- 62.1 Cllr. Gallagher & Cllr. McGarvey referred to concerns expressed by Dungloe residents in relation to Action 4C in the draft regeneration strategy.
 Both welcomed the omission of Action 4C from the final document/masterplan subsequent to consultation with elected members.
- 62.2 On the proposal of Cllr. McGarvey, seconded by Cllr. Gallagher, the Glenties MD Committee requested DCC to liaise with the NRA/TII in relation to providing a cycle/walkway from Crolly to Dore Crossroads along the N56 in the interest of Health & Safety.

64.1 Members discussed reports circulated with the agenda regarding:

- 64.2 Cllr. O'Fearraigh highlighted road safety issues in respect of parking at Errigal and also requested further information on the 38 projects in Donegal approved by Pobal.
- 64.3 Cllr. Gallagher welcomed the commencement of works at Dungloe playground for children with disabilities.

64.4	Cllr. Gallagher requested a meeting with staff working on the Letterkenny
	Burtonport greenway to discuss the establishment of links to smaller towns
	and villages.

- 64.5 Cllr. McClafferty expressed concern at the unavailability of binbags and the consequential negative impact on the environment.
- 64.6 Cllr. McGarvey and Cllr. Gallagher recommended the provision of social centres and library enhancements to improve facilities for Ukrainian Refugees. Cllr. McClafferty recommended that the Department of Education employ Ukrainian teachers to overcome language barriers.
- 64.7 Cllr. Molloy requested the Council to expedite delivery of the Bonnie Glen Project and installation of a counter unit at Glenmacannive.
 Cllr. McGarvey welcomed the provision of funding in the sum of €30k for the access to Kincasslagh Tower trail.
 Cllr. Gallagher requested implementation of a plan to develop Leitir Green & the Roads Manager advised that design work is in progress.

GMD 66/22 PLANNING

66.1 The Committee noted the report circulated with the Agenda in relation to:

- 66.2 The Committee welcomed the launch of a regeneration strategy and action plan for Dungloe Town Centre setting out a road map for the town to 2040 and beyond. Cllr. Gallagher requested the recruitment of dedicated staff and asked that the Director of Planning revert to Members with a definitive start date for this project.
- 66.3 Cllr. McGarvey commended the official opening on the 22nd July of the Arranmore Island Shorefront Development. In relation to redevelopment of Burtonport Harbour Cllr. Gallagher requested inclusion of a safe area for the local youth.

66.4 Wind Energy

The Committee expressed concern regarding a recent Notice of Intention to Issue a Direction by the Minister of Local Government & Planning pursuant to the Council decision to adopt a variation to the County Development Plan 2018 - 2024 (as varied in respect of a Wind Energy Policy Framework.

Cllr. McClafferty suggested an agreement to submit a joint response from the Glenties MD prior to the public consultation deadline of the 22nd September.

GMD 67/22 ENVIRONMENT

67.1 <u>Waste & Litter Management</u>

The Committee noted the reports from the Waste Awareness Officer circulated with the Agenda as follows:

- Summer Green Peace 2022 advertorial
- Holidaying in Donegal Summer Campaign
- Household Waste Management Survey
- Paint reuse pilot project
- Refill.ie Water provision at Irish Legends event

The Committee unanimously commended the contribution of the litter warden and environment staff in their efforts to address illegal dumping throughout the MD.

Cllr. McClafferty requested the role out of a system of surveillance cameras within the parameters of data protection legislation.

Cllr. Ó Fearriagh highlighted the necessity for adequate recycling facilities in Gweedore and Falcarragh and expressed disappointment that illegal dumping has recommenced at Ardsbeg.

Cllr. McGarvey informed the Committee that the Lettermacaward Community are content to locate the bottle bank facility in proximity to the graveyard on completion of necessary road upgrade.

67.2 <u>Sewage Treatment</u>

Cllr. Ó Fearriagh requested the reintroduction of the septic tank registration scheme.

Cllr. McClafferty stated that holding tanks are not emptied regularly and that treatment plants in Falcarragh and Dunfanaghy are not fit for purpose.

