On the proposal of Cllr. Gallagher, seconded by Cllr. Molly, the Minutes of the Municipal District Committee Meeting held on the 9^{th} May 2023 were confirmed.

GMD 38/23 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

38.1 Workshop

Members were advised that a Rural Programme Workshop will be held in Dungloe PSC at 10 a.m. on 21st July 2023.

38.2 ORIS Funding Scheme 2023

The Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme provides funding for the development of new outdoor infrastructure in rural areas and an invitation to submit expressions of interest is open until 26^{th} July 2023.

38.3 Community Development Reports

The Committee welcomed the Reports circulated with the Agenda regarding the following:

Cllr, Mac Giolla Easbuig requested an update on the status of:

Cllr. Molloy requested an update on the following:

Cllr. McGarvey congratulated the Dungloe Tidy Town Committee on the quality of works undertaken on Dungloe Main Street. She also congratulated the SULT Committee on the success of that event in Gweedore and extended her best wishes to the Maghery, Burtonport and Dungloe Festival Committees.

GMD 39/23 PLANNING

39.2 Rural regeneration and Development Fund

The Committee welcomed ongoing work to prepare a draft village plan and regeneration project for the Creeslough Community.

Cllr. Gallagher requested the Director to highlight this issue at SMT level and Cllr. Mac Giolla Easbuig requested the attendance of the Planning Director at the next Municipal District Meeting to respond to Members concerns in this regard.

39.3 <u>Burtonport Redevelopment Scheme - Phase 2</u>

In response to a query from Cllr. McGarvey regarding the current status of this project, the Area Planner undertook to revert to the Capital Projects Delivery Unit for an up to date report.

39.4 <u>Development Levey Waiver Scheme</u>

Cllr. McGarvey requested further information from the Planning Service in respect of the above recent announcement.

39.5 N56 Restrictions

The Committee queried if there have been any further developments regarding development proposals along the N56.

39.6 County Development Plan

Cllr. Gallagher requested clarification on the outcome of issues highlighted by the Glenties Municipal District Committee at meetings pertaining to the County Development Plan.

39.7 <u>Defective Block Scheme</u>

The Area Planner informed Members that a briefing note is being prepared for Members by Eunan Quinn.

GMD 40/23 <u>ENVIRONMENT</u>

40.1 <u>Environmental Reports</u>

The Senior Executive Engineer discussed the Reports circulated with the Agenda in relation to the following projects:

- Waste and Litter Management
- Food Waste Recycling Week
- Half Price Bulky Goods Events

The Senior Executive Engineer further updated Members regarding the status and process involved in preparation of a Climate Action Plan.

40.2 <u>National Waste Management Plan</u>

Cllr. Gallagher referred to the statutory consultation phase for the National Waste Management Plan for a circular economy and highlighted the exorbitant costs of disposal of incontinence pads and nappies.

The Director undertook to liaise with relevant stakeholders (Nursing homes, Medical staff) prior to discussion at SPC level and will investigate options for a local pilot scheme that will comply with National Guidelines.

The Director also informed the Committee of a Deposit Return Scheme that is planned to go live in February 2024 to boost the recycling rate for plastic bottles and cans.

Cllr. McGarvey congratulated the recent recipients of Green School Awards.

Cllr. Molloy requested the council to expedite the provision of illegal dumping warning signage.

40.3 Boardwalks

Cllr. Mac Giolla Easbuig queried the status of the proposed audit of existing boardwalk infrastructure and also requested an update in respect of Maghery Boardwalk. The Director commended the role of the Council's Disability Officer, Trudi O'Reilly in the resolution of Dooey Boardwalk issues.

40.4 Public Conveniences

Cllr. Mac Giolla Easbuig commended the active involvement of John McCarron, SEE in attempts to progress toilet facilities. Ha also stressed the importance of implementing a maintenance policy for the upkeep of public conveniences.

Cllr. Molloy requested Port-a-loo provision at tourist attractions in the county to encourage return of tourists. Cllr. Mac Giolla Easbuig recommended that Paul Dawson be invited to an MD Meeting to make a presentation regarding work involved in the Changing Places toilet initiative.

