The Minutes of the last Meeting (or Meetings) were read and signed.

The Reports of the Clerk on execution of Orders previously made.

With reference to the first item on the agenda viz to consider the question of taking advantage of portion of the Road Board Grant to deal with the barrow keel to Moville road and the district rate the adoption of same would necessitate the expert surveyor (Mr. Shealman) state the proposition with regard to this matter in detail. He said the Road Board were giving £10,000 as a free grant to the County on condition the County Council raised a sum equal to a penny rate on the County, about £1200. The County Council had allocated equally to the Northern & Southern Divisions and it was proposed to allocate £2000 to Shilford R.D. & £3000 to Inishowen for the road from the barony meaning at barrow keel to Glebe bridge near Moville, 6³/₄ miles long. In order to take advantage of the Grant the District Council would need to raise a sum of £365 off the rates, or about 2^d in the pound. At present the 6³/₄ miles of road costs £348 to maintain or taking a five year term £1740. If

The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland, and others, were read by the Clerk, and directions given to answer them, respectively, to the following effect (or Orders made on them respectively, as follows): -

If the grant were spent on the road on the very high specification prescribed, very little expense would be incurred for upkeep for 5 years, say £8 per mile per year, so that there would be a clear gain of £800 in the five years, or £160 per annum released for new roads + other necessary miscellaneous works.

A long discussion ensued, during which reference was made to the great damage which has been done to said stretch of road by the heavy motor mail of Messrs Roberts & Sons.

Councillor Smith moved and Councillor McConnell seconded that we accept the Road Board grant of £3000 on the terms offered and agree to such a rate as will produce the required contribution of £365.

Councillor Philip Doherty moved as an amendment and the Chairman (Councillor J. Cavanagh) seconded that we will not agree to accept the grant for improving this line of road unless Messrs Roberts & Sons be compelled to contribute to the upkeep of same ^{to an amount} commensurate with the damage done to it by their heavy motor.

On a division there voted for the motion Councillors Smith and McConnell, 2 and for the amendment, Councillors McGlinchey, Patk Kavanagh, P. Kearney, Philip Doherty, Harkin, Patk Doherty (O.), P. McLaughlin, McCallion, Diver, H. Doherty, McMullan, J. Cavanagh, John Doherty, Wm Quigley + Green = 15.

The amendment was declared carried. A vote of thanks was passed to the Co. Surveyor for his lucid statement.

Dairy &c. Inspector.

Read Letter from the L.G. Board, dated 29th July 1913, (No. 39844/1913, Inishowen R.D.) sanctioning the Salary of £10 a year to Mr. R. Marner T.S. as Inspector for the purposes of the Dairies, Cowsheds, & Milkshops (Ireland) Order of 1908, asking whether Mr. Marner has started work, and stating that the Council should fix a definite date for the carrying out of registration & also give public notice of their decision by advertisement & poster, & that the Council should follow this up subsequently by proceedings against defaulters.

It was decided to fix the 1st Oct. 1913 as the date for completion of Registration & inform the L.G. Board that Mr. Marner is at work. Also that the clergy be asked to announce the requirements as to registration.

Macfarthy's letter there were also others furnished to Bunswara Public Health Committee, that steps are taken for the improvement of insanitary dwellings as the cases are reported; that the question of an additional water supply for Bannadoragh is engaging the attention of the Public Health Committee & that the quality of the water of Bannadoragh river, which partly supplies the town has been recently favourably reported on to the Board of Guardians when he stated that it was ~~quite~~ free from contamination with organic matter of animal origin and is quite good for drinking purposes; that the Council will consider the adoption of the Infectious Disease (Notification) Act. at next meeting.

