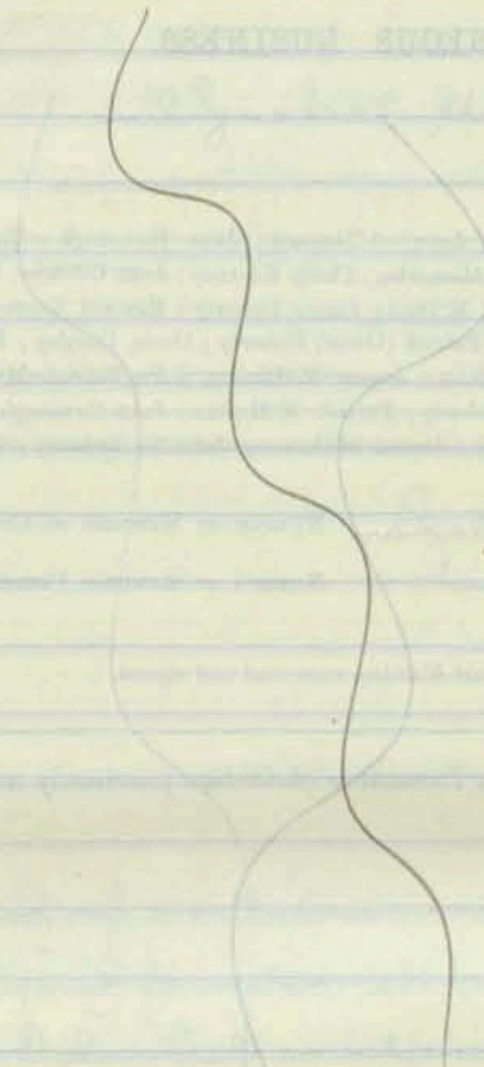

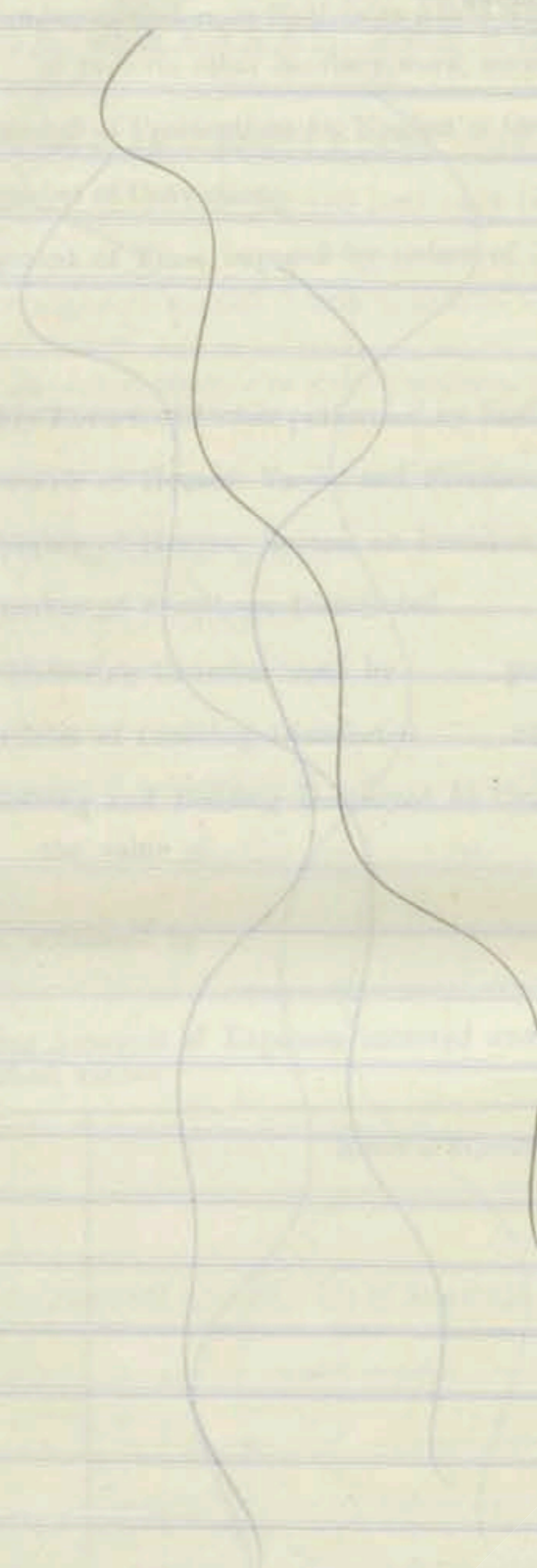

The Public Health portions of the Half Yearly Returns, Form D, of the Medical Officers of Buncrana & Bannagh were submitted. Read Letter from the L.G. Board, dated 5th Nov. 1906, N^o. 63554, forwarding extracts from the half yearly reports of the Medical Officers of Malin & Bandonagh Districts relating (1) to the inaction of the District Council as regards the improvement of Bandonagh Well, and (2) to the filthy and disgraceful state of Bandonagh Water Supply, no effort being made to improve it. It was resolved to mark the letter read, a Councillor pointing out that the Committee are endeavouring some repairs to improve the wells.

A long circular letter dated 4th Oct. 1906, was received from the Home Secretary, forwarding a copy of the Tables for 1904, Homework under the Factory Act, & urging the enforcement by the Council & their Officers of the Homework provisions of the Factory Act. It was decided to take no action, unless special reason should arise such as the outbreak of infectious disease among workers.

The letter of the L.G. Board, dated 21st July 1906, N^o. 41647, was again considered after special notice to each member, & it was unanimously decided to authorise the Medical Officers to send specimens of sputum of suspected cases of consumption to Professor Milne-Edwards for examination @ a cost of 3/- for each specimen of 3/6 bottles.