40.5 Water Services

The Director informed the Committee of the recent singing of a Master Co-operation Agreement between the Council and Uisce Éireann. Members were also advised of recent meetings with Water Services staff and the options open to staff to remain with the Council.

Cllr. Mac Giolla Easbuig criticized (1) the lack of respect for his native language in the course of his interactions with Uisce Éireann and (2) number and frequency of waterpipe bursts throughout the MD and lack of long-term plans to resolve these issues.

GMD 41/23 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

41.1 Minor Tourism related Works - Grant Scheme Workshop

On the proposal of Cllr. Gallagher seconded by Cllr. Mac Giolla Easbuig, the Committee approved the distribution of funding in the sum of $\leq 100,00$ as agreed at Workshop held on 20^{th} June 2023.

Cllr. Molloy requested that notification issue promptly to the successful applicants.

41.2 Monthly Reports

The Committee welcomed the Reports circulated with the Agenda and presented by the SSO regarding the following services:

- Economic Development Unit
- Tourism Marketing Unit
- Strategic Funding Unit
- Information Systems
- Emergency Services

The SSO advised Members that the focus of the 2023 Remote Working Holiday Campaign is on promoting the wide network of digital hubs across the County as well as showcasing the unique offering Donegal has for a worklife balance.

Cllr. Molloy requested the provision of additional digital hubs south of the Gweebarra and expressed disappointment that poor quality broadband has resulted in a loss of clients at the Áislann Centre in Kilcar.

Cllr. Mac Gilla Easbuig requested an urgent response regarding issues that he has consistently raised at previous meetings as follows:

- Status of Campervan consultation recommendations
- Aire de Service costs of usage
- Tourism Workshop relating to social and economic impact of the industry
- Fire Service on the Islands
- Live streaming of the MD Meetings

41.3 <u>Irish Diaspora Awards</u>

The SSO informed the Committee that the Tip O'Neill 2023 Awards Ceremony will take place on the 16^{th} September 2023 at the Inishowen Gateway Hotel.

41.4 Local Enterprise Office

Cllr. Gallagher commended the role and remit of LEO and stated that further positive communications regarding assistance is required so that the wider public is fully informed of extensive assistance.

Cllr. Gallagher highlighted the abysmal socio economic profile of West Donegal on all National Economic Indicators. Cllr. Gallagher requested that the Donegal County Council Chief Executive, CEO of Údaras na Gaeltachta, CEO of HSE and Youth Representatives collaborate to improve youth retention, care of the elderly and socio economic improvement for the County.

41.5 Tourism

Cllr. McGarvey acknowledged the positive work of the Donegal Airport Committee and their role in the restoration of the Glasgow flight service. She welcomed the positive impact of cruise ships docking in Killybegs and continuing work at Errigal.

Cllr. Mac Giolla Easbuig requested the Council to write to the Scottish authorities regarding the exorbitant costs of boat travel between Ireland and Scotland.

GMD 42/23 ROADS

42.1 Glenties Comprehensive School

On the proposal of Cllr. Gallagher, seconded by Cllr. Molloy the Committee adopted the preliminary design for the crossing points as circulated with the Agenda.

Clir. Gallagher commended the quantity and quality of works carried out by the Roads Service.

GMD 43/23 HOUSING

43.1 Housing Progress Reports

The Committee noted the Reports circulated with the Agenda in relation to the current status of:

- Casual Vacancies
- Housing Need

In response to a query from Cllr. Molloy regarding issues with availability of the OT Service, the Housing Manager requested that any issues requiring and OT Report be referred to him for follow-up. Cllr. Mac Giolla Easbuig recommended that the Council directly employ an occupational therapist to avoid any impact on the level of service.

43.2 Land Disposal

On the proposal of Cllr. Molloy, seconded by Cllr. McGarvey, the Committee agreed to dispose of a plot of land comprising of 0.0054 hectares at Muntermellan, Hornhead to Mr. Andrew Campbell subject to payment of $\[\in \]$ 1500 and Mr. Campbell being responsible for the payment of land registration fees, stamp duty and his own legal fees and costs associated with the transfer.

