It was decided to adjourn the meeting for a month and to have a special meeting during the month and to do no business that this meeting except the financial business and the following:

Letter from the L.R. & S. Ry Co. requesting permission to open the Road or Victoria Bridge in order to lay the water pipes direct to the station as at present it crosses the road and the bridge.

It was decided to grant permission subject to them carrying out the works to the satisfaction of the Town Surveyor and to indemnify the Council against damages of all kinds during the excavation and to make good the concrete again if on the bridge if it was necessary to break same.

And that the Town Surveyor see that all the work be properly done and all made good to his satisfaction.

A Memorial was presented to the Council by seven persons requesting the Council to cut the pier at the approach to the pier as at present it is very steep for horses.

Catching herring and coal from the pier and stating that they would ^{contribute} by giving less labour of horses and carts free.

The Council were of the opinion that owing to the near approach of the herring fishing it would not be advisable to interfere with the road a present but decided to leave the matter in the hands of the Town Surveyor.

Letter No was read from the Chief Secretary dated the
29th November 1920 No 24325 stating that the sum of
£10.6.3 from the Local Taxation (Ireland) Account
is now available for payment to the Council and
requested the Council for a definite reply to their (H
Rasas Justices) letter of the 4 August 1920 which letter
stated that payment from the Local Taxation (Ireland)
Account will be withheld until a definite assurance is
received from the Council that they will submit their
accounts to Local Government Board Audit as hereto-
fore and that they will conform to the rules and
Orders of the Board.

The Clerk was directed to take all necessary steps
to obtain the Grant due to the Council from the Local

Taxation (Ireland) Account which means to conform to the rules and regulation of the Local Government Board as heretofore and the Rate Collector was instructed to proceed with the collection of the second moiety of Rates and lodge same with the Treasurer the Belfast Banking Company and arrangements were made for the lodgment of the first moiety of Rates so much of same as was collected

Letter from the Local Government Board No 168/M/1920 dated the 26 November 1920 forwarding copy of a letter which they have addressed to each Poor Rate Collector in Ireland which letter stated that in Counties the County Council have passed resolutions suspending Rate Collectors and directing them to give up their books in consequence of their carrying out the suggestion contained in the Board circular letter of the 11th Nov that where there is no legally appointed Treasurer the safest course for a collector to adopt is to open a separate account in a Bank in his own name and lodge there all rates collected.

The Rate Collector was directed to proceed with the collection of Rates and to lodge all Rates with the Treasurer the Belfast Banking Company.

Letter from the Local Government Board No 730 1921 dated the 11th January 1921 stating that the Turf (Maximum Prices) (Ireland) Order 1918 was revoked by the Chief Secretary on the 3rd inst. The Local Authorities (Ireland) Turf Order made by the Board on the 4th November 1918 has accordingly ceased to have effect as from that date

From the Local Government Board No 63449, dated the 17 Dec 1920 forwarding abstract of accounts of the Donegal Joint Technical Instruction Committee for the financial periods ended the 31 Dec 1919, 30 Sept 1920 & 30 Sept 1920

Now that the present Acts on the Statute Book Co Derry are no longer held the rich lands of County Donegal under the name of Derry No 2. as taken in the early Forties of the last century by the then landlord Government - We the Buncrana Urban Council enter our most solemn protest against that portion of County Donegal known as East Inishowen going to any other Union than the Union of Inishowen from which it was originally separated - We mean the following Electoral Divisions Bust "Tahan" "Upper Inch" Kilderry "Three Trees" and Birdsstown comprising a valuation of £19 6s 4d, the other three Electoral Divisions of Derry NO 2 viz Newtown Cunningham Castleward and Killas with a valuation of £15 16s 8d we do not claim and are satisfied that they be attached to Letterkenny Union But the other six Electoral Divisions above named which forms almost half the ancient Barony of Inishowen we most urgently claim for our Union from which they have been originally taken

Letter from the Donegal County Council dated the 31 Dec 1920 requesting the payment of instalments due on the amount of Demand of the Urban District for the year ending 31 Dec 1921 £1 was decided to make the necessary payment at the next meeting of the Council

Letter from Miss Ann Doherty requesting the Council to erect an Electric Lamp on the road leading to her house as in the Winter time this place is very dark.

No Action

The Town Surveyor reported that during the past Quarter the roads have been kept in fair Order. The street which are wearing into pot holes requires cleaning and recommended the purchase of 200 tons of metal for this purpose.

The Surveyor was instructed to order 100 tons of stones from Mr. Wm. Hogan at the price quoted by him for delivery at the places required.

It was decided to appoint a Financial Committee on which all the members of the Council were to act, the Financial Committee meeting to be held on the day of the meetings at 6 o'clock P.M.

The Rent Collector was instructed to proceed with the collection of the Rent of the Cottages at 1/- per week and have all the arrears due collected and lodged to the credit of the Council as soon as possible.

Letter from the Ministry of Labour forwarding forms for the classification of Roads etc.

The forms were referred to the Town Surveyor to classify the roads within the area.

From the Unemployment Grants Committee dated the 1st February 1921 stating that they have now been authorized to grant up to 60 per cent of the wages bill on work approved of by the Committee.

No action at present

From the Donegal County Council dated the 27 October 1920 forwarding copy of Agreement between them and Mr. Thomas Swan for erection of electric wires and poles within the Area.