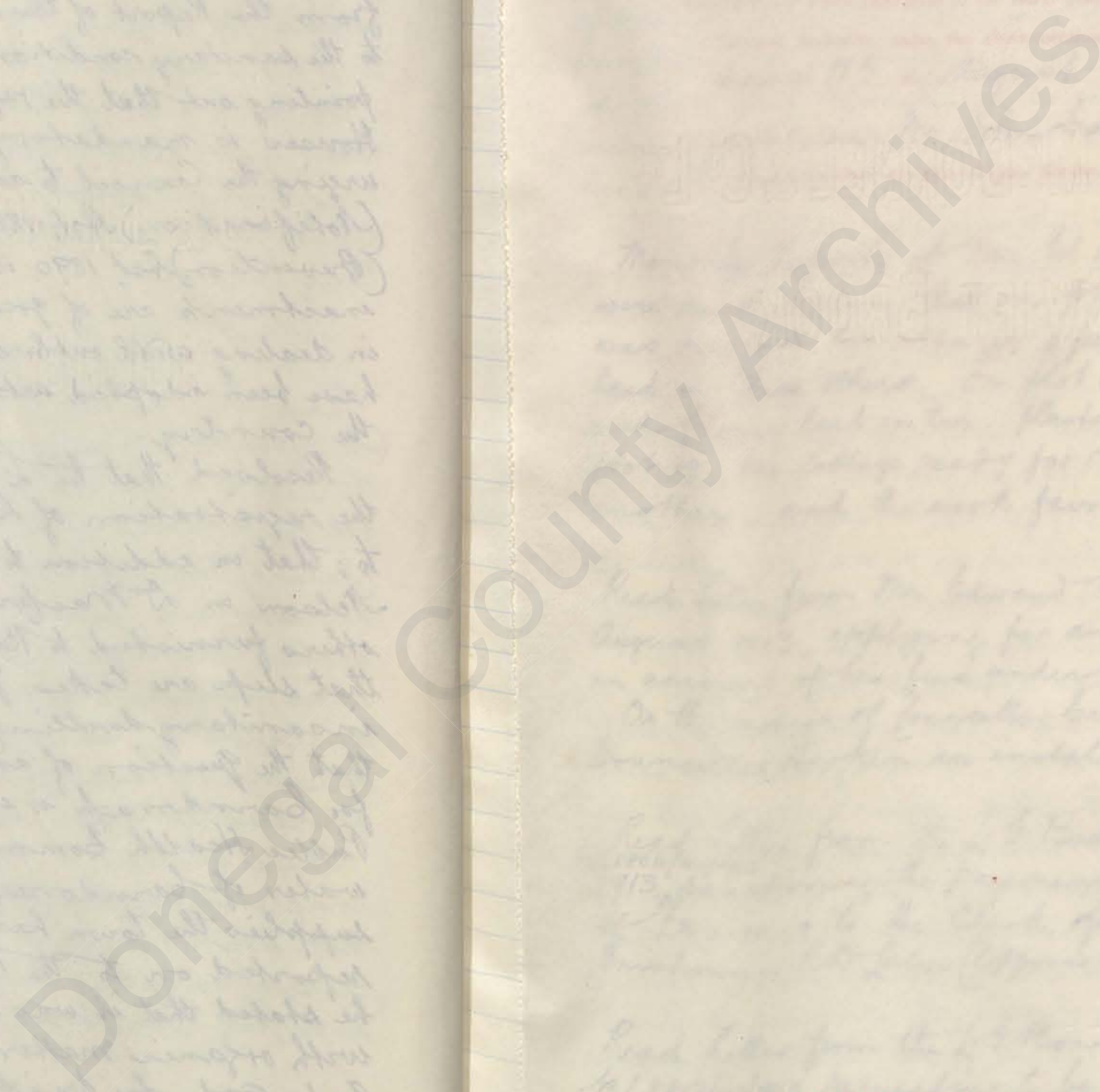

O'Callaghan, Engineer, were read stating that on plot 13A one cottage was roofed, two cottages 4 feet in height, and founds laid in them others; on plot 15, four cottages roofed and floors laid in two, plastering to be done; On plot 19, one cottage ready for roof, founds laid for another, and the work fair in all cases.

Read Letter from Mr. Edward O'Callaghan, dated 8th August 1913, applying for an instalment of £25 on account of his fees under Scheme No. 4.

On the motion of Councillor Cavanagh seconded by Councillor Harkin an instalment of £25 was passed.

Read Letter from the L.G. Board, dated 7th August 1913, sanctioning the payment of an instalment of £23.10.0 to the Clerk, for fees under "The Inishowen R.D. Labors (Opposed + Unopposed) Orders, 1912."

Read Letter from the L.G. Board dated 6th August 1913 No. L8817/112/1913 requesting to be furnished with a statement of the expenditure from the loans sanctioned for the purposes of "The Inishowen R.D. Labors. (Unopposed + Opposed) Orders of 1912."