Cllr. Gallagher informed the Committee of a recent incident of waste disposal from a camper van at Carrickfinn Crossroads and requested the Council to:

- 1. Initiate a pilot project to facilitate waste water disposal in proximity to treatment plants.
- 2. Develop an application to map suitable locations for waste water disposal.

67.3 <u>Boiled Water Notice</u>

In response to concerns expressed by the Committee regarding Leitirmacaward Public Water Supply Boiled Water Notice, the Environment Director advised of ongoing works to resolve problematic issues within the next fortnight. Cllr. McClafferty criticised the lack of feedback from Irish Water in relation to Members representations and the Director of Environment undertook to liaise with Irish Water in this regard.

67.4 <u>Coastal Management</u>

Members welcomed the report previously circulated regarding The Big Beach Clean 2022 during the period from the 16th - 18th September. Cllr. McGarvey requested the replacement of Ring Buoys at Mullaghderg Beach and Trá Bháid, Carrickfinn.

Cllr. Molloy requested the Council to expedite the repair of the boardwalk in Maghera.

67.5 <u>Public Building Renewable Energy Scheme</u>

In response to a query from Cllr. Gallagher regarding the above scheme, the Environment Director informed the Committee of the availability of funding in this regard.

GMD 68/22 ROADS AND TRANSPORTATION

68.1 <u>Roadworks Programme 2022</u>

The Roads Manager informed Members of the current status of the roadworks programme and, also the Island Roads Works Programme.

68.2 <u>Clady/Bunbeg Footbridge</u>

The Committee welcomed the report from the Roads Manager regarding the status of the above project.

68.3 Fintown Project

Members welcomed the imminent appointment of a contractor for this project.

The low-cost accident element of the works has been identified as a priority and is included in Phase 1 of the delivery programme i.e. Q4 2022 with Village Surface works envisaged for Spring 2023.

Cllr. Ó Fearraigh requested the Council to liaise with residents at Fintown junction regarding the extent of proposed works.

68.4 <u>National Roads Office</u>

The Committee noted the report previously circulated and presented by the Roads Manager. The Roads Manager informed members that it is anticipated that funding will be provided by the TII to repair link roads used extensively during the N56 Dungloe to Cloughwally project.

68.5 <u>Additional Allocations</u>

The Roads Manager updated members in relation to recently received additional allocations for the LIS Programme and Ardara footpath infill.

68.6 <u>Pollinator Biodiversity Allocation</u>

The Committee welcomed the report circulated with the Agenda and commended the contribution of the Roads Manager to the success of the programme.

68.7 <u>Piers & Harbours</u>

Cllr. McGarvey requested (i) an update on the status of proposals for development of Magheraroarty and Arranmore pier areas and (ii) an inventory of Council ownerd Piers and Harbours in Donegal.

68.8 <u>Takeover of Non-County Roads</u>

The Roads Manager responded to Cllr. McClafferty's query regarding the proposed takeover of non -county roads in the Municipal District.

68.9 <u>Road Closures</u>

The Roads Manager advised the Committee of proposed road closures on the R261 and at Lough Finn.

68.10 Speed Limit Review

The Roads Manager advised that a date will be scheduled for a workshop to review speed limits followed by a later drop- in time for the public.

68.11 <u>Road Maintenance</u>

Cllr. Ó Fearraigh requested a river cleaning scheme in the Meenacladdy area to prevent flooding.

Cllr. Ó Fearraigh also requested hedge cutting in the Poisoned Glen.

Cllr. McGarvey advised the Roads Service of flooding at Cloughwally and the necessity to repair a fence on the Diamond Road, Dungloe.

GMD 70/22 Creeslough Tragedy

Cllr Mac Giolla Easbuig commended Cllr. McClafferty and Senior Management for their availability & involvement with the community in Creeslough in the aftermath of the recent tragedy. A minute's silence was observed by all attendees.