Read Letter from the L.G. Board, dated 20th Oct. 1906, N^o. 60548, extending the time within which payment of £1 to Messrs. G. Brown & Sons, Ltd. for goods supplied for Buncrana Sewerage in January last, may be made to 30th Nov. 1906. A Paying Order was passed for the amount.

Read Letter from Mr. John Porter of Buncrana, dated 11th Nov. 1906, forwarding copy of a Memorial which had been sent

The following letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland or others were

to the Bunceana P. H. Committee protesting against the alteration of position of one of the electric lamps on Bunceana Main Street, + requesting the Council to have it changed back free of cost to the ratepayers. Statements having been made by Councillors Dinklinchey + Porter, Councillor Porter moved + Councillor Philip Kearney seconded that the Bunceana Public Health Committee be requested to hold a special meeting at an early date to consider this letter + memorial, and to decide whether the lamp should be allowed to remain in its new position or removed back to its original one. Councillor Dinklinchey moved as an amendment that it be referred back to be considered at the next ordinary meeting of Committee.

As the amendment was not seen the motion was passed.

Bunceana Public Health Committee

Read Report of Bunceana P. H. Committee, dated 10th Nov. 1906, forwarding the following resolution: - (1) That we recommend the District Council to increase the salary of Denis Doherty, San. Pub. Officer, by £10 per annum, owing to increased duties consequent upon the growth of the Town and also the increased amount of time + attention necessitated by the new sewers and sanitary arrangements.

(2) That the District Council be requested to lose no time in passing the application + applying for the grant of loan at the earliest possible moment for the improvement of the Reservoir to be proceeded with with all speed so that the Reservoir may have time to get refilled before the dry weather of spring. It is only during the winter months the work can be done, and to leave it over to the winter of 1907-8 is out of the question, considering the quantity of water the new sewers demand.

Also sending the Engineer's Certificate for £4000 payable to Gen. Doherty, Bunceana, on account of contract for the extension of the Drain Sewer in Church Road, Bunceana, between Victoria Road + Glencoe House.

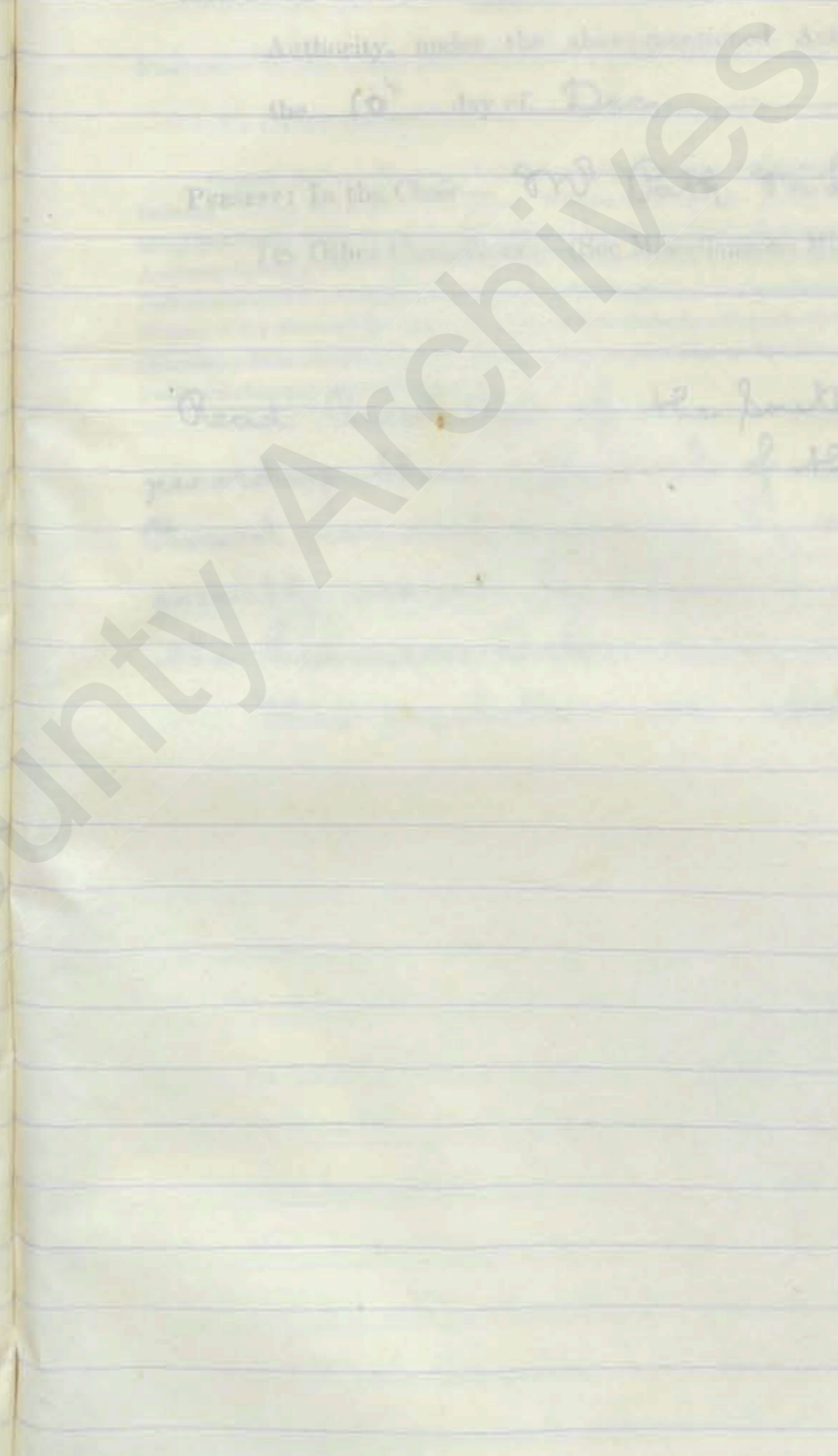

Mr. Denis Doherty, D.P., Bandonagh, returned the copies of the notices served last February on a number of residents in the Parish of Bandonagh requiring the removal of manure from their streets, and reported that same had not been complied with.