The Clerk said the Returns had been furnished.

Read letter from the L.G. Board, dated 9th Aug. 1913, No. L. 8819/112/1913, acknowledging receipt of returns of expenditure from loans of £2040 granted for the purposes of "The Drishowen R.D. (Unopposed) Order of 1909" and requesting to be informed why the erection of cottage on plot 25A at Drumaweer has not yet been commenced.

On the motion of Councillor Savanagh seconded by Councillor Smith it was decided to proceed with the erection of the cottage on plot 25A Drumaweer, and, as the applicant for it has emigrated to America, offer the house to Archd. McCorkell the approved applicant for the cottage proposed to be built on plot 25, Eleven Ballyboes, under the Opposed Order of 1912, and abandon the latter plot as it is so bitterly opposed, and the right to use the private roadway & well is denied.

Mr. Bonner of Messrs. James Bonner & Sons the contractors for the cottage on plot 25A, Unopposed Order of 1909, who was present, stated they would build the cottage at the contract price arranged in the tender accepted by the Council in 1909, provided they were allowed to build on the design of cottages for the 1912 Scheme.

On the motion of Councillor McFlinchey seconded by Councillor Smith, it was decided to ask the L.G. Board to permit the erection of cottage on plot 25A (Unopposed Order 1909) on the plan approved for the cottages to be erected under "The Drishowen R.D. (Opposed & Unopposed) Orders of 1912", and then to request Messrs. Bonner & Sons to proceed with the building at their Contract price of £132-19-0

Read letter from the L.G. Board dated 8th Aug. 1913, (No. L. 8801/112/1913, Inishowen R.D.) acknowledging receipt of return on form "D" in relation to the application for a further instalment of loan of £11220 granted for the purposes of the Council's Unopposed Order of 1908, asking whether the defects in the Cottages pointed out by their Architect, Mr. Robinson have all been remedied, and whether this loan might be closed by the issue of an instalment of £605.

Also letter from L.G. Board, dated 9th August, 1913, relative to the application for the balance of the loan granted for the purpose of the Council's Opposed Order of 1909 inquiring whether the issue of a further sum of £163 would enable this loan to be closed.

The Clerk stated that in preparing the returns of Expenditure + Liabilities he had set out everything he could foresee.

Ordered that the Local Govt. Board be requested to issue the final instalments of £720 + £190 under the Orders referred to, and the Council will refund any small surplus there may be after all liabilities shall have been discharged, also that all defects except a few smoke draughts have been remedied.

The resolution of Navan R.D.C. was adopted on the motion of Councillor Berd. 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Resolved that the Post Office be informed that the District Council are spending considerably more money on the section of road from Jure to Moville than it cost some years ago before the motor mail Charabanc commenced to use it. That the Council understand the vehicle carries up to 36 passengers and possibly a ton of luggage, a burden ^{which} with the weight of the car, the road was never made for or meant to carry. That this charabanc is not chiefly a conveyance for mails but for the carriage of passengers as a speculation for the benefit of the owners, Messrs. Roberts & Sons, and would require rails or tram lines to carry. That the Council are expending ^{up to} their utmost limit and cannot devote more money ~~that~~ than they are at present to the upkeep of this road and have the greatest difficulty in obtaining contractors for it, and they consider the Post Office Authorities, if they are aware of the circumstances, are treating the Council and the ordinary users of the road with the greatest unfairness in permitting a vehicle of such unwieldy proportions to be used, and there never can or will be satisfaction until the Contractors are obliged to use cars of not more than a third of the carrying capacity.

Read Letter from the Co. Surveyor (Mr. Steadman) dated 9th October 1913, stating that matters have advanced so far with the Road Board relative to the grant of £3000 for repairing the road from Carronkeel to Moville, that the change proposed by councillor McConalogue's notice of motion will only lead to trouble.

Councillor McConalogue moved pursuant to notice, also signed by seven other members - Councillor Diver seconded - That the motion adopted at the meeting of the Council on 8th Sept. 1913, viz. "That we accept the Road Board Grant of £3000 on the terms offered and agree to such a rate as will produce the required contribution of £365", be rescinded & in lieu that the following be passed: - "That we accept the Grant of £3000 on condition it be applied to the repair of the road from Moville to Carradonagh, & agree to such a rate as will produce the required contribution of £365".