GMD 71/22 Draft Budgetary Plan for Glenties Municipal District 2023

The Head of Finance informed the Committee of the following:

- The Local Government Reform Act 2014 and associated regulations require the allocation of a General Municipal Allocation (GMA) as part of the annual revenue budget process.
- It is proposed to allocate an amount equivalent to €20,000 per Member to the General Municipal

Allocation which is discretionary funding to be allocated under the Strategic Development Fund. The final and conclusive decision will be made as part of the plenary budget meeting in November 2022.

- The Budget process is extremely challenging considering the inflationary environment with increasing pay and energy costs.
- Members were advised of Central Government allocations to assist with recent pay awards.

GMD 72/22 Recommendation

On the proposal of Cllr. McClafferty, seconded by Cllr McGarvey, the Municipal District Committee of Glenties in line with the requirements of the Local Government Reform Act 2014 and associated regulations, adopted the Draft Budgetary Plan and General Municipal Allocation in the sum of $\in 120,000$ at this time.

Cllr Mac Giolla Easbuig expressed opposition to the draft Budgetary Plan and highlighted the following issues for consideration in the formulation of the Plenary Budget.

- Increasing cost of living
- Increasing Property Taxes
- Requirement for additional staffing resources
- Lack of housing maintenance budget
- Increasing privatisation of local authority services

Cllr. Mac Giolla Easbuig's proposal to reject the Draft Budgetary Plan and the General Municipal Allocation was not supported.

This involves working closely with local business or inward investment opportunities to provide suitable property solutions including Council owned land or property as well as opportunities for acquisition.
	Donegal – Irelands DNA – Clothing Range: To drive further visibility of the Donegal Place Brand, a partnership has been agreed with O'Neills Sportwear to develop a range of Donegal branded clothing.
	The range launched in early August and is available for sale through three sports retail outlets in Donegal; McElhinneys of Ballybofey, All Sports Donegal Town, and Michael Murphy Sports, Letterkenny. Currently design options for an Irish language range are being explored.

Donegal/ Derry Tourism Autumn Campaign in United Kingdom

Donegal County Council has been working in partnership with, Fáilte Ireland, Visit Derry, Tourism NI, and Derry City and Strabane District Council on a £500,000 campaign to promote Donegal and Derry to the British Market.

This campaign has been developed as a consequence of the "The Great Britain Strategy for Growth" which identified the need to create 'hub experiences' with compelling reasons to venture beyond Belfast and Dublin which provide reassurance that there are lots of things to see and do, within a two-hour timeframe, in a particular area for a short break – at any time of year.

The campaign is named – 'Derry-Londonderry & Donegal - two unique places, one amazing holiday'.

The campaign will run over nine-weeks and commenced on the 23rd September, 2022 and is anticipated to reach 6.8 million people.

The Campaign includes:

- New campaign landing page on Ireland.com with links out to 3 x combined itineraries & short break suggestions in Donegal and Derry
- Tourism offers promoted on Ireland.com
- Out of Home advertising in key locations such as busy roadside locations in London, Birmingham, Liverpool, Manchester, Glasgow and Edinburgh
- Digital outdoor ads in London's Waterloo station
- Co-operative promotions with Ryanair and Loganair, running on a mix of radio, digital channels, social media and broadcast video. Activity will highlight attractive fares on direct flights to City of Derry Airport from Manchester (with Ryanair) and from Edinburgh, Glasgow and Liverpool (with Loganair). Promotions with easyJet will highlight flights from 13 UK airports to Belfast.
- A partnership with TripAdvisor including ads running on TripAdvisor and on other social channels. Activity will target TripAdvisor users who have previously visited the island of Ireland or users researching short breaks and competitor destinations.
- A partnership with Travelzoo sharing content about Donegal and Derry, as well as special offers from local tourism operators, being promoted to the Travelzoo database of 1.35 million subscribers.
- A partnership with Wanderlust (popular travel magazine) which will reach 1.8 million avid travellers most likely to venture off-the-beaten track and come and visit the North-West. This event will be held in collaboration with Donegal ETB.
IFI Funding Application Successful
The Strategic Funding Unit team has been working with Donegal Sports Partnership on the EU funded URBACT project around active play in public spaces to promote health and well-being. Donegal Sports Partnership has successfully applied for funding under the International Fund for Ireland to deliver an innovative cross-border project to promote reconciliation through active community play initiatives. Over €115k has been awarded to DSP for this project, which will include three pilot areas, Donegal Town, Letterkenny and Derry City. This will be led by DSP.