The Committee were also advised of an increased offer in the sum of $\not\in$ 45000 for the disposal of land at Meenavalley, Ardara as previously agreed at the MD Meeting held on 14th February 2023.

43.3 <u>Deep Energy Retrofitting Programme</u>

The Committee were updated in relation to ongoing works at Ballina, Falcarragh (44 units) and completion of 6 units at Lochán Mhuire, Annagry.

43.4 <u>Painting Programme</u>

The Committee were informed that a Contractor has been appointed to carry out the painting of 49 units in 2 phases before the year end.

43.5 Housing Construction

The Housing Manager advised that Housing Construction personnel were unable to attend the meeting due to the necessity to meet with Departmental officials. The Committee requested the housing service to issue an up-to-date report in relation to the current status of progress in respect of land and property acquisition throughout the Municipal District and also were disappointed that the scheduling of bi-monthly meetings was not positively impacting on the provision of relevant information to Councillors.

Cllr. Mac Giolla Easbuig expressed frustration at the absence of relevant officials at the Municipal District Meeting and also the lack of progress in terms of construction activity to assist those on the social housing list and facing crisis situations. He also requested a presentation from ETB/SOLAS in relation to their efforts to increase building trade apprenticeships in light of manpower shortages in the construction sector.

43.6 Reception

Cllr. McGarvey commended all those involve in the recent reception for Pádraig Ó Baoighill and Cllr. Mac Giolla Easbuig praised the interview with Pádraig by Raidio na Gaeltachta.

43.7 Palestine

On the proposal of Cllr. Mac Giolla Easbuig seconded by Cllr. McGarvey, the Committee recommended that the Palesting flag be flown at Dungloe Public Services Centre until the first week in September in solidarity with the Palestinian community. Cllr. Mac Giolla Easbuig also requested that the Council write to the Minister for Foreign Affairs requesting an expulsion of the Israeli Ambassador to Ireland.

GMD 44/23 VOTE OF SYMPATHY

Cllr. McGarvey expressed her sympathy on behalf of the Committee to Cllr. Molloy on the passing his brother-in-law.



The day also saw Jigsaw Donegal demonstrations on ensuring youth participation is a significant part of their work. Donegal Youth Council members demonstrated the importance of youth participation. Members took to the stage to show how young people can discuss the issues impacting them the most, the positive changes they wish to make and identify how these could be made possible. Members used the topic of Drugs, Alcohol, Tobacco, and Vaping from the last AGM as an example.



Poreto:

A Youth Councillor has been involved in Poreto. This was a project where students from the Loreto Community College Milford and students from Portadown College worked together on issues affecting young people on both sides of the border. There was a lot of common ground between both groups. On Monday the 12th of June they launched their Manifesto. Within the Manifesto Youth Participation, Mental Heath & Social Media, Social Deprivation and Drug Use were highlighted as topics young people feel are most affecting them. Under Youth Participation the Donegal Youth Council was identified as a great structure for ensuring young people are heard and part of decision-making processes. This unfortunately is lacking in Northern Ireland.



Donegal Road Safety Working Group:

Members of the Donegal Youth Council sit on the Donegal Road Safety working group on rotation. These meetings take place once a month. Members represent the voices of young people at these meetings and identify and discuss any issues or concerns young people may be facing in relation to road safety.

Comhairle na nÓg Networking Day:

5 members of the Donegal Youth Council attended the networking day for North West comhairlí. This event took place in Sligo on the 20th of June. Youth Council members from across these counties discussed together what works well for their youth council, what doesn't, and ideas/projects

they have or wish to work on as a youth council. Members from the Donegal Youth Council felt they got a lot out of the day and came away with great feedback to share with other members.

Vaping:

Members of the Donegal Youth Council are currently working with the Prevention Officer within Foroige on a workshop/information session to be run with young people in schools and youth organisations. Youth Councillors feel there is a lack of information and knowledge currently surrounding the issue of vaping. As the use of vapes is growing with young people the Donegal Youth Council feel that running workshops in schools and youth organisation about the facts and information about vaping can prevent more young people from using these.