Read letter from the Secretary of Buncrana Public Health Committee stating that the committee had appointed Messrs J. W. Robinson, Esq., Cath. Peter, D.P., Mr. Doherty, D.P., Mr. Doherty, D.P., Chairman and Mr. P. Doherty, Secretary of the committee + the Clerk of the District Council to give evidence before Mr. Price, L.G. Inspector, respecting the application for loan to increase the storage capacity of Buncrana Reservoir.

The Clerk stated that he had attended the inquiry on 18th Dec. 1906, and that in addition to the witnesses mentioned, Mr. Nelson, Medical Officer, on the suggestion of Mr. Price, was also sent for and examined.

Read Report from Buncrana Public Health Committee dated 7th + 12th Jan. 1907, again recommending that the increase of £10 in the salary of Denis Doherty, D.P., and caretaker of Waterworks for acting as caretaker of Buncrana Drains, Sewers to be granted, same to be chargeable to Buncrana water area, and to date from 1st Oct. last. Also putting out the increased duties of Denis Doherty, as follows:— To be fully responsible through the Buncrana Public

The following letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland were forwarded to the Inishowen Rural District Council for the efficiency and proper personal superintendence at all times of the new sewerage works at Buncrana, both main sewers and all purified connections. To notify at once all or any defects, and to do all duties in respect of same which may be deemed necessary by the Buncrana Public Health Committee.

Councillor Kavanagh moved and Councillor McDaid seconded that no payment be made to Denis Doherty for these increased duties until he is regularly elected. Councillor Kearney moved as an amendment, and Councillor Smith seconded that the report of the Committee and the duties until he is regularly elected of the caretaker of the sewers approved and the latter paid his salary as from 1st Oct. last.

On a division there voted for the motion Councillors Kavanagh and McDaid = 2 and for the amendment Councillors Jas. McLaughlin (Joseph), P. Kearney, C. Kearney, John Smith, John Doherty (Terence) and the Chairman = 6. It is so ordered.

The amendment was declared carried. Read Letter from the L.G. Board, dated 5th Jan. 1907, and No. 72639/1906 with reference to the application of the Council for sanction to a loan of £150 for the purpose of improving the Moyille Reservoir and constructing a filter and stating that they had received the report of their Inspector, Mr. Price, of his inspection of these works on 19th Dec. last. That the Inspector reported that during the period of 26 years since the works were completed little attention has been paid to them, the gate at the reservoir has been removed, the fence broken down, storm water channel so obstructed that flood water flows directly into the Reservoir with the result that deep deposits have formed in its bed, the

sides of the reservoir are covered with a growth of brushwood + the whole works have the appearance of continued neglect. The water in the Reservoir and pipes is discoloured and contains a quantity of mud and sand. That it does not appear to be intended to construct a filter and that about half the proposed expenditure is for works rendered necessary by want of proper maintenance and portion of the other works would not be required if the reservoir and storm water channel were cleared + maintained. The 2 new cross walls proposed to be constructed do not appear necessary. The storm water channel and reservoir should be cleared and a by pass arrangement provided to keep up the town supply while the reservoir is being cleaned. The caretaker's duties should include the opening of the large scour valve periodically, keeping storm channel clear, cutting brushwood + weeds and repairing fences. When the suggested repairs + cleaning have been carried out the Council should direct the Engineer to prepare a report with sketch plan as to any improvement in the works which may then appear necessary.

The Clerk stated he had forwarded a copy of the above letter to the Moyille P. H. Committee and had received the following report in reply :-

Moyille Public Health Committee - 11th Jan. 1907 -
With reference to L.G.B. letter No. 72639 of 5th Jan. 1907 re Moyille Waterworks, read at a special meeting today, I am instructed to write the following paragraphs in order as in L.G.B. letter :-
With reference to the period of 26 years we beg to draw the attention of the L.G.B. to the fact that the present local committee and indeed the District Council have only had charge of the works for 3 years and cannot be held responsible for the state of the reservoir before that. It is this Committee's opinion that owing to this fact the whole works should be put in order, the expense to be borne by loan otherwise

The cost would be too heavy for one year's rate, only £100 being allowed for all expenses. The only item excepted is the cutting of the brushwood which they are prepared to do themselves out of the £100. The Committee note that a floating filter and two cross walls are not required and they quite see the object and approve of the bye pass. Strict injunctions have been issued to the caretaker as to scouring pipes and other things of the kind and as soon as the other works are done, viz. storm channel, brushwood etc., & cleaning of present filter pond, he will be required to keep them in order. But until these are done either by money from a loan or otherwise, they have got into such a state that the man could not possibly do them for a remuneration of £10 which he gets now.)

With regards to the last paragraph of L.S.B. letter this committee beg to refer the L.S.B. to the plans prepared last month, and to state that they still apply for sufficient money as a loan to carry out those plans, with the exception of the floating filter & the cutting of brushwood, but substituting in addition the construction of a "bye-pass" as suggested by L.S.B. Engineer - and the strengthening of the present cross wall.