1.0 RURAL REGENERATION AND DEVELOPMENT FUND (RRDF)

1.1 EXISTING APPROVED CATEGORY 2 RRDF PROJECTS (2020)

1.1.1 Back to Ballyshannon – A transformational project to re-energise, re-imagine and sustain the social, cultural, historical, physical and economic fabric of Ballyshannon's historic town centre.
 Value: £247 500 (RRDE funding approved £185 625)

Value: €247,500. (RRDF funding approved €185,625)

Update: The Team continues to work towards (i) progressing an acquisition interest in Ballyshannon Town Centre, and (ii) the publication of a planning scheme, so as to develop this project as a shovel ready capital project targeted for future Category 1 RRDF funding.

Members were provided with a detailed progress update on the draft project plans at workshop on 27th September 2022.

As agreed the Regeneration & Development Team then opened a period of public consultation on the draft plans for the project on Tuesday 25th October 2022 with a drop-in event in St Anne's Hall, Ballyshannon from 3-8pm. The event was very well attended on the night. Draft plans remain available for viewing at <u>www.donegalcoco.ie/services/planning/regenerationprojects</u> and submission can be made until 4:30pm on Tuesday 8th November 2022.

1.1.2 Ramelton Historic Town Centre – A Restorative & Transformational Public Realm Scheme. Value: €249,159 (RRDF funding approved €186,869)

Update: A Part 8 planning scheme for this project was published on Tuesday 1st February 2022 and a Chief Executives Report on the proposed development was brought before the Elected Members at a Plenary Meeting of the Council on Wednesday 6th April, 2022 and it was decided to proceed with the development as proposed.



The Regeneration and Development Team subsequently completed the submission of a Category 1 capital funding application to the Rural Regeneration and Development Fund for the capital delivery of this project by the 12noon deadline on Friday 29th April, 2022. The submitted project has a total project value of \in 7,949,868 and remains under assessment. Meanwhile, work continues to advance on the Detailed Design of Project together with preparation of a completed Tender Package, which is scheduled for completion this year.

1.2 THIRD CALL FOR CATEGORY 1 PROJECTS (SHOVEL READY) UNDER THE RURAL REGENERATION & DEVELOPMENT FUND (RRDF)

1.2.1. Ballybofey & Stranorlar - The 'SEED' project – A sustainable, green regeneration project to

Strengthen, Engage, Enable and Deliver transformational change in Ballybofey-Stranorlar.

Value: €9,756,969.

This project has now been formally handed over to the Capital Projects Delivery Unit who will begin reporting in due course.

1.2.2. Burtonport (Harbour to Island) Regeneration Value: €2.3m

This project has now been formally handed over to the Capital Project Delivery Unit (CPDU) who

will begin reporting in due course.

1.2.3. Carndonagh Tús Nua Regeneration Project Value: €9,542,852

This project has now been formally handed over to the Capital Project Delivery Unit (CPDU) who

will begin reporting in due course.

1.3 THIRD CALL FOR CATEGORY 2 PROJECTS UNDER THE RURAL REGENERATION & DEVELOPMENT FUND (RRDF)

On 6th January 2022 the Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys announced that €1.17m had been awarded under the Third Call for Category 2 Projects of the RRDF for the "Repowering Buncrana" regeneration Project.

Due diligence has been completed on this project and a formal letter of Offer together with an associated Funding Agreement was received on 10th May 2022. The Funding Agreement was subsequently accepted and formally returned to the Department on 18th May 2022. The project will now progress to procurement of the



required consultancy services before commencement of the planning and statutory consents stages of this project enabled by the funding award. A successful public information event in respect of this project was held in the Inishowen Gateway Hotel, Buncrana on Monday 23rd May, 2022.