Pride Parade:

Members of the Donegal Youth Council attended the Letterkenny Pride Parade and events on the 19th of August. Members showed their support for the LGBTQ+ community by dressing up and fling flags on the day.





Project Targets for the next Bi-monthly / quarterly reporting period Podcasting:

Donegal Youth Council is currently looking at creating a podcast. Members highlighted in a recent meeting there is a lack of young people in the news or news outlets. There is also a lack of youth voice for young people currently, especially on the issues affecting them including the top 3 issues currently being worked on. The coordinator with a Youth Council member had an online meeting with a Foróige digital youth worker who is part of the Foróige Sound Surfers program which part of focuses on setting up podcasts for young people. Donegal Youth Council members are currently working on producing a podcast made by young people for young people.

Healthy Donegal in conjunction with Balor Developmental Community Arts and through the Healthy Ireland Fund invited adolescents and young people to join the Balor Theatre Summer Academy Programme. The programme consisted of rehearsals in June and July and resulted in a musical production taking place from 1st - 6th August. The purpose of this programme was to bring young people, artists and educators together through drama, art and music to promote positive mental health, decrease the sense of isolation and provide positive role models.

Role-playing activities enable adolescents to learn and practice social and decision-making skills and makes it possible to present situations in a non-threatening way. The impact of drama can also go beyond the stage, stimulating discussion and serving as a means of distributing information to the wider community. In promoting participation-focussed activites, like the Balor Theatre Summer Academy Programme, Donegal County Council is helping empower adolescents and young people to develop interpersonal skills to communicate, build relationships and interact with others, which are significant contributors to their health and overall wellbeing.

Letterkenny Pride Festival

To empower, support and promote sustainable, inclusive, and prosperous communities, is a key objective of Donegal County Council. We were proud to support the Letterkenny Pride event on 19th August, which works towards building healthy, inclusive communities.



- 1.0 RURAL REGENERATION AND DEVELOPMENT FUND (RRDF)
- 1.1 EXISTING APPROVED CATEGORY 2 RRDF PROJECTS (2020)
- 1.1.1 Back to Ballyshannon A transformational project to re-energise, re-imagine and sustain the social, cultural, historical, physical and economic fabric of Ballyshannon's historic town centre.

Value: €247,500. (RRDF funding approved €185,625)

Update: Acquisition of the key regeneration site in Market Yard was completed by year end 2022. The Team now continues to work towards the publication of a planning scheme, so as to develop this project as a shovel ready capital project targeted for future Category 1 RRDF funding.

Further to the public consultation period on the draft plans held in October-November 2022, the Team is continuing to engage with key stakeholders in relation to the feedback received. This includes the local Business Chamber, ESB and Bus Eireann. Good progress is being made in this regard. A workshop was held with Members on July 13th to update them on this evolving consultation and design process.

1.1.2 Ramelton Historic Town Centre – A Restorative & Transformational Public Realm Scheme.

Value: €249,159 (RRDF funding approved €186,869)

Update: A Part 8 planning scheme for this project was published on Tuesday 1st February 2022 and a Chief Executives Report on the proposed development was brought before the Elected Members at a Plenary Meeting of the Council on Wednesday 6th of April, 2022 and it was decided to proceed with the development as proposed.



The Detailed Design phase is now completing and it is intended to open a construction tender in Q3 2023 ahead of a projected commencement on site in early Q4 of 2023. The Team will continue to update and advise Members on progress and key milestones as this project moves towards commencement on site. The process of project handover to the Council's Capital Project Delivery Unit (CPDU) has also commenced in anticipation of imminent progression to site. CPDU will manage the construction and handover stage of the project.

The Regeneration and Development Team completed the submission of a Category 1 capital funding application to the Rural Regeneration and Development Fund for the capital delivery of this project by the 12noon deadline on Friday 29th April 2022. The submitted project had a total project value of €7,949,868.