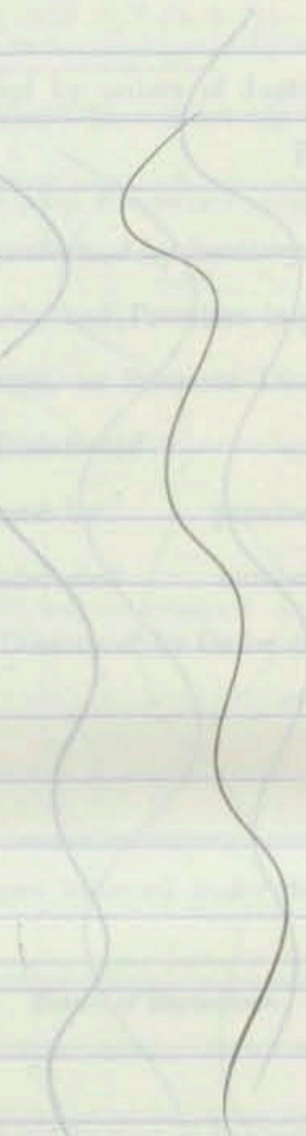

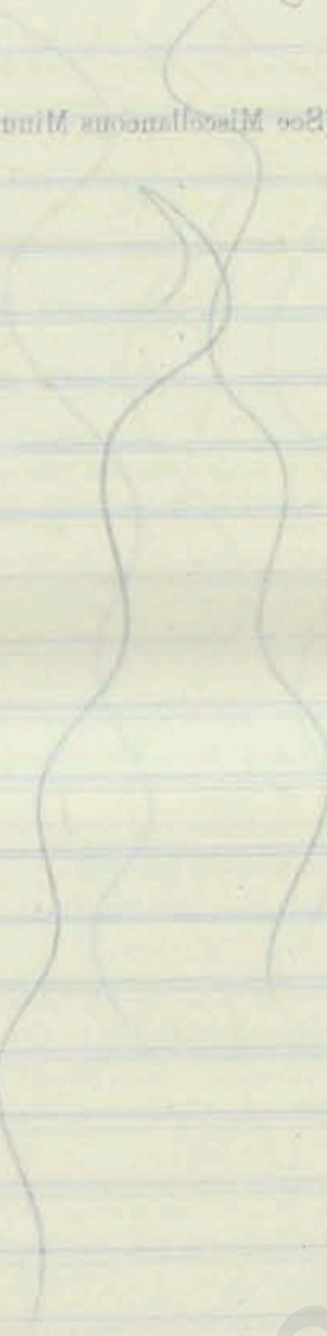

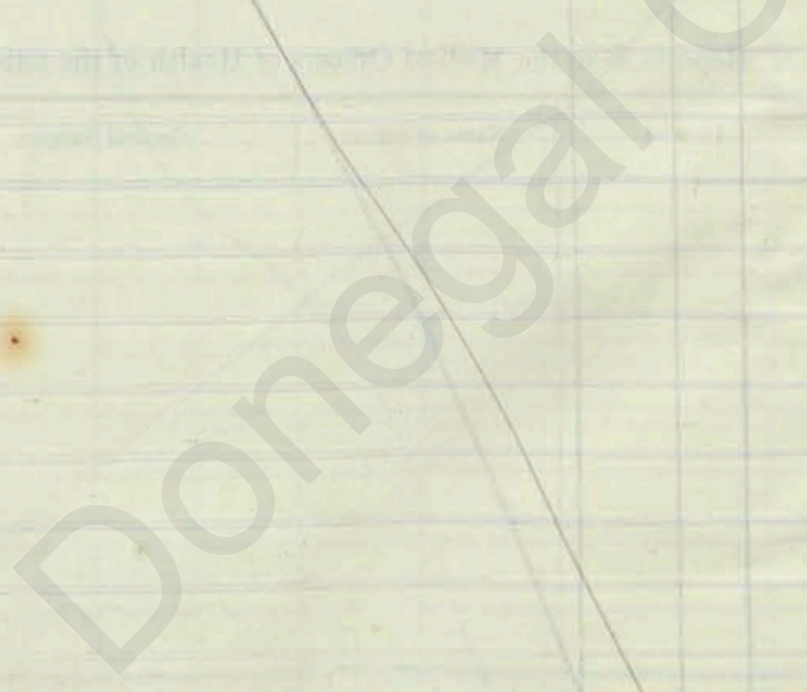

The Clerk reported with reference to the direction contained in Minutes of 10th Dec last, that he considered the Public Health Act made the Council liable for the expense of clearing the obstructed private sewers behind Montgomery Terrace, Naville, and that Messrs. Ptk. Farnen, Jas. & Dowell, & Wm. McSheffrey could not be made contribute.

Read Circular Letter from Mr. Daniel Fletcher, Ex San. Offr. Devon, dated 4th Feb. 1907, inviting the cooperation of this Council in the effort being made now to check the spread of Consumption, particularly as to the circulation of full literature on the subject, and regarding the proposal to erect a Sanatorium for the North-West District.

It was decided to procure a supply of the leaflet card for distribution to the Dispensaries, Schools, Clergy, Guardians, &c. and the Clerk was directed to state that, after an informal discussion, the Council approve of the erection of a Sanatorium if the other Councils in the North-West combine, the cost of erection to be borne by loan, and the repayments apportioned over the several Bodies in proportion to Valuation.

Board, dated 7th Feb. 1907, No. 13 M. 1907 recommending precautions to be taken with the view of preventing the outbreak of Cerebro-Spinal Fever and of detecting the occurrence of early cases & suggesting the adoption of the Infectious Disease (Notification) Act, 1889. It was decided not to take action for the present.

The Clerk submitted List of Outworkers furnished by Messrs. McIntyre, Hogg, Marsh & Co in connection with their shirt factories at Farrdonagh, Glountney & Rosdubon.