1.4 FOURTH CALL FOR CATEGORY 1 PROJECTS (SHOVEL READY) UNDER THE RURAL REGENERATION & DEVELOPMENT FUND (RRDF)

On 17th December 2021 the Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys TD announced the fourth call for Category 1 applications to the €1 Billion Rural Regeneration and Development Fund (RRDF).

The closing date for the receipt of proposals was 12 noon on Friday 29th April 2022.

As described at Point 1.2.2. above the Ramelton Re-Imagined regeneration project, with a value of €7,949,868 was submitted under this call and is now under assessment.

1.5 REGENERATION STRATEGIES & PROJECT DEVELOPMENT WORK

The Regeneration & Development Team had undertaken with Members to progress Regeneration Strategies in a number of Tier 2 Strategic Towns as a part of our work programme. This work has been progressing through in house resources and capacities together with consultancy services. An update on this area of the work programme is provided hereinunder:

1.5.2 Ballybofey-Stranorlar Regeneration Strategy & Action Plan

The Ballybofey-Stranorlar Regeneration Strategy was endorsed by the Committee of BASICC, as project partners, on 7th February 2022 and subsequently endorsed by the Stranorlar-Lifford MD on 25th May 2022. The Strategy was launched 27th May 2022 by means of press release and is currently being circulated across Donegal County Council Directorates and to key stakeholders. The Strategy is available at <u>Donegal County Council</u> (donegalcoco.ie)

1.5.3 Ballyshannon Regeneration Strategy & Action Plan

The Ballyshannon Town Centre Regeneration Strategy & Action Plan was formally published, launched and circulated to Members on the 20th April 2022. The Strategy & Action Plan, and associated Town Centre Masterplan, is available to view/download online at <u>www.donegalcoco.ie</u> and at Council offices. The Strategy was commissioned and funded by Donegal County Council and its delivery was led by GM Design Associates with the support and input of the Council's Regeneration and Development Team.



1.5.4 An Clochán Liath (Dungloe) Regeneration Strategy & Action Plan

The An Clochán Liath (Dungloe) Regeneration Strategy & Action Plan was formally published, launched and circulated to Members in September 2022. The Strategy & Action Plan, and associated Town Centre Masterplan, is available to view/download online at <u>www.donegalcoco.ie</u> and at Council offices. The Strategy was commissioned and funded by Donegal County Council and its delivery was led by GM Design Associates with the support and input of the Council's Regeneration and Development Team.

1.6. Rathmullan RRDF Project Development work

Work to complete the Draft Design & Design Report for this project is advancing, and targeted stakeholder group consultations took place in December 2021. This primarily included key internal Council services, external statutory bodies and a cross-section of community interests in Rathmullan identified by 'The Way Forward' group. A presentation on the Draft Design Report for this project was made to the Elected Members at a scheduled workshop on 2nd June 2022 in advance of an informal public consultation event which took place later the same day from 3pm to 8pm in the St. Vincent de Paul Centre, Rathmullan.

Work is now continuing towards publication of a statutory planning scheme for the Project in November of 2022.

1.7. Milford Town Centre First Plan

In late 2021 the Department of Rural and Community Development sought nominations for towns to be considered as part of the 1st Phase of the Town Centre Masterplan Initiative. Minister Heather Humphries TD subsequently announced that Milford was successful in securing \notin 100,000 under the call. The Regeneration & Development Team is now leading on the delivery of a Town Centre First Masterplan for the Town. Work has commenced to agree the collaborative delivery arrangements services requirements and to progress to tender stage for consultancy services. It is anticipated that the successful consultancy service(s) will be appointed, and the project will be formally launched, before year end with a scheduled completion date of mid-2023.

2.0 URBAN REGENERATION AND DEVELOPMENT FUND (URDF)

2.1 Existing approved URDF project in Letterkenny (application submitted 2018; final approval to proceed received September 2019)



This first application secured $\in 1.9$ m in URDF monies, match funded by $\in 600,000$ for three sub-projects, the detail and progress of which is set out below:

(i) Preparation of a Regeneration Strategy for Letterkenny Town Centre.