On 10th November 2022 the Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys announced that €6.3m had been awarded under the Fourth Call for Category 1 Projects of the RRDF for the "Ramelton Re-Imagined" regeneration Project. This represents a full award of the RRDF funding sought. Work is now nearing completion on the Detailed Design and preparation of a Tender Package for this project, together with arrangements for handover to the Capital Project Delivery Unit for onward delivery.

1.2.2 THIRD CALL FOR CATEGORY 2 PROJECTS UNDER THE RURAL REGENERATION & DEVELOPMENT FUND (RRDF)

On 6th January 2022 the Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys announced that €1.17m had been awarded under the Third Call for Category 2 Projects of the RRDF for the "Repowering Buncrana" regeneration Project.

Due diligence has been completed on this project and a formal letter of Offer together with an associated Funding Agreement was received on 10th May 2022. The Funding Agreement was subsequently accepted and formally returned to the Department on 18th May 2022. The project will now progress to procurement of the required consultancy services before commencement of the planning and statutory consents stages of this project enabled by the funding award.

The Elected Members of the Inishowen Municipal District were updated on the status of this

project at workshop on Friday 27th January 2023. It is now intended to progress this project to

tender in Q2 of 2023 and in this regard the project was submitted to the DRCD for Decision Gate 2 Pre-Tender Approval on Monday 20th March, 2023. Decision Gate 2 approval was subsequently received on 3rd April, 2023 and this project is therefore now approved to proceed to tender. Preparations are continuing in this regard.

A sale agreed position has also now been reached in respect of the town centre acquisition interest enabled by this project. The property concerned is the former



Garda Barracks at St. Orans Rd, Buncrana. The Councils legal services have now been instructed to close out and complete this acquisition. The property will be redeveloped as an economic development proposition as a part of this project with a forward view towards job creation and inward investment.

1.3 FOURTH CALL FOR CATEGORY 1 PROJECTS (SHOVEL READY) UNDER THE RURAL

REGENERATION & DEVELOPMENT FUND (RRDF)

On 17th December 2021 the Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys TD announced the fourth call for Category 1 applications to the €1 Billion Rural Regeneration and Development Fund (RRDF).

The closing date for the receipt of proposals was 12 noon on Friday 29th April 2022.

As described at Point 1.2.2. above the Ramelton Re-Imagined regeneration project, with a value of €7,949,868 was submitted under this call.

On 10th November 2022 the Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys announced that €6.3m had been awarded under the Fourth Call for Category 1 Projects of the RRDF for the "Ramelton Re-Imagined" regeneration Project. Work will now continue to complete the Detailed Design and preparation of a Tender Package for this project, together with arrangements for handover to the Capital Project Delivery Unit for implementation on site.

1.4 Rathmullan RRDF Project Development work

A formal Part 8 planning scheme for this project was published on Thursday 24th November 2022. Submissions or observations were required to be made in writing on or before 4:30pm on Wednesday 18th January 2023. A Chief Executives Report on the proposed development was brought before the Elected Members for consideration at a Special Meeting of the Council on 13th February 2023 when Members decided to proceed with the development as proposed.

Work will now continue to position the project for application to future calls of the Rural Regeneration & Development Fund (RRDF) for category 1 (capital) projects. The next stage in project development work concerns the preparation of a Business Case.

The project is a partnership with Rathmullan The Way Forward CLG.

1.5 Milford Town Centre First Plan

In late 2021 the Department of Rural and Community Development sought nominations for towns to be considered as part of the 1st Phase of the Town Centre Masterplan Initiative. Minister Heather Humphries TD subsequently announced that Milford was successful in securing €100,000 under the call.



The Regeneration & Development Team is now leading on the delivery of a Town Centre First Masterplan for the Town.