Read Letter from the L.G. Board dated 24th Jan. 1907, N. 3911,

forwarding copy of D. Macfarlan's observations concerning the Order of the Council on the Slievebaun Nuisance cases on 14th January last, in which he states that it is not to be expected that Sanitary Notices will be complied with if the Council takes no steps to enforce the law.

The Chairman stated there is very little to complain of in the whole thing at present.

Board's letter of 1/2/07 N. 3911 was considered by the Committee that day, and it was Resolved that the Committee are willing to have further Maps and Estimates prepared for the satisfaction of the L.G. Board, and suggesting that Mr. Nolan, B.E. be communicated with as he knows exactly what the L.G. Board require.

On the motion of Councillor Cavanagh seconded by Councillor O'Donnell the report was approved.

Read Report from Buncrana Public Health Committee dated 4th Feb. 1907, recommending the Council to serve notice on, and take the requisite steps to compel, the owner of Daniel McKenna's house in Buncrana to connect it with the main Sewer.

Ordered that notice be served on Mr. Mitchell, Agent, to have the connection made within 14 days.

Buncrana Reservoir

Read letter from the L.G. Board, dated 25th Jan. 1907, N. 502, stating they had received the report of their Inspector, Mr. Price, on the Inquiry held by him into the application of the Council for sanction to a loan of £300 for increasing the capacity of Buncrana Reservoir. The Inspector pointed out that the whole supply to the reservoir comes through a six inch diameter pipe over 1/2 mile long, the inlet to which, and possibly part of the pipe itself, is partially blocked, and he stated that little improvement can be effected until this pipe is so altered that it will deliver sufficient water to keep the reservoir full. He also stated that the proposal to raise the weir 3 feet, & sides of the reservoir proportionately would only add 2 days supply. The Board suggest that the question be reconsidered whether the present source may be more fully utilised, or a new source secured and recommend that the Council instruct the Engineer to make further investigations as to sufficiency of source, maximum population to be supplied, and the actual consumption of water in recent years, and report fully as to the best means to secure an adequate supply all the year.

Read Report from Buncrana Public Health Committee dated 4th Feb. 1907, stating that at a meeting that evening the L.G. Board's letter of 25/1/07, N. 502, was considered. That with reference to paragraph 4 of same which states that the proposed works would only add 2 days supply there must be some mistake, as the Engineer reported that the raising of the bank 3 feet would add 12 days supply. His report was as follows:— "I carefully examined the existing works and the Plans which were prepared for same, and am of opinion that it would be feasible to raise the embankment some 3 feet higher,

"the increased storage which could be obtained by so doing would add 370,840 gallons, or about 12 days extra supply, and would bring the total capacity of the reservoir up to 1 1/2 million gallons, or about 50 days supply." The Committee are satisfied that the 12 days additional supply will fully meet the demands for water for many years and do not contemplate going to any more expense further than substituting a nine-inch for a six-inch pipe at the inlet to reservoir, and are prepared to increase the loan for this purpose.

On the motion of Councillor O'Donnell, seconded by Councillor Scott, the report was approved, & the L.G. Board respectfully requested to look into the matter again.

Water Engineer, Londonderry, be asked to make Plans and Specifications forthwith for substituting 9 inch for the existing 6 inch pipes from Gransha Road to Reservoir, and to invite Tenders and see the work carried out, remuneration in terms of his former offer viz: 2 1/2 % for Plans, &c. and 2 1/2 % on amount of Tender for seeing work properly done, the existing pipes to be carefully lifted by contractor, and given over to Committee" (See L.G.B. letter of 25/1/07 p. 502)

On the motion of Councillor Porter seconded by Councillor Scott the report was approved.

The following letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland or others, were read Report of Carndonagh Public Health Committee dated 29th March 1907, stating that they had considered the letter of the L.G. Board dated 15/2/07, N. 7667, forwarding report of D. O'Hallaghan wherein he attributed the cause of a case of enteric fever in Carndonagh to impure water, and that the only opinion they can give on the matter has been already expressed in their Report of 18th August last regarding the water supply of the town. They expected the L.G. Board would have taken some action in regard to their suggestion that the taxable area should be enlarged and a waterworks provided. The townspeople could not possibly bear the whole expense of the undertaking themselves. As an alternative the Committee would further suggest that the Workhouse could be provided with a branch supply of the water, then half the whole cost of the scheme could be borne by the Union.

With regard to D. O'Hallaghan's report about the approach to the Pound Street well and his suggestion that a sewer should be made above the well to keep the surface water off the laneway, the Committee visited the place & find that the laneway cannot be kept clean until this surface water is removed by a pipe, as suggested by D. O'Hallaghan, but the Committee believe that their duty in improving the place should not extend beyond the well. They would suggest that the parties from whose premises the water is coming should be noticed to have this pipe made either jointly or in proportion to the extent of their premises, the pipe to be connected with the sewer at the Well. D. O'Hallaghan's remarks as to the yards &c about the well would need to be carried out.

With regard to the letter of the L.G. Board, dated 15th Feb. 1907, N. 7667, and the foregoing report, the Council decided to reply to the L.G. Board that they will take action to provide a water supply for Carndonagh

as soon as the rate payers of the town express a wish for it on the understanding that the area of charge be the area benefitted and that no proportion of the cost of the scheme be charged to the Union at large on account of a branch main to the Workhouse, as the Guardians have a satisfactory supply at present, and if in the future they see fit to connect with the Carndonagh water main they would pay for any water used at the Workhouse.

