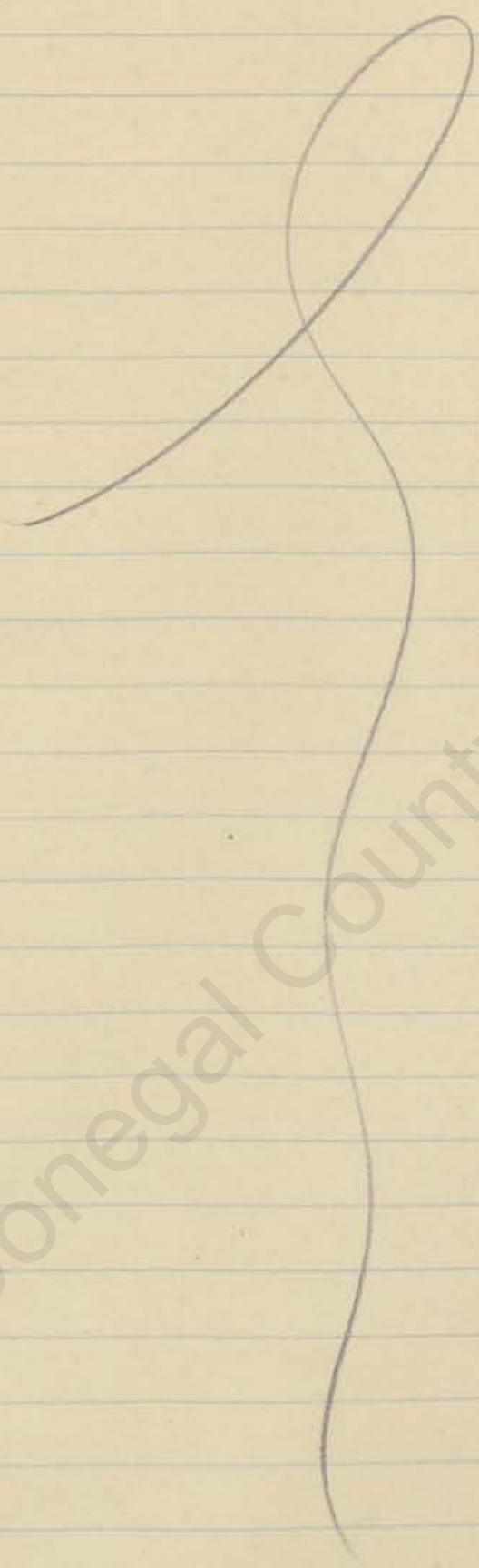

It was proposed, seconded and passed unanimously by that the Local Govt Department be requested to inform the Council whether this clause is intended to apply to new works of the class coming under the term "Boreen" or "Cut-de-sac", as if the order is to be carried out generally a large number of the roads of the District would not be under contract, and the ratepayers would suffer great inconvenience, and would not be able to get turf saved.

The Council is of opinion that all roads at present maintainable as County roads whether by continuing contracts, or by presentments periodically should be excluded from the class referred to in this paragraph as otherwise serious damage would be done to many hilly and bog roads by floods and winter rains if left without attention from contractors from time to time.

 same - The Council having considered
 the matter and made inquiries as
 residents from the district are of the
 opinion that if the wells are kept
 cleaned out regularly there should be
 an abundant supply of water in
 the village; as no person is prevented
 drawing water from the existing wells
 if they use clean vessels. The people
 who use filthy wooden Barrels to catch
 rain water should wash the Barrels
 & keep them clean, and as regards
 carrying water in Petrol Cans for sick
 children, they should use clean cans,
 unless the Petrol Cans were properly
 cleaned and used for a considerable time
 they would probably bear some trace
 of the Petrol - but when such people
 use such cans to bring water from the

lake or other water supply. They would probably use the same or similar cans even a public pump was available and the owners of the existing wells are perfectly entitled not to allow petrol tins to be dipped into their wells. Hence the reason they are obliged to go to the lake for water.