GM Design Associates Ltd were appointed as the successful consultancy service to deliver the Town Centre First Plan for Milford on Tuesday 14th February 2023 and the project commenced with the first stage of Public Consultation which took place over a period of 3 weeks beginning on Thursday 16th February and concluding on Thursday 9th March 2023. The first stage consultation process involved a number of targeted workshops, including a project workshop with Elected Members which took place on Tuesday 14th February 2023, as well as a cross-directorate workshop, a community stakeholder group workshop and workshops with students attending the two local secondary schools. A very successful Public Consultation Event was also held on Wednesday 22nd February which was attended by c.120 no. participants.

The public engagement also centered on the launch of a dedicated project website, facebook page and twitter page, and provided for responses via an online resident's survey, a business survey, a feedback form for individual submissions as well as a kids' page. On the whole there has been a hugely positive response to the public engagement with 227 no. online surveys completed with a further 128 no. survey responses from the secondary school pupils, 355 no. in total. There were also 16 no. comment sheets submitted, 3 no. written submissions and 2 no. email submissions as well as 86 no. kids' responses.

The consultants, GM Design Associates Limited completed the process of collating, recording and interpreting the findings and results of the public and stakeholder engagement together with the conclusions of the baseline analysis of the town centre including the SCOT analysis, and have finalised the Stage 1 Report entitled 'Milford TCF Plan Baseline Profile', which was presented to the Elected Members at a Workshop on the 5th of May 2023. This Report has directly informed the Draft Milford Town Centre First Plan which was published for public consultation from the 10th of July to the 4th of August 2023. A drop in event was held on the 26th July 2023 in the Milford PSC with 64 attendees and 42 submissions were made via completed survey forms, comments sheet and email. It is planned to hold a workshop with the Members of the Letterkenny – Milford MD week beginning the 4th September 2023 to present the proposed Milford TCF Plan which has taken onboard the submissions made.

1.6 Creeslough Village Plan and Community Regeneration Project

Donegal County Council, the Creeslough Working Group and the Creeslough Community Association supported by Arup launched a public consultation process to prepare a Village Plan and community regeneration project for the Creeslough Community. The first stage of public consultation ran between Thursday 4th May, 2023 and Thursday 25th May, 2023 and included the following events:

- Launch of the project website:
 https://creesloughvillageplan.commonplace.is/ on Thursday 4th May, 2023;
- A Senior Citizens Workshop in Creeslough Day Centre from 12noon to 1pm on Wednesday 10th May, 2023;
- O A public information event from 2pm to 8pm on Thursday 11th May 2023 in Massinass Hall, Creeslough, and,
- o Workshops with National, Gaelscoil and Secondary schools across Wednesday 10th May to Friday 12th May 2023.

These events were extremely well attended, with over 180 persons attending the drop in event in Massinass Hall. Following examination of the feedback received, a Draft Village Plan and community regeneration project was prepared and a second public consultation event was held on the 22nd June in Creeslough where both draft plans were presented. This event was very well attended also and following a period of further examination of the feedback, the proposed Creeslough Community Regeneration Project Part 8 was published on the 24th July 2023 with submissions to be made before 4.30 pm on Friday 8th September 2023. The proposal is available for viewing at the following link - Donegal County Council (donegalcoco.ie) It is planned to bring the Part 8 application to the September 2023 Plenary meeting of the Council for consideration.

2.0 URBAN REGENERATION AND DEVELOPMENT FUND (URDF)

2.1 Existing approved URDF project in Letterkenny (application submitted 2018; final approval to proceed received September 2019)

This first application secured €1.9m in URDF monies, match funded by €600,000 for three sub-projects. Sub-project A, preparation of Letterkenny 2040 Regeneration Strategy is now complete and available at www.letterkenny2040.ie.

Sub-project B, CPO in respect of the Letterkenny 2040 Strategic Urban Regeneration Site, significantly progressed having served Notices to Treat and Enter in March and April 2023. On 8th May 2023, Donegal County Council took possession of the CPO lands required to enable the delivery of Phase 1 development of the site as regards Alpha/Beta office accommodation and public realm infrastructure. Negotiation on compensation continues in parallel. Acquisition by agreement of remaining property at 29 and 31 Port Road to enable Phase 2 completed on 2nd August 2023 and both properties are also now in the possession of Council.

