Mr O'Callaghan Engineer asked the Council whether they wished him to make a deduction from the balance due to Mr Platt for loss of rent out of the Cottages recently completed in Ballyholly - on account of the delay in re-constructing the fence -

Mr O'Dermott proposed that in this case no deduction be made as the matter was apparently a misunderstanding between the Engineer and Contractor, seconded by Mr W. Montgomery and unanimously passed.

Mr O'Callaghan then handed in the final Certificate for Cottage (no 47. on map) which will be paid next finance day.

Mr A. Patterson applied for payment of £4. for making a drain & spout to bring water to Cottages at Brounceen and Drumashill -

Payment ordered next finance day.

No 13948. dated 16 November 1911 stating that they consider the duty of inspecting cottages damaged by the recent storm and preparing estimates and specifications for the repairs thereof is one which should not be assigned to the Clerk of the Council.

If their own Engineer is not available the Council should have no difficulty in obtaining locally the services of some other suitable person for this work without as proposed taking the clerk away from the discharge of the regular duties of his office.

And enclosing circular letter of 17 July 1893 and referring to the 3<sup>rd</sup> paragraph of same.

The Council begs to inform the Local Just Board that under the circumstances, as pointed out in previous minutes, and notwithstanding the fact which the Council recognises that they were imposing duties upon their Clerk which were taking him away from his regular duties, they consider that under all the circumstances they made the best and only arrangements possible for the speedy repairs of the Cottages which was absolutely necessary at this season of the year.

Mr. Callaghan being ill and unable to attend to the duties, and Mr. McIntyre and Mr. Dawson were both busily engaged in the districts for which they are Engineers with damages by same storm - The Council had every confidence that their Clerk would do anything



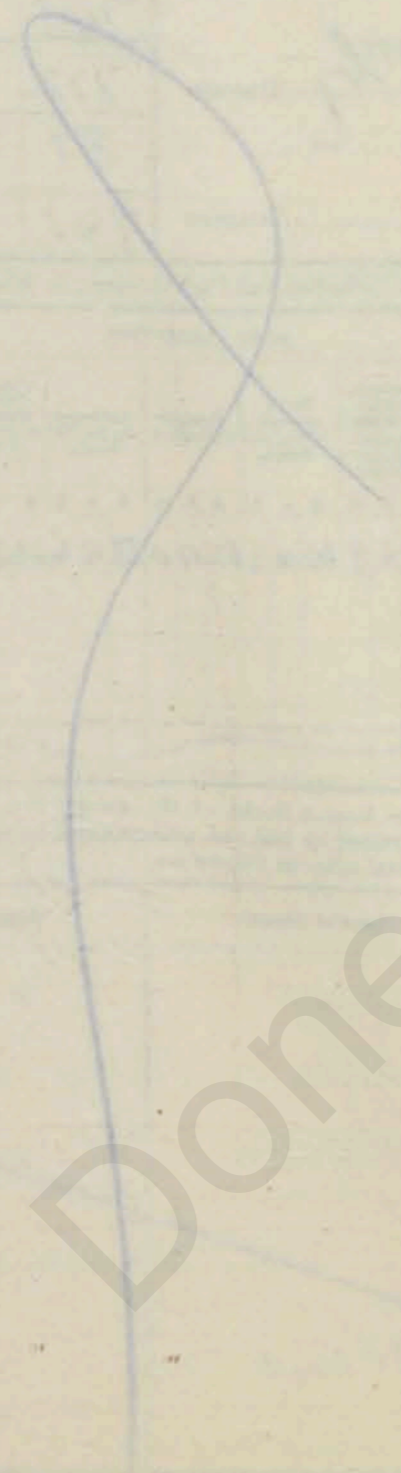