The process to prepare the Letterkenny 2040 Regeneration Strategy is now almost complete with arrangements being made for its official launch on Monday 5th December 2022 in the Radisson Hotel commencing at 10am.

The official launch of the Letterkenny 2040 Regeneration Strategy on 5th December will also be followed by a wider drop-in style public consultation from 2pm-8pm to communicate the ambition of the project to the wider public. The Team is also working with other Council services to seek participation in the drop-in event and to make available information on other ongoing initiatives/ programmes related to Letterkenny.

(ii) Acquisition of key town centre regeneration site.

Public notice of confirmation of the Donegal County Council (Letterkenny Strategic Urban Regeneration Site) CPO 2021 was published on Tuesday 25th October 2022 in the Donegal Peoples Press/Donegal Democrat. The CPO will become operative 3 weeks later. This will also commence the 8 week period for judicial review, after which the Notices to Treat and then Enter will be served, if there is no judicial review challenge.

Subject to expiry of the above legislative timeframes without challenge, it is expected to enable Donegal County Council to take possession of the lands and enable the delivery of Phase 1 (Alpha/Beta) of the Strategic Urban Regeneration Site which was approved Part 8 planning consent at the Special Council meeting on 24th February 2022.

Phase 1 development of the site is being progressed by the Capital Projects Delivery Unit (CPDU) to its next stage of detailed design with input from the Regeneration and Development Team in relation to tender evaluation. Please refer to MD reporting of the CPDU for all further and onward updates in this regard.

Alongside advancement of Phase 1 above and in collaboration with Housing, options are being explored as regards the business model for the residential component of the Concept Masterplan relating to the remainder of the strategic site (Phase 2). Further updates will be brought to the Letterkenny-Milford MD in this regard as this work develops.

(iii) Public realm in the area of the Public Services Centre and Joe Bonnar Rd



This project is now fully handed over to the Capital Project Delivery Unit (CPDU). Please see MD Reporting of CPDU for current status and all onward updates.

2.2 Successful application to the Urban Regeneration & Development Fund (May 2020)

On Friday 12th March 2021 Minister for Housing, Local Government and Heritage, Darragh O'Brien TD announced that a provisional allocation of \in 13.6m has been awarded under the URDF application Letterkenny 2040 (Phase 1) 'Re-energise and Connect the Historic Town Centre' supported by match funding committed by the Council in the sum of \in 4.5m.

Specifically this new investment will help to advance five projects to varying stages of as follows:

- The further enhancement of the Cathedral Quarter
- The re-purposing of the Courthouse
- Strategic land assembly towards:
 - Regeneration of Lower Main Street
 - Advancement of a Regional Transport Hub
 - Enhancement of 'LK Green Connect,' walking, cycling and parkland infrastructure.

The project continues to progress through funding approval steps required under the Public Spending Code. In this regard, a Preliminary Business Case (PBC) was submitted to DHLGH in March 2022 and for review and approval. This was followed by submission of Detailed Project Brief and Procurement Strategy on 29th July 2022.

The current status of the project is that the Preliminary Business Case secured approval of DHLGH on 11th August 2022. This represents approval under Decision Gate 1 in the project life cycle and 'approval in principle to Donegal County Council to proceed to Design, Planning & Procurement Strategy.'

As outlined, a **Detailed Project Brief and Procurement Strategy has already been submitted to DHLGH on 29th July 2022 and is therefore actively under review and consideration by DHLGH**. This remains the case as at last update received from DHLGH on 20th October 2022.

Approval of Detailed Project Brief and Procurement Strategy will lead to approval to proceed to tendering inclusive of satisfactory completion of the Final Business Case and thereafter each project will advance at varying paces dependent on nature, scale and complexity.





Alongside the above activity, a number of steps are being taken to develop each sub-project further. The table below sets out this activity.