In addition, a Recommendation has been prepared to progress the business case for an Affordable Housing Scheme in respect of the residential component of the Concept Masterplan relating to the remainder of the strategic site (Phase 2). As a result, this part of the site will transfer to Housing colleagues with alignment and input from both the Regeneration and Development Team and the Capital Projects Delivery Unit. Further updates

will be brought to the Letterkenny-Milford MD in this regard as this work develops.

Please refer to Capital Project Delivery Unit MD reporting for update as regards the public realm sub-project.

2.2 Successful application to the Urban Regeneration & Development Fund (May 2020)

The Councils successful application to URDF Call 2, entitled 'Letterkenny 2040 (Phase 1): To Re-energize and Connect the Historic Town Centre' secured a provisional allocation for total project cost of €18.1m (comprising €13.6m URDF support together with match funding committed by the Council in the sum of €4.5m). Total project uplift was secured at Decision Gate 1 in relation to Preliminary Business Case to take account of inflation resulting in total project cost of €19.3m (comprising €14.5m URDF support and €4.8m match funding by Donegal County Council). Project costs will remain under review at each stage of project development and as the approval gateways under the Public Spending Code are navigated.

The project will advance five sub-projects to varying stages as follows:

- The further enhancement of the Cathedral Quarter
- The re-purposing of the Courthouse
- Strategic land assembly towards:
 - o Renewal of Lower Main Street
 - Advancement of a Regional Transport Hub
 - o Enhancement of 'LK Green Connect,' walking, cycling and parkland infrastructure.

DHLGH approval to proceed with tendering processes and acquisitions was secured on 7th March 2023 following approval of the Detailed Project Brief and Procurement Strategy. DHLGH advise that each sub- project will now progress on its own timeline including the preparation of individual Final Business Cases prior to appointment of construction contractor.

Accordingly, steps are being taken to proceed with each sub-project as set out in the following table.

- A meeting with NTA and representatives of the Councils Roads, Planning, Regeneration and Community Development Teams took place on 10th July 2023 in relation to transportation in Letterkenny inclusive of the Regional Transport Hub project. As regards the Regional Transport Hub, a funding commitment was secured from NTA to enable the engagement of consultancy services to move the project forward to the next level as regards scale, scope, further engagement with transport providers and operational requirements. Draft tender package is being prepared in this regard for internal review initially followed by NTA feed-in prior to opening of a procurement process.

Sub-Project E; Strategic acquisition to enable LK Green Connect

Proceed acquisition processes for land required This project will be led through the next stage by the Regeneration and Development Team. Progress on acquisition is to some degree dependent on capacity to progress Part 8 for phase 2 of LK Green Connect and in this regard, it is noted that in-house resources are severely under pressure across both URDF and RRDF work programmes. Notwithstanding, the following actions have been commenced/underway:

- Formal engagement with a number of landowners commenced and commitment given to further re-engage with particular landowners in September 2023.
- Tender package for Valuation Services in relation to the Cultural Corridor element closed on 21st July 2023 and an appointment is currently being made. Activation of acquisition steps in relation to phase 2 (from constructed Phase 1 to Pearse Road) is dependent on progress on the Part 8 to inform the extent of lands required and previous commentary of capacity of in-house resources refers.
- High level legal appraisal with Councils solicitor completed on 9th June 2023.



2.3 'The Eat Out' Outdoor Dining Infrastructure Project, Letterkenny

'The Eat Out' Outdoor Dining Infrastructure Project at the public space to the front of An Grianan Theatre secured Part 8 planning consent at the plenary Council meeting in November 2022. Detailed design of this project enabled in the context of the further development of the concept contained in the Letterkenny 2040 Regeneration Strategy via the appointment of The Paul Hogarth Company and O'Connor Cronin Sutton Engineers is well advanced. The Regeneration Team now provide support and input into the detailed design process which is led by Community Development wherein a procurement process for construction contractor closed for tender submissions on 16th August 2023. Further updates are being provided by Community Development.

