Minutes of Proceedings of Bundoran Urban District Council at its monthly meeting held on 1st day of July 1918.

The chairman Thomas Gorman Esq. J.P. (Jr) presided  
Councillors present were:— messrs John Carty Vice-chairman; J. M. Judge; Jno. Doherty (Owen); Peter Clancy; and Patrick Mehan.

The minutes of previous meetings were adopted.

The correspondence read and the orders made or resolutions passed thereon were as follow:—

From Local Government Board, no. 26,695/1918 dated 7th June 1918, relative to surcharge of £1-17-6 made by Auditor at last Audit.

Best informed Council that an appeal had been lodged - Approved.

From Local Government Board no. 2600 J:1918 dated 11th June 1918, forwarding copies of Auditor's Report and Abstract of Accounts of Council.

These were submitted to meeting.

From L.G.B. Circular 79 M. 1918 dated 21/6/18 relative to Plans of Buildings and Horses (rationing) Order. - Approved.

From L.G.B. no. 28,095/1918, dated 27/6/18 relative to milk supply for infants and mothers.

Council considered that milk supply in the District was ample.

From L.G.B. no. 25,543/1918, miscellaneous dated 27th June 1918 on the subject of pig keeping. Letter noted.

From Director of Cross Channel Transportation dated 14th June 1918, relative to coal consumption

Clerk informed Council that he supplied the particulars required. approved

From Board of Trade stating that the pit price of Coal had been raised by 2s. 6d. per ton.

From Buildings material supply Committee dated 29<sup>th</sup> May 1918 requesting information as to the probable quantity of Building materials which will be required by Council.

Clerk stated that the required information had been supplied. Approved.

From Valuation Office dated 28<sup>th</sup> June 1918, no. 11544, acknowledging receipt of lists of Tenements requiring revision.

From Great Northern Railway requesting that the roadway at their Lodgekeeper's house has been metalled and requesting Council to take it over.

Proposed by Thos. Gorman Esq J.P. (Junior)

Seconded by Councillor Carty and resolved

"That the portion of roadway leading to the Great Northern Hotel, recently metalled and rolled by the Great Northern Railway Company be included in the Bundoran Urban District roads, and in future be maintained at the expense of the Urban District"

From Messrs John Myles and Co Ballyshannon dated 29<sup>th</sup> June 1918, tender proposing to light the Town of Bundoran, from 10<sup>th</sup> August 1918 to 10<sup>th</sup> April 1919 for the sum of £100.

"After much discussion on the tender, Mr Meehan proposed and Mr Carty seconded and it was resolved that the Chairman and Clerk meet Messrs Myles and arrange the cost of lighting"

The Chairman advocated serious action against persons retailing milk, who have not complied with the Order. The Council agreed.

Applications from John Mullin, John Gilbride and Thos. Gorman J.P. (Junior) for Petroleum Licences - Granted.

Application from Peter Meehan, scavenger, dated 1<sup>st</sup> July 1918, for an increase in wages.

Proposed by Councillor John Judge

Seconded by Councillor John Carty and

unanimously resolved; -

"That subject to the sanction of the Local Government Board, we hereby grant a War Bonus of Seven shillings per week, as an addition to the wages of Peter Meehan, Scavenger, the first payment to be made on 5<sup>th</sup> July 1918."

Council directed Clerk to have notice to Quit served on Patrick Daly, Tenant of (Labourers' Cottage no. 5) Artizans' Dwelling no. 5

The accounts showed that no lodgments of Poor Rate or Town Rates for the current year had been made.

Clerk was directed to communicate with the Rate Collector, and urge him to proceed at once with the Collection.

Councillor Judge brought under the notice of the Council the disabilities under which

In the Chair, Thomas Gorman Esq. M.P. (Junior)

Clerk reported that no tenders had been received for carrying out the public works advertised.

Town Surveyor stated that Contractors will not tender owing to the uncertainty of getting

Others present were:- Councillors Joseph Cusack; Patrick Meehan; James Carroll; John Conlan; Peter Charney.

