To the Chairman and members of Bundoran Urban District Council.

Gentlemen,

In accordance with the Urban (Transferred) Business Procedure Order, 1906, I beg to submit the following Report for the Half Year ended the 30th Sep 1919.

Roads.

All the roads in the Urban District with the exception of about 60 perches of the branch road leading from the Garrison Road near the Railway Bridge to Ardara are in a fairly satisfactory state of repair.

Numerous "pot holes" are however beginning to form and I have directed the Contractor to attend to the filling of these.

Of the 440 tons of broken stone required to be provided for main road maintenance only 320 tons have as yet been supplied by the Contractor leaving 120 tons to be found.

The Contractor, as you are aware, has applied

A large quantity of drift sand has accumulated near the sea front on the District Road in Drumacree and to prevent this in future, I would suggest that part of the stream now flowing on the strand be diverted so that as large a portion as possible of the beach be kept in a damp state above low water mark.

Footpaths and } The remarks regarding Footpaths and Crossings
Crossings } to Gateways embodied in my previous reports still hold good.

Water Supply. The Waterworks Intake has been attended to carefully, and it is satisfactory to note that though the past Half Year has been one of the driest on record, and the supply, having been

the greatest ever required for the Town, owing to the exceptionally large numbers of patrons to this sea-side resort, no shortage was experienced though subjected to such an unusual strain.

Owing to the subsidence of the bed of part of the water main at Kerlough, a leakage occurred but this was repaired without inconvenience to the users.

The main was washed out regularly at the East End of the town

Sewers: - The Sewerage System worked satisfactorily and gave practically no trouble. A covering flag to the opening of one of the chambers of the Septic Tank has been broken and a new one is required.

Again I have to point out that Public Conveniences are very much needed.

Cleaning Satisfactory scavenging has been done on the streets, but in the absence of a watering cart good results cannot be obtained.

In spite of notices to the contrary some persons still persist in dumping rubbish on the sea front. Strong measures should be taken to prevent the fouling of the beach in future.

Working Class Houses. } The roofs chimneys and ceilings of many of the Working Class Houses are still in need of repair and I would suggest that this matter be dealt with at your next monthly meeting.

The following are my recommendations: -

No. 20. To keep in repair for 3 years commencing the 1st April, 1920, and ending 31st March 1923 about 332 lineal perches of Main Road, from Bundoran to Sligo, between Bundoran Bridge and Danville

gate with 200 tons of two inch broken stones of approved quality, to be supplied annually, according to Town Surveyors Special Specification. Cost not to exceed £80 yearly - Total £240

No. 21. To keep in repair for 3 years commencing 1st April 1920, and ending 31st March 1923, about 284 perches of Main Road, between Bundoran Bridge and Urban Boundary in Finnee, with 170 tons 2 inch broken stones of approved quality, to be supplied annually according to Town Surveyors Special Specification. Cost not to exceed £68 yearly. Total £204.

No. 22. To keep in repair for 3 years commencing 1st April 1920, and ending 31st March 1923 about 176 lineal perches of the Road leading to Kerlough between main Road at Finnee Church, Bundoran, and Urban Boundary with 100 tons two inch broken stones of approved quality, to be supplied annually according to Town Surveyors Special Specification. Cost not to exceed £40 yearly. Total £120.

No. 23. To keep in repair for 3 years commencing 1st April 1920, and ending 31st March 1923 about 184 lineal perches of Road leading from main Road in Magheenan to Urban Boundary at Ross with 50 tons 2 inch broken stones of approved quality, to be supplied annually according to Town Surveyors Specification. Cost not to exceed £12-10 yearly. Total £37.10

No. 24. To keep in repair for 3 years commencing 1st April 1920 and ending 31st March 1923, about 132 lineal perches of road leading to Ardara between cross roads at Bectory and Urban Boundary East, with 40 tons broken stones of approved

quality to be supplied annually according to Town Surveyor's Special Specification. Cost not to exceed £10 yearly. Total £30.

no. 25. To make about fifteen lined paths & flagged footpath between end of flagged footpath at Michl. Lorman's and right of way at James Kearns Drum-arin according to Town Surveyor's Specification cost not to exceed £60.

no. 26. To keep in repair the remaining roads in the District for 1 year by direct labour.

My Estimate for maintaining the Public works in the District, for the ensuing Financial Year ending 31st March 1921 (one) is set forth hereunder:-

The provision of a quarry from which to obtain a supply of suitable road stone is a matter that requires consideration as also the rate of wages to be paid to employees.

Protection wall Town Surveyor to furnish estimate of cost per perch for wall rising three feet above road level.

Councillor Kelly proposed: That tenders be invited for works included in the applications adopted and that Clerk be instructed to have notice to Contractors printed and published"

This was seconded by the Chairman and passed.

New valve The Town Surveyor was ordered to have a new valve put on water main in Magheracar to serve the purpose of washing out main.

A letter (no date) from Thomas McShea, Main Road

Contractor, adjourned from meeting of 6th Nov 1919 was read stating that the cost of labour is great at present from 8/- to 12/6 per day, asking Council to either grant him a bonus or a reduction in the tonnage as £198. the amount of the contracts would not nearly meet his expenses.

Clerk stated that he communicated with the Local Government Board on the subject as directed.

At this stage of the proceedings Mr J. M. Shea, the Contractor appeared, and handed in a statement showing that his expenditure in respect of his contracts on main Road amounted to over £205.

The Council deferred further consideration of the matter to the adjourned Half yearly meeting.

The adjourned meeting was fixed to be held on 11th December, 1919 at 7 o'clock pm and proceedings terminated.

I beg to submit the following Report for the Half year ended 31st March, 1920

Roads:- The main Roads in the Urban District excepting a portion in Magheracarr may be said to be in a fair state of repair.

Contract no. 16 has been completed.

Contract no. 17 dated 20th December, 1918 on the application of the Contractor and with the consent of the Council was terminated by Agreement, dated the 27th February 1920

Of the 150 tons of metal to be provided 110 tons have been rolled on District Road (Contract no. 18) leading from Bundoran to Kinelongh leaving forty tons still to be applied.

These forty tons are now ready for application and will be spread when the Road Roller can be obtained.

about 70 tons of metal are broken for main Road (Contract no. 20) but cannot be applied till Road Roller is available.

No metal has been applied to District Road (Contract no. 19) leading to Ardara the work of hedging and draining having been done

Many parts of this road are in need of repair which must be carried out by direct labour.

For year ended 31st March, 1920, the total sums paid in respect of upkeep of Roads were:-

Foot Paths and Crossings. The Footpaths in many places need repairs, and I would suggest that, if flags cannot be obtained at a moderate cost, defective parts be replaced with Concrete

The crossings from main Road at most of the gateways are uneven and unsightly, and I think that as most of the connections are now completed with the main sewer under these crossings, attention might be paid to them.

Water Supply. The Intake will need attention, and a large quantity of gravel deposited there will require removal.

A joint in the main supply pipe near the Intake is leaking somewhat.

It will be caulked as soon as the pressure is reduced

Sewers. The main sewer gave no trouble practically

but many drains from premises connected with it got blocked.

The Solicitor is taking steps to find out whether the Council is liable to clear some of these drains, and his opinion will be submitted to the Council in due course.

A very heavy sea washed away a large block of concrete at the end of the storm overflow at septic tank, and tumbled part of a retaining wall opposite Bay view Terrace.

Seaweeding:- The struts have been carefully attended to and kept in good order and condition.

Some steps ought to be taken to prevent the deposition of offensive matter near the Bridge one of the most prominent places of the Sea front.