Councillor Farren moved as an amendment & Councillor Philip Doherty seconded that the resolution of 8th Sept 1913 accepting the Road Board's Grant be rescinded and the following passed: - "That we accept the Grant of £3000 on condition it be applied in equal proportions to the three sections of road on the scheduled route, namely, (1) the old mail car road from Bunrana to Clonmany, (2) the road from Carradonagh to Clonmany between Carradonagh & the parish meeting at Straths, & (3) the road from Moville to Carradonagh, between Moville and Bachel, Gleneely, and We agree to such rate as will produce the required contribution of £365.

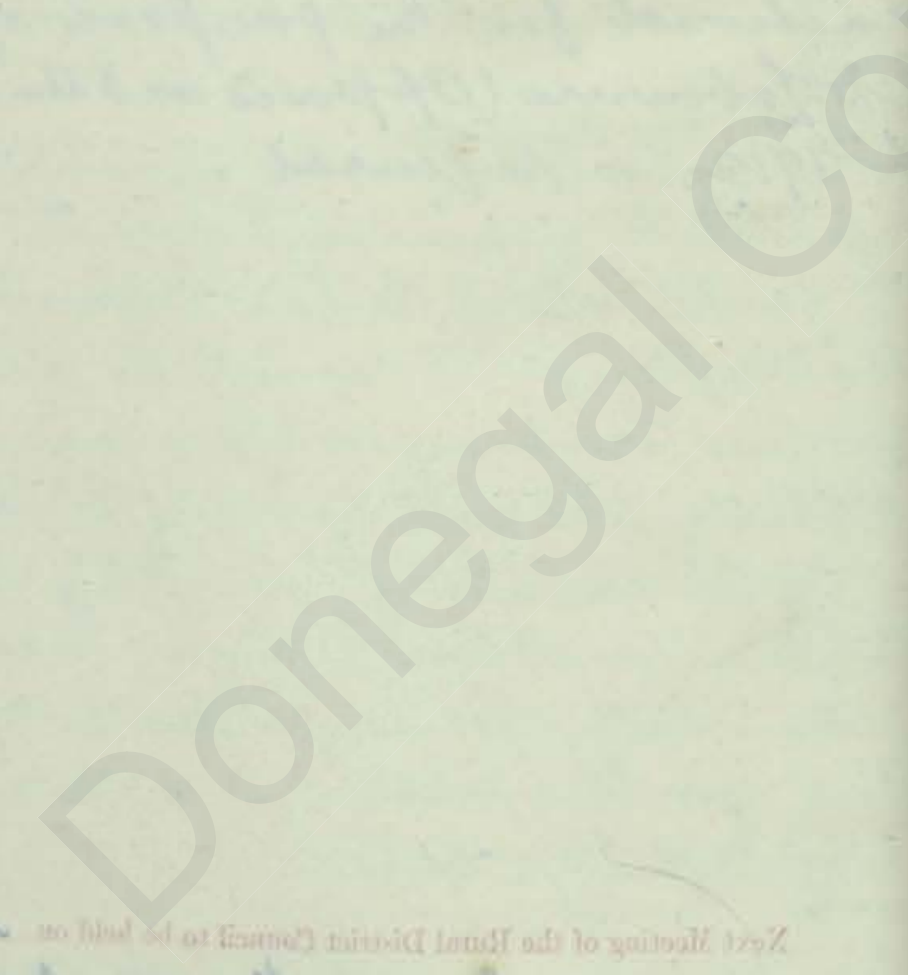

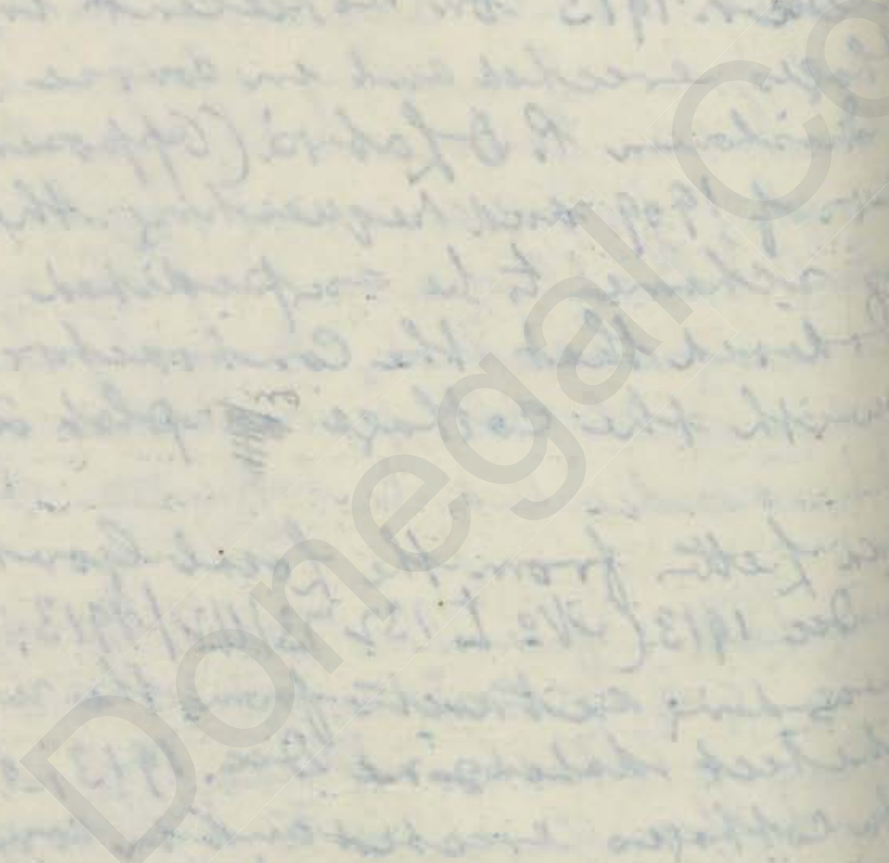

Councillor Scott drew attention to the want of protection between the plot of cottage No 89 and the mill-lead adjoining, a little girl having fallen in recently, and he moved that 5/- be allowed to the tenant to put up a short wire fence as a protection. Councillor Henry O'Doherty seconded. Passed unanimously.

On the motion of Councillor Davis, the Clerk was directed to draw Mr. Nolan's attention to the necessity for having the Magherard cottages seen to & have the chimneys repaired to create a better draught.

The Clerk reported that John Doherty of Farnmalin signed the Letting Agreement for the cottage No 91 for which ^{his wife} has hitherto been tenant.

On the motion of Councillor P. Daid seconded by Councillor E. Kearney (Mr.) this was approved and the seal of the Council affixed.

With reference to the letter of the L.G. Board, dated 23rd Dec. 1913, No. L. 14088/110/1913, The Clerk submitted the Bond entered into by Mr. Denis Doherty, Rent Collector, and his sureties.