From Messrs. M. Fadden to Solicitors dated 13 May 1924. re Malicious Injuries in the Cases of Mylic & Robinson will be attended to.

 Manorcunningham - This Contractor has not
 completed his contract - and the occupier's
 wife told me she does not want a "back
 flue" - In the Engineer's opinion the
 Chimney is quite safe - He will try and
 have the flue opened & see if this would
 remove the smoke complained of.

No. 81. This Cottage repairs was let to

to J. Curran, but he did very little work to it and it is now giving trouble with smoke. Contract was let for £3. but in my opinion it would take £6-10-0 to carry out the necessary repairs now. as the grate has been removed - also chimney pot, and part of the concrete floor is broken up the entrance door requires new hinges.

I propose when permission or sanction is obtained from the Local Government Department to have flue opened up in chimney breast in this way we may be able to get rid of the smoke.

Of course the estimate of £3 is still suspended -

The Council authorised the Clerk to write to Mr. McCallaghan Engineer that it is now two years since sanction was obtained to the expenditure of certain sums to these Cottages - which have never yet been expended - and that these sums having received sanction is to be expended in the repair of said Cottages before any further recommendation is made or sanction asked from the Local Govt Department.

Cottage no 34 is reported in bad need of repair - and Mrs Hyarty ^{of the cottage} wife of Cottage no 106 appeared

before the Council to see if it is possible to get some repairs done to the Cottage the floor being very badly broken up. A member of the Council stating that the floor is in a very bad state. Mrs Heparty also stated that the house is in very bad need of painting as only once since the Cottage was built was any painting done to it several years ago as a cost of £7. The Clerk on looking up stated that £1. had been certified by the Engineer and paid inside the last two years. Mrs Heparty stated no painting was done to in within the time specified 2 years nor for several years before that.

The Clerk was directed to write to the Engineer on this matter.

Mrs Heparty was informed that a sum of £3. had been sanctioned for repairs to be carried out to this Cottage and if her husband would put in a tender and undertake the work. Semple wanted his Cottage - and had represented him as a farmer or, that he was not a farmer and was only a labouring man and had paid his rent and was occupying the Cottage which he intended to do and would not give up the Key - also that as Semple's father walked from Letterkenny to Stranorlar trying to put Cottage holders from paying rent - why should he sleep out to accommodate such a man?

The majority of the Council declined to change the tenancy, as they considered Meehan was justly entitled to retain the

Cottage and although Semple was present they would not entertain his application.

Mr H. 129/16591/1924. dated 25 August 24
 Stating that no objection will be raised to the proposed repairs to Cottage 64.

The Clerk stated he had written to the Inspectors that the approval of the L.G. Department was now received & that he aimed have the work carried out without further delay.

An application was sent in from the five tenants of Labourers Cottages in Dromore dated 9.9.24 asking to have a well sunk or a pump erected. as they had no water supply convenient.

The Clerk pointed out that there was a well on one of these plots, but that a large stone had been rolled into it and that he understood another well had been sunk close by and the tenant of the plot had it pailed round and did not allow the adjoining tenants to take water from it. He further stated that the question of pailing this well was before the Council in June 1922 - and a

letter was received from the L & Department in 1869/22 dated 9 September 1922 approving of the carrying out of the works. He also stated that he had communicated with the Engineer on 16th October 1922 to have the work carried out, but nothing had since been done.

The Council directed the Clerk to again write Mr O'Callaghan Engineer to have the work carried out without further delay.

The Clerk also reported that Cottages nos 9 & 6 and 141 were in need of repairs, as their walls were damp & doors broken.

The Council referred these cases to the Engineer for his report.

The Clerk reported that stones were thrown through the windows of cottage nos 66 & 67 and as the damage was apparently malicious for the purpose of getting the tenants to leave the Cottages he suggested the windows should be repaired by the Council.