The meeting was called for the purpose of expressing sympathy with the relatives and brothers in religion, of the late Rev. Brother Salvator, of the Presentation Order, who lost his life in heroically rescuing from drowning a visitor at Bundoran.

The Chairman referred in melancholy terms

to the sad accident, and said that the deepest sympathy of the Council would go out to the friends and relatives of the deceased.

Proposed by Councillor Pat<sup>l</sup> Meehan  
Seconded by Councillor John Conlan, J.P. and passed in silence:-

"That we the Bundoran Urban District Council beg to place on record, our sincere sorrow at the sad death of Rev. Brother Salvator O'Ballaghan, of the Presentation Order of Christian Brothers, who lost his life after gallantly rescuing from drowning, a bath at Bundoran on 18<sup>th</sup> July 1918, and we hereby tender our deepest sympathy to his relatives, and to the Community of which he was a distinguished member."

The meeting decided to request the Beach Guard to appear, and give an explanation of the occurrence to the Council, and adjourned to the 22<sup>nd</sup> July 1918 at 9 o'clock pm for that purpose.

Copies of resolution were ordered to be forwarded to the Superior of the Presentation Order and to the relatives of deceased.

The meeting was summoned to allow John Cassidy an opportunity of explaining his absence from duty on 18th July, 1918.

Cassidy stated that he removed the Bathing appliances and left the beach before the time stated in his agreement, as the tide was at its lowest and there had been no bathing for two hours before he left.

Councillor Kelly advocated that hours should be fixed for bathing.

Council fixed from 7 am to 8 pm as suitable

Councillor Judge suggested that rope be tied at ladder and fastened to a hook inserted in rock. Agreed.

It was decided that Beach Guard wear a cap with band, displaying the words "Beach Guard"

The Beach Guard Cassidy refused to wear cap, and tendered his resignation which was accepted.

It was decided to advertise for a Beach Guard at 35/- per week.

Councillor Conlan pointed out that aquatic sports or carnivals could be arranged and collections made, and the proceeds applied to the upkeep of Life Saving Apparatus etc.

He offered to provide a cup for competition or to subscribe £5 towards this object.

The meeting then adjourned to 24th July. Half yearly meeting adjourned to 6th August 1918.

Meeting called for purpose of appointing a Beach Guard in room of John Cassidy who voluntarily resigned.

The Clerk read notice requesting applications for position of Beach Guard.

An application—the only one received—from Patrick Doherty was read.

Clerk stated he read the duties and conditions of appointment for the applicant who appeared before Council, and said he thoroughly understood the contents of the document.

Proposed by Councillor Carroll seconded by Councillor Barty and carried:—

"That we the Bundoran Urban District Council hereby appoint Patrick Doherty as Beach Guard and caretaker of Council Property for the remainder of the season 1918, on the conditions as read."  
Councillor Kelly proposed, Councillor Blancy seconded and it was passed unanimously.

"That we the members of the Bundoran Urban District Council, beg to bring to the notice of the Royal Humane Society the gallant action of the late Rev. Brother Laurence Salvator O'Malley, of the Presentation Order

Letterkenny County Donegal, and Mrs. Maguire of Clones, County Monaghan, who saved the life of Mr. Louis Wintinsky of 47 Lower Bennet Street Derry from drowning at Bundoran County Donegal on 18<sup>th</sup> July, 1918. - Brother Salvator losing his life on the occasion; and we respectfully ask the Society to suitably recognise the heroic act."

It was ordered that a cap with the words "Beach Guard" be provided and that notices containing directions to Bathers be conspicuously displayed at the Beach.

Gentlemen,

I beg to submit the following Report for the Half Year ended 30<sup>th</sup> September, 1918.

Roads.

All the roads in Bundoran Urban District, except those under unexpired contracts, have been maintained by direct labour, owing to tenders not having been received for works recommended at last Half Yearly meeting.

An Order, dated 11<sup>th</sup> January, 1918, declaring what roads in the County Donegal shall be main Roads was made by the Local Government Board, and the Schedule attached to the Order, sets out a distance of Two miles and Fifty two perches of main Road as included within the Urban District of Bundoran.

