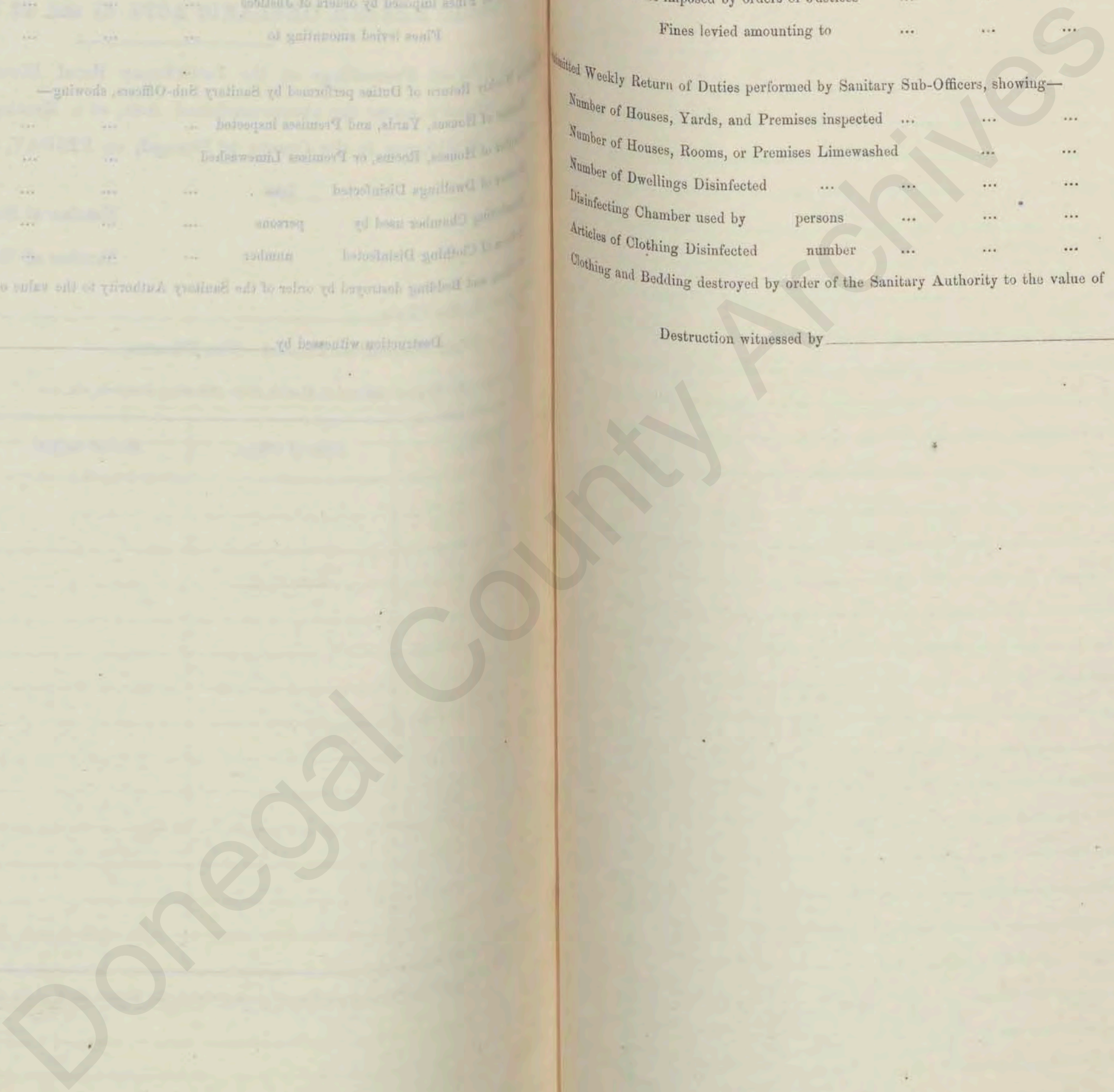

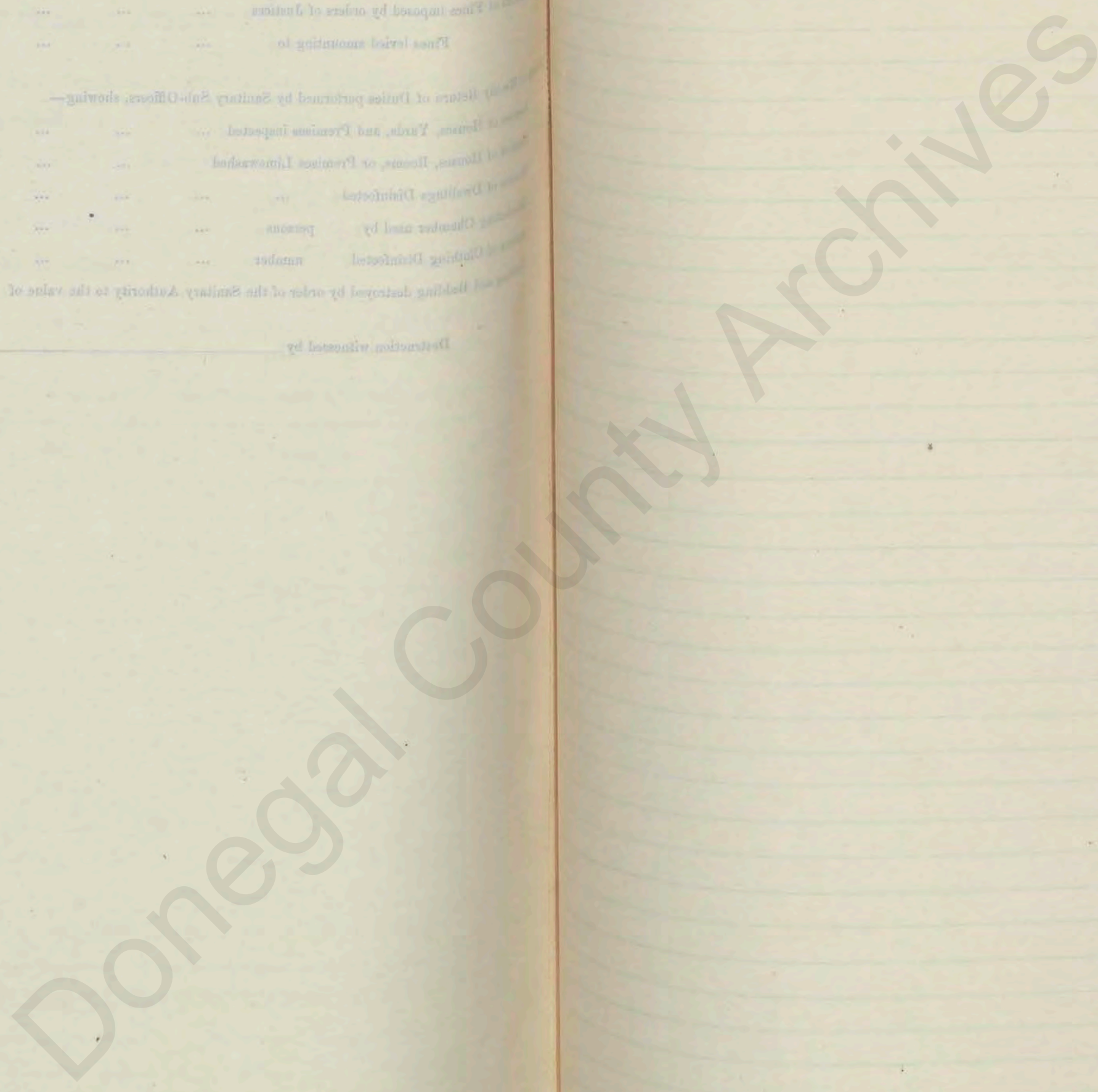

From John Mallins Esq Solicitor, Ramelton dated 27th October 1910 stating that he has been instructed by Mr John Mc Mannus of Ballaghader to apply for payment of £144 4-10 amount due to him under his Contracts with them for the building of Cottages under Schemes C, & D and stating that it appears that the Council have taken over the Cottages and they have been tenanted for nearly a year.

In consequence of the unreasonable conduct of the Engineer amount of personal friction who has been requiring unreasonable and unnecessary work to be done his client cannot obtain his Certificate. For instance quite recently on 18th inst he served a ten days notice requiring amongst other things, new concrete floors in 6 cottages and repair to concrete floors in nine besides other minor works. These requisitions of his clearly indicate personal resentment, and as the Cottages have been taken over by the Council and have pleased tenants in them it is impossible for his client now to enter them to carry out these requisitions.