	In addition, it is targeted to progress a Part 8 proposed development using in-house resources in respect of LK Green Connect walking and cycling infrastructure to link Phase 1 (currently under construction) to Pearse Road and therefore to secure Phase 2 to shovel ready status. The timeline for Part 8 is yet to be confirmed and is subject to availability of staff resources across both URDF and RRDF programmes. The preferred scenario is to commence this in-house design work before year end.

	Engagement with landowners has commenced as regards land acquisition interests necessary for the Cultural Corridor section of LK Green Connect and as supported under URDF and will be further advanced with greater certainty following Part 8 publication and following receipt of pre-tender approval by DHLGH.

2.3 Future URDF call for applications

Although there is no confirmed date available for a 3rd call for URDF applications, an announcement is anticipated as early as Q1 2023 and following an ongoing review of funding commitments/ project costs currently being undertaken by DHLGH. Consideration is being given to the options in this regard including the further sequencing of investment to deliver on the ambition set out in the Letterkenny 2040 Regeneration Strategy particularly in relation to the advancement of a Regional Transport Hub, associated accessibility infrastructure and capital projects at Lower Main Street. It is proposed to scope the options with Members of Letterkenny-Milford MD as part of a future MD workshop.

2.4 'The Eat Out' Outdoor Dining Infrastructure Project, Letterkenny

A proposed Part 8 development as regards 'The Eat Out' Outdoor Dining Infrastructure project was published on 15th September 2022 for a period of statutory consultation. Submissions may be made by 4.30pm on Tuesday 1st November 2022. Thereafter a Chief Executives Report will be prepared and submitted for consideration at the scheduled Plenary Council meeting on 28th



November 2022. Arrangements are being made for a MD workshop in advance of the plenary meeting.

In addition, and in collaboration with Community Development, options are being explored to progress the next stage of Detailed Design to deliver the project on site.

2.5 Other

The Regeneration and Development Team continue to engage in other regeneration related work areas and support other sections of Donegal County Council as required and across a number of other activities.

•	There are 74 GWS's which have submitted takeover requests to Donegal County Council. This is two more since the update in February 2022. The number of GWS's that have requested takeover amounts approximately 20% of the overall total of GWS's within the county. Although this figure appears low there are a large number of orphan GWS's where the promoter or trustees are no longer active. Donegal County Council is represented on a working group examining issues in relation to the taking in charge of orphan GWS's. Donegal County Council has commenced a pilot process which provides an alternative pathway for these orphan schemes to be taken over. The promoters or trustees of any group water scheme that wishes to be considered for takeover should do so by writing to the Rural Water Liaison Officer, Donegal County Council, County House, Lifford or by emailing <u>ruralwater@donegalcoco.ie</u> . Criteria for GWS's to be Eligible for Takeover In order for GWS's to be eligible for takeover they must comply with technical, legal and financial requirements set down in circular letter WSP01 16. The takeover of a GWS is potentially a lengthy process in that all aspects of the GWS must be examined so as to ensure that they satisfy the standards set out by Irish Water.

	within scheme were ic conduc mentio All 158 set out	The desk study of all 1,104 GWS's within the county was utilised to identify all orphan schemes within the county. 295 GWS were classified as orphan through this process. These 295 schemes were investigated further to identify GWS's with less than 10 connections. 158 GWS's were identified after this review. A detailed analysis of each scheme is currently being conducted to establish if these schemes meet additional parameters set out by Irish Water as mentioned above. All 158 schemes have been reviewed and 37 schemes have been deemed to meet the criteria set out by the programme. These 37 schemes will be checked on site to confirm if conditions match the desk study.						
	DCC were only one of two Local Authorities that met the target of submitting 10 Orphan Schemes to IW. On this basis, DCC were granted a further 10 Orphan Scheme that could be submitted under this pilot programme. Thus far, 12 schemes as listed below have been submitted to Irish Water and confirmed as taken over. A further four schemes have been submitted to IW for review. We have commenced the takeover application process for a further 13 schemes using the criteria of this programme. The final 3 schemes required to meet our target of 20 schemes are in progress and should be complete in the coming months. The remaining schemes that have commenced are in preparation for our next allocation after we achieve our current target.
