Rural District will form with Stranorlar Rural District by operation of law, one single Rural District from that date. The Clerk was directed to keep the accounts of no. 2. separate as far as possible.

Letter no. 25485. date 3rd February 1921 from Dublin Castle stating that the sum of £191⁴/₁ is being deducted from sums normally payable to the County Council from the Local Taxation (Ireland) Account.

A letter was read from Margaret Boyle of Magherabeg asking the Council to change the her name in the rent book to her son, as she wanted him to retain the cottage in his own name. *Munice* :- The name to be changed on the 1st April next.

The Clerk was directed to solicit another quotation from Robert M^{rs}. Cahen Stranorlar for a new pump in Killygordon, as the Council consider his former quotation of £47¹⁰/₆ exorbitant, and M^{rs}. Cahen to repair the old pump.

The balance now to credit of the Council being insufficient to meet further payments it was decided not to issue any paying orders.

It was proposed by Mr Bower seconded by Mr. Mc Ghee that the cottage be given to James Mc Ghee, An amendment by Messrs Hannigan, and Mc. Gluchey that the key be held by Mrs. Quinn. The voting being equal no action was taken Mr. Kelly did not vote.

Hugh Mc. Garvey appeared before the board requesting that slates be put on his cottage minute: - adjourned for one month.

Daniel Mc. Tully informed the Council that a gully-trap was removed from Mc. Ginty's cottage in Cappoy and was now in his house in Ballyhoey minute: - Mc. Ginty to be called upon to leave back the gully-trap in the cottage he formerly held in Cappoy.

The Clerk reported that the military authorities visited the Boardroom and carried away the minute Book of the Council, together with documents relating to Sair Eweamni.

"That we the Members of Stranorlar Rural District Council having heard that it is the intention of the Irish Government to close the Post Office and Telegraph Office in Stranorlar do hereby register our respectful protest against their doings.

Stranorlar Post Office is one of the oldest in the County Linc. aill; at one time it was the distributing centre

for the whole County of Tipperary. In Stranorlar the Principal office of the County Donegal Railways is situate; ~~it~~ in it are all the Churches of every denomination and the residences of all the Clergy. It also contains the Central Home and offices of Rural District Council, Customs & Excise, a Monthly fair and Flax Market is also held in Stranorlar. We are in favour of economy in all the Public services; but not isolated acts of economy at a too disproportionate sacrifice of the Public good. We are not aware that any local body called for the closing of this Office; nor that any local authority individual or public was consulted. If economies are called for in the Post Office let the needs and necessities of the different parts of the whole county be considered and it can then be considered what services can be dispensed with, without an undue diminution of proper public services.

Ordered that copies of the above Resolution be forwarded to the Postmaster General, and T. D's for Tipperary and the press.

- (6) Before any drastic change is made, we submit that, in