As the Council have rendered it impossible for his client to act further under his contract and have not performed their part of the contract, unless the amount due is paid within one week from the date hereof, his instructions are to issue a writ.

Mr Mallins suggested that to end the matter that a competent Builder be employed to report to take into consideration the period within which the Cottages have been occupied and say what in his opinion is (if any thing) necessary and reasonable to complete the Contract, and the amount, and when his report is furnished the Council can under the terms of the Contract deduct such amount and pay the Balance to his Client -

Mr O'Sullivan Engineer sent in a report dated 3. November 1910. that since last meeting he served a 10 days notice on Mr Mc Mannus requesting him to have all defects made good, but he has taken no action in the matter save to notify the Council through

Mr. J. Gallagher proposed that Mr. W. Mannus be tendered a Paying Order for £94-10-0 in full payment of his Contracts but without prejudice to any defense the Council may have if not accepted. Seconded by Mr. J. R. Stevenson and passed unanimously.

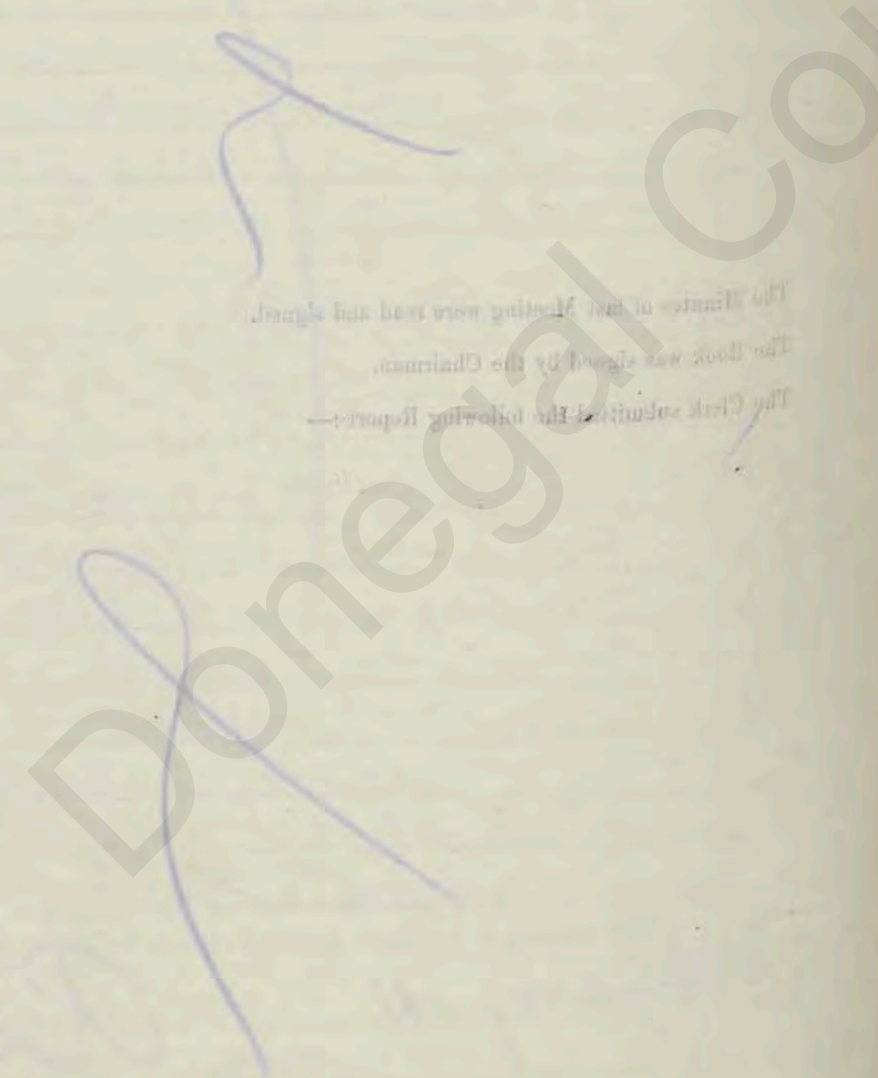