Read intimation from the Irish Land Commission dated 15th Jan. 1914, stating that they have paid to the Council's Treasurer £750, the 4th instalment of loan of £4250 sanctioned for the purposes of "The Inishowen R.D. Labro. (Unopposed) Order, 1912".

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The proposal of Messrs. James Bonner & Sons, dated 7th Feb. 1914, to erect inside doors on the Labourers Cottages at Buncrana @ £1 per cottage was accepted. Rural Council was defined as to their liability for the maintenance of masonry fences.

Read Letters from W^m W^m Doherty, Esq. Chairman of the Sites Committee at Buncrana, and Mr. Ed. O'Callaghan, Engineer, drawing attention to the serious eyesore which will be caused to the appearance of the four Cottages erected on plot 13A, Ballymacarry, (1912 Order) by allowing a portion of the outer sidewalls of the old houses to remain as a boundary wall along the county road, stating that this wall which is built with blue clay for mortar is of defective masonry and over 3 feet out of line with the walls at both ends. An extra sum of £16 will be required for rebuilding the wall 200 ft long 4 feet high and 1 1/2 ft. broad.

A Tender was submitted from Messrs. Jas. Bonner & Sons Contractors to rebuild the wall for £16.

On the motion of Councillor Henry O'Doherty, seconded by Councillor Diver, it was decided to ask the permission of the Local Govt. Board before ordering this extra work, and also to see that the loan will be sufficient to cover this as well as all the other charges which must come out of it.