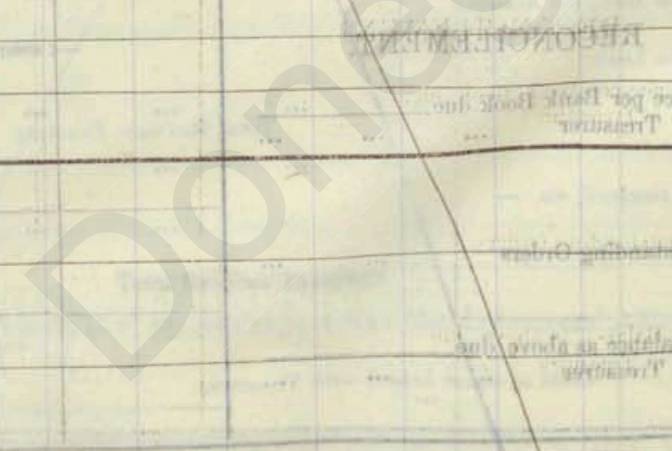

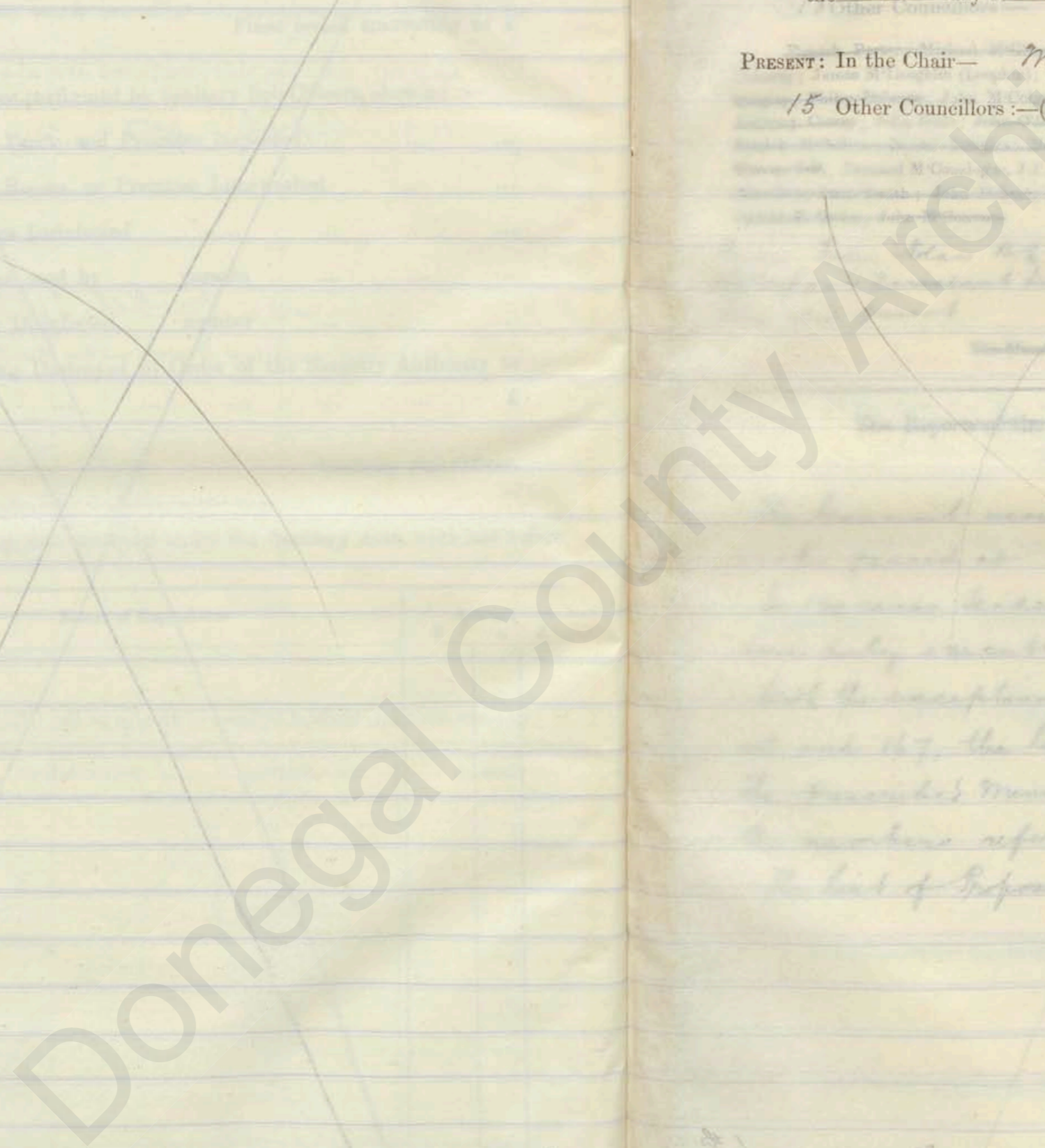

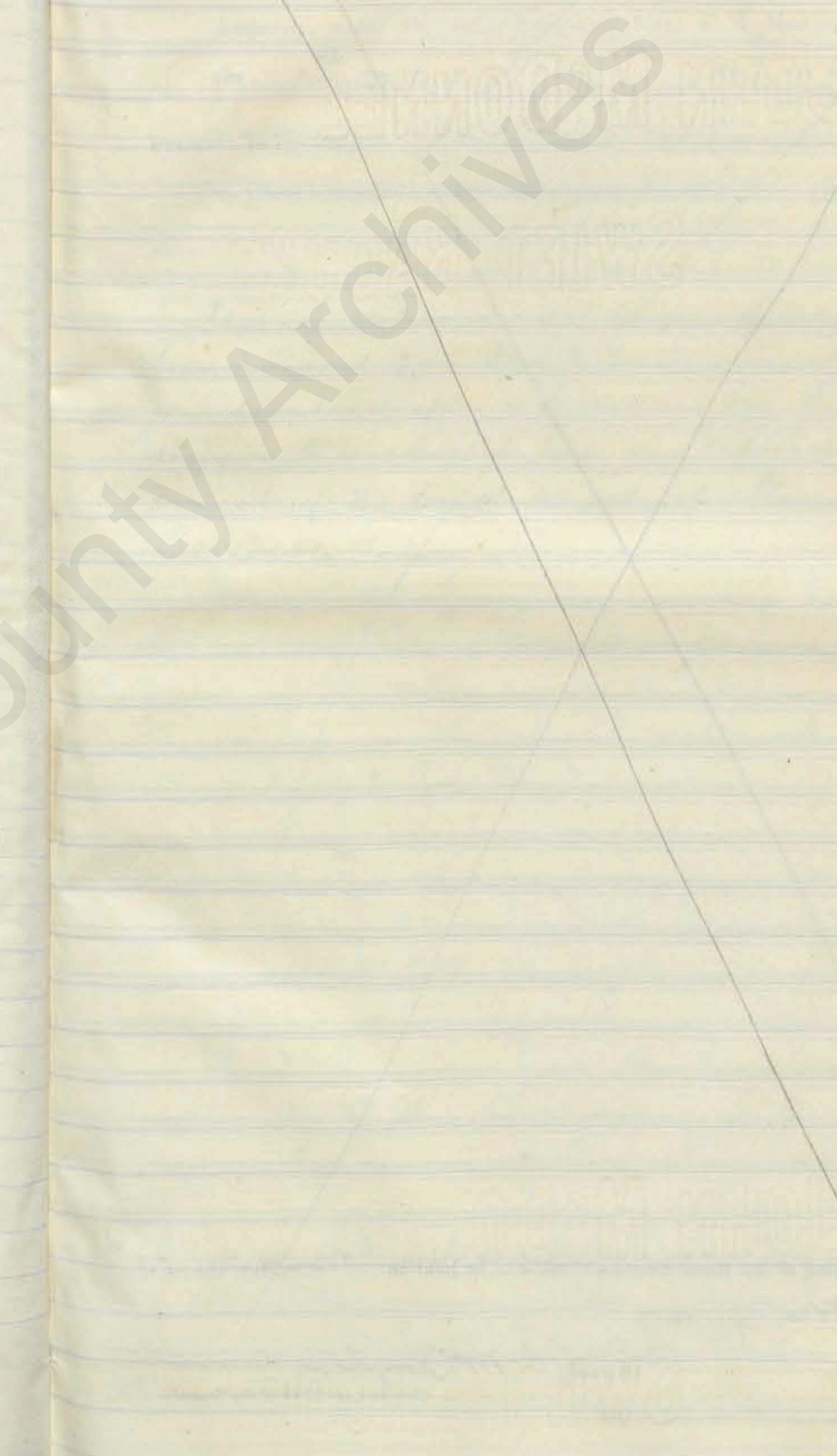

On the motion of Councillor McLaughlin seconded by Councillor P. McLaughlin, design G for double houses.
 It was agreed by those present that the single Cottages should be built, unless where a Sites Committee recommended a double one.

It was decided to obtain compulsory powers in connection with the scheme.

Mr. Cavanagh suggested that James Campbell of Carrowhugh should get a cottage on Tom Baird's holding in Carrowhugh, and the suggestion was agreed to.

The Clerk reported that he had communicated with the applicants for cottages as to whether they would be satisfied with half-acre plots & cottage @ a probable rent of 1/6 of week, or would be willing to pay 2/- of week and get acre plots. About one-third of the applicants replied that they would be satisfied with half-acre plots, and two-thirds stated they would prefer acre plots at the higher rent. A few withdrew their applications, and some others stated that less than an acre would be useless, particularly in backward districts.

The Clerk mentioned that the Sites Committee for Carrindonagh had made no report on about 21 of the representations, and he was directed to summon a meeting of that Committee for Thursday next to go into the matter again.