The Bundoran Urban Council have accepted the terms of the Draft Agreement submitted by the Donegal County Council for the work of maintenance of main Road in the Urban Area.

The other two Urban Councils in the County Donegal have not so far agreed to the terms of the Draft referred to, and are prepared to consider some modifications in the conditions set forth, in conjunction with representatives of Bundoran Council, so as to arrange if possible that the terms of the agreement be common to all the Urban Councils.

If you decide to fall in with the views of Buncrana and Letterkenny Councils, it will be necessary to rescind the resolution adopting the Draft Agreement passed by you.

The amounts expended on Road maintenance within the Half Year are as follow:-

The road under unexpired Contract, leading from Bundoran to Garrison, within the Urban District has not been kept in a satisfactory condition. I pointed this out to the County Surveyor. It is still bad.

**Footpaths.** - The flagged footpaths and crossings to gateways are in many places in a bad state of repair, but owing to the high price of material being, very little if any improvement can be effected for some time.

The drains too require attention.

**Water Supply.** - Under normal conditions, the water supply is sufficient, but after the long period of drought which occurred during the year, both pressure and quantity were considerably reduced.

The great increase in the number of visitors during the Summer Season caused exceptional requirements to be met, so that in a few instances, the water during certain hours of the day did not reach the highest levels in two or three houses.

Notices with a view to prevent waste were issued with good effect and the minimum of inconvenience was caused.

It will be necessary to remove a large deposit of gravel washed down by the heavy rains, which has accumulated at the Intake.

**Sewers** The main Sewer and Septic Tank were

regularly attended to, and worked satisfactorily during the Tourist Season.

**Artizans Dwellings** - The roofs, chimneys and ceilings of many of the Artizans' Dwellings require repair and I would suggest that this matter be considered at your next monthly meeting.

The following are my recommendations:-

No. 16 - To keep in repair for 1 year and 3 months, commencing 1<sup>st</sup> January, 1919, and ending 31<sup>st</sup> March 1920, about 320 perches of Main Road from Bundoran to Sligo, between cross roads at Mr. John Doherty's and Danwill gate with 250 tons of 2 inch broken stone of approved quality - 50 tons to be supplied during the first 3 months and 200 tons during the year ending 31<sup>st</sup> March 1920, according to Town Surveyors Special Specification. Total cost not to exceed £87.10.

No. 17. To keep in repair for 1 year and 3 months commencing 1<sup>st</sup> January, 1919, and ending 31<sup>st</sup> March, 1920, about 240 perches of Main Road between Mr. John Doherty's, and new Road to the sea at Finner, with 190 tons 2 inch broken stones of approved quality - 50 tons to be supplied during the first 3 months and 140 tons during the year ending 31<sup>st</sup> March 1920, according to Town Surveyor's Special Specification - Total cost not to exceed £62.10.

No. 18 - To keep in repair for 1 year and three months commencing 1<sup>st</sup> January, 1919, and ending 31<sup>st</sup> March 1920, about 132 perches of road leading to Ardara, between cross roads at Bundoran Rectory and Urban Boundary, East, with 70

two 2 inch broken stone of approved quality - 30 (thirty) tons to be supplied during the first 3 months and 40 (forty) 100 tons during the year ending 31<sup>st</sup> March, 1920 according to Town Surveyor's Special Specification Total cost not to exceed £48. £17.10 (Seventeen pds ten shp)

No. 19 - To keep in repair for 1 year and 3 months commencing 1<sup>st</sup> January, 1919, and ending 31<sup>st</sup> March 1920, about 176 perches of the road leading to Kilmoyr between main Road at Bundoran and Urban Boundary with 150 tons 2 inch broken stone of approved quality - 50 tons to be supplied during the first three months and 100 tons during the year ending 31<sup>st</sup> March 1920, according to Town Surveyor's Special Specification - Total cost not to exceed £48. 6/4 1/2 per ton

No. 20 - To keep in repair all the roads in the Urban District, by direct labour, until contracts are entered into for maintenance.