It was decided that a Committee be appointed to go into the agreement with a view to see if the Council could increase the rent paid by Mr. Swan being one shilling per year for the erection of poles and wires. The following were appointed on the Committee.

From the Electric Supply Company stating that with regard to their Contract for lighting the streets for one year from the 1st October 1920 being increased from £12 to £125 that if the Council thinks £125 is more than they would be justified in spending they would arrange to cut out some of the lamps &c.

It was decided to offer the sum of £120 for lighting the town for one year and to pay the quarters instalment due on the 1st January 1921 at that rate viz £30

Letter from Miss A. H. Munro Secretary Donegal District Nursing Society requesting the Council for the Annual Contribution of the sum of £25 in respect of the Maternity and Child Welfare scheme as carried out by the District Nursing Society.

It was decided to have same filled up on receipt of the Board's approval of the Council contribution of £25 for the Maternity and Child Welfare scheme

The Medical Officer of Health reported that the sewer from Mr. Thomas Swan's house is defective, allowing sewage or material to flow on the public path and recommended that repairs be effected immediately.

Ordered that notice be served and seven days allowed to carry out the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health.

Letter from Thomas Swan & Co. stating that as one of their fire plugs have been broken by a collision with a H.D. Storkerry they wish to put in a new one and requested permission to make the necessary connection with water main.

Permit granted

Letter from Mr. P. Boyle Bandonport requiring how much the Council would accept for the two engines that was used for pumping water.

It was decided to request him to make an offer.

The Record of work performed by the Sanitary Cut Officers from the 1st to the 31st January 1921 was submitted and showed 15 premises had been visited and inspected.

of the Urban District Council of Buncrana for the year
ended the 31st March 1921 and I enclose two copies of
the abstract of accounts and Clerk's statement duly
certified. The rates levied for the service of the year
ending the 31st March 1921 were at the following rates
in the pound.

The amount of the collectors warrants were
Town Rate 1436. 4. 9 Poor Rate 1589. 4. 9

These included 98. 14. 8 brought forward from the previous Collector's Account being rates on property taken over by the English Government

The Government refused to pay the rate on the application of the Clerk alleging that the owners were liable and the owners refusing to pay stating that the Government were liable.

The Collector took up his warrant on the 1st Sept 1920. The conditions of his appointment were that he should have lodged half the amount of his warrants on the 30th Sept and the other half on the 31st March of each year. The Council reckoned the time for lodging the first moneys to 1st Nov 1920 and the second moneys to 30th April 1921. On account of the abnormal times and the late date at which the collection started the Collector failed to lodge half the warrants on 1st Nov his lodgements to that date amounting to 544. 13. 2 in respect of Town Rate and £614. 4. 10 in respect of Poor Rate. Notwithstanding this the Collector was paid poundage at the rate of 8^o in the pound on £1000 in Dec 1920.

The Collector's lodgments to the 31st March 1921 amounted to - Town Rate 1206. 18. 1 Poor Rate 1329. 2. 3

Total £2536. 0. 4

His lodgments for April amounted to 146. 10. 10 making his total lodgments in respect of warrants £2682. 11. 2

The Total Amount of warrants were 3025. 6. 6

" Lodgments 2682. 11. 2

Leaving outstanding 342. 15. 4

None of this amount has been lodged since

but irrecoverable arrears and the arrears brought forward into new collection were passed by Council amounting to 146. 0. 3 The Collector was paid on the 3rd May poundage at the rate of 8^o in £1 on 1682. 11. 2 amounting £56. 18 None of these poundages were sanctioned.

Fines for Town Court and Petty Sessions Court could not be checked as the books had been burned in the Court House fire. The Clerk assured me that all the fines recoverable under these heads were put to the credit of the Council.

The General rental for Artizans Dwellings had not been written up for the year. It had been taken in a raid and returned in such a bad condition that it could not be written up. I ordered the Clerk to get a new one immediately and have it written up. The Collector keeps no collection book but issues receipts for rents received and submitted the receipt books to the Clerk for checking once a month. The large arrears due by tenants were the result of an attempt by the Council to increase the rents, when a strike against the rents took place. Things are again going smoothly as the Council have decided to collect the rents at the old rate.

A sum of £2. 10 o recoverable from the English Govt on account of expenditure on Child Welfare scheme was funded within the year.

A trustee was appointed for a part of the year and all sums received by him were accounted for.

The Expenditure which was in order was fully vouch'd.

Owing to the large amount of rates outstanding it was decided to ask the Rate Collector to attend monthly Meeting and ask him for an explanation

On the Rate Collector attending he stated he was not able to prepared to make and statement that night.

There are doubtless special difficulties with respect to these matters, but the Government consider they can reply upon such a manner and interest and united effort on the part of Local Authorities and all others concerned as will enable those difficulties to be overcome.

The Government are prepared to give State aid which they consider ample on the following lines.

In each case where a special Housing rate of at least 1/- in £1 is struck for the purpose of new construction

and arrangements are made subject to the sanction of the Minister to obtain from local banks or other sources, a short period loan equal to three times the produce of the aforesaid rate the Government will be prepared to make a grant in the proportion of 2.5% to the total amount raised locally by Housing rate and loan. Provision for meeting the loan charges must be made in addition to the special Housing rate of 1/- and such charges will not rank for the Government subsidy etc etc.