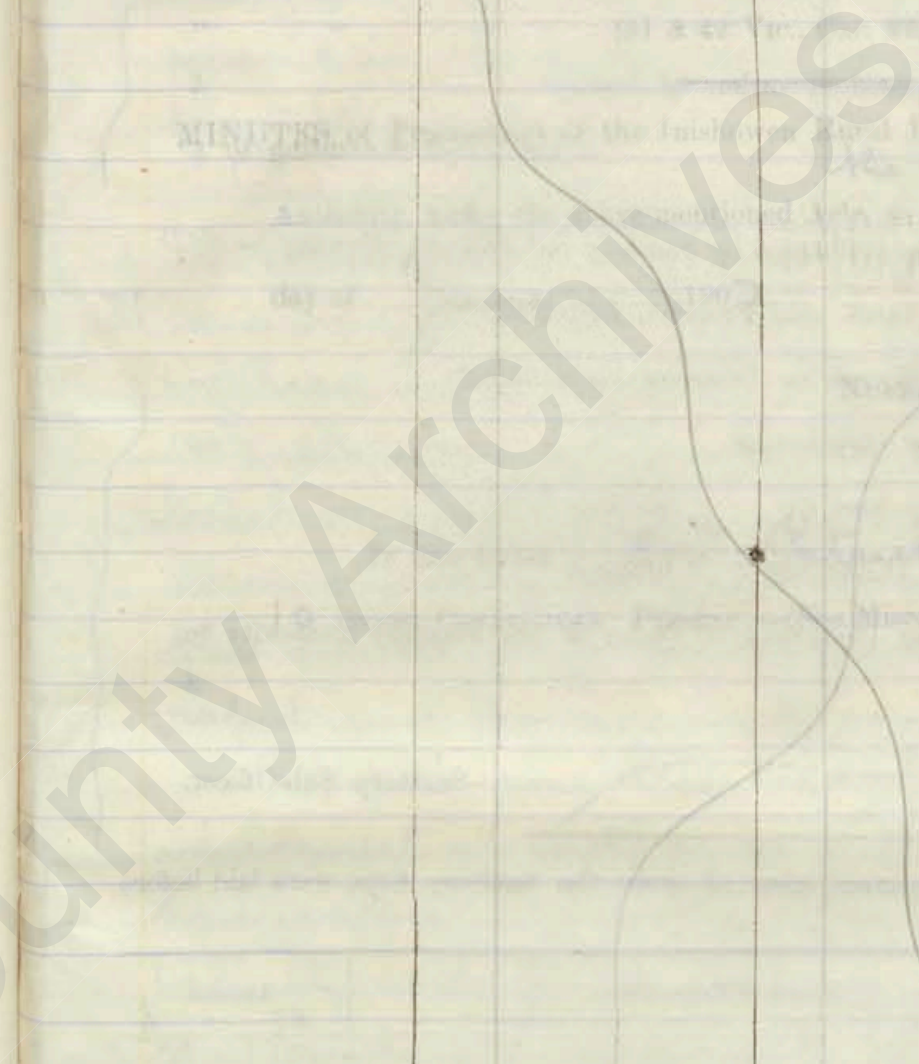

In the case of Danl. R. Doherty, Bridge St., Carudough, who failed to comply with notice to make a connecting sewer, in which the local committee recommend legal proceedings, it is directed that proceedings be taken at Petty Sessions, by D. O'Callaghan to appear for the Council.

Read Letter from D. O'Reilly, Moirle, dated 1st June 1907, stating in reference to the report of outbreak of pharyngo-spinal meningitis (already noted) that it is nearly impossible to have patients suffering from this disease removed to the Union Hospital it is so rapid and severe in its course.

A report was also read from M^r. Patk. Doherty, S.S.B. in connection with same outbreak stating that he had inspected all the other houses in the immediate vicinity and found nothing worthy of any notice in the sanitary arrangements and that they were unable in any way to trace the origin of the disease.

Read Letter from the L.G. Board, dated 27th May 1907, No. 23929, forwarding extracts from the Half-Yearly Return, Form S, of the Medical Officers of Health for Half-Year ended 31st March 1907, for the consideration of the Council. The extracts having been read were decided to be fairly satisfactory.

Read Letter from the L.G. Board, dated 14th May 1907, No. 23937, requesting that an explanation be obtained from M^r. Patk. Doherty, S.S.B. as to why he made no reports to the Medical Officer of Health during the half-year ended 31st March 1907.

The Clerk submitted the following explanation from this Officer:—

Dear Sir, In reply to your communication relative to the L.S. Board's inquiry why I have not made any reports to the Sanitary Officer during the half-year ending 31st March 1907, I beg to say that during the half-year mentioned I have been over the whole district and found nothing of a serious nature where I could make a report. In some cases where I found anything approaching a nuisance I gave verbal instructions and I found they carried these out and often more satisfactorily than I could have done by reporting it. I also made another inspection of the entire district and anything which I may find defective will report.

A communication was read from the Town Clerk of Douglas (Isle of Man) inviting the Council to appoint delegates to the Congress on Public Health to be held there from 29th June to 5th July 1907. The action was taken.

Carndonagh Water Supply, &c.

In connection with the letter of the Local Govt. Board of 23rd April 1907, N^o 18578, and the report of D^r O'Ballaghan as set out on Minutes of 13th May 1907—

The Carndonagh Public Health Committee reported that they considered these communications at a meeting on 23rd May 1907, with reference to the L.S. Board's letter the Committee are of opinion that this communication is rather for the consideration of the District Council. They would refer the Council to the extract taken from their (the Committee's) last report by the L.S. Board, viz: "That the townspeople could not possibly bear the whole expense of the

undertaking themselves." The Committee beg to repeat this statement and in doing so they feel that they convey the opinion of the ratepayers of the town generally. The Committee observe that the L.S. Board have power to determine the taxable area in regard to sanitary works. In their last report the Committee suggested that the Workhouse, in case of the provision of water works, could get a branch supply of the water, and that half the cost of the whole scheme could be charged to the Union. They believe that this arrangement would be more satisfactory than by confining the tax to a smaller area. Within the past few years a good deal of money has been spent in keeping up the water supply at the Workhouse still it seems it is neither sufficient nor good. Writing to the Council on the subject on 13th May, D^r O'Ballaghan says "During the past week the Workhouse was two days without water, which even at its best is in my opinion unfit for human consumption &c."

Under the circumstances the Committee are hopeful that the Council will approve of the arrangement suggested and that they will recommend the adoption of it to the L.S. Board.

The Committee also reported that the well in Malin St. has been provided with a gate, and they intend to draw the Assistant Surveyor's attention to the nuisance in the railway field as they think it pertains to county work. That they recommend a prosecution in D^r N. Doherty's case; and that they do not purpose making an additional sewer at the Pound Well, and that the parties who are to make the sewer along the lane can easily connect it with

had the sewer that carries off the surplus water of the well. —

Ordered that this report be not adopted and that the Council adhere to their opposition to any area of charge for bandonagh water supply except the immediate area benefitted and in their capacity as a Board of Guardians have no intention of bringing a branch main to the Workhouse, as the supply there since the new pipe was put into proper working order is ample, and the stoppage referred to by D. O'Callaghan was due to a temporary breakdown of the pump, and further that the water is wholesome and no case of infectious disease has ever occurred in the Workhouse since it was opened 63 years ago which was attributed to the quality of the water.