2.4 Letterkenny Cultural Corridor

Part 8 proposed development for the 'Cultural Corridor' section of LK Green Connect is progressing and is at an advanced state of readiness. The target for publication of the Part 8 is September 2023 leading to consideration of Chief Executives Report on the Part 8 consultation at the November 2023 Council meeting. The team continue to work towards these target dates whilst balancing some additional negotiations with landowners that have arisen. Any adjustment in publication timeline will be communicated directly to Members.

2.5 2nd Phase of LK Green Connect

Early design work using in-house resources commenced initially in January 2023 on Part 8 proposed development for Phase 2 of LK Green Connect to link walking and cycling infrastructure at the completed Phase 1 to Pearse Road.

Due to pressures across the wider work programme of the Regeneration Team, only limited progress has been made with a fresh application of resources targeted for September 2023. Given the early stage in the design process, the timeline for publication of the Part 8 is yet to be confirmed and, as referenced, is subject to capacity of staff resources across both URDF and RRDF programmes. The preferred scenario is to publish a Part 8 by year end 2023. Workshops at MD level will be arranged as this project develops.

In parallel with design work, it is proposed to make further contact with landowners.

2.6 Youth/Community focused project at Lower Main Street

Early engagements with Letterkenny Youth Club and Donegal Youth Service have commenced to further explore the potential for a youth/community focused project at Lower Main Street as envisaged within the Design Concepts contained in the Letterkenny 2040 Regeneration Strategy and relating to a number of Councils acquisition interests under URDF Call 2 successful application. In this regard, a partnership in principle has been agreed. Following progress on relevant land acquisition under the Councils URDF

Call 2 project, it is targeted to commence design processes as regards a future capital scheme at this location. Timeline for commencement of design work is likely to be Q of 2024 at the earliest and is highly dependent on capacity of inhouse resources. Updates will be provided to Members on ongoing basis.

2.7 Collaboration with Housing Section of Donegal County Council

Collaborative working arrangements have been established with the Housing Section of Donegal County Council to explore and develop social/affordable housing schemes on key regeneration sites within the town centre generally and, more specifically at Lower Main Street and at Phase 2 of the Strategic Urban Regeneration Site located between Pearse Road and Ramelton Road. Members will be updated as this work progresses.

2.8 URDF Call 3

On the 11th July 2023, Minister O'Brien announced an allocation of €4m under URDF Call 3 for Donegal County Council in relation to Letterkenny Regional Centre. URDF Call 3 focusses on enabling Local Authorities to tackle long-term vacancy and dereliction in Letterkenny town centre and on the acceleration of residential development. The programme will provide a rolling fund to Local Authorities to enable acquisition and design and civil works that may be required to de-risk property to make it more attractive for onward sale. A funding agreement has been completed and returned to DHLGH and a further return is be completed for return to DHLGH by a deadline of 25th August 2023. A further workshop with Letterkenny-Milford MD will be required as regards next steps, resources and timeline.

2.9 Other

The Regeneration and Development Team continue to engage in other regeneration related work areas in Letterkenny, engage with key stakeholders on a rolling basis and support other sections of Donegal County Council as required and across several other activities.

3.0 CROI CONAITHE VACANT PROPERTY REFURBISHMENT GRANT SCHEME

The Council administers the Croi Conaithe Vacant Property Refurbishment Grant Scheme on behalf of the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage. The grant schemes, which came into operation in July 2022, provides grants to property owners to refurbish properties that have been vacant for two years or more for use as their principle private residence or to be made available for rent. The level of grant funding available is €50,000 or €70,000 if the property is derelict. The grants are increased by 20% for offshore island properties. To date, the Council have processed 302 applications with 87 approved and 16 rejected on the basis that they do not meet the scheme criteria mainly relating to the proposed works or that the property has not been vacant for two years or more and built on or before 2007. The balance of applications is either awaiting further information from the applicant or at first technical inspection stage. There are two applicants who have completed the works and these are currently being processed.

4.0 COMPULSORY PURCHASE ORDER ACTIVATION FUND

In April 2023, the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage launched the CPO Activation Programme for the activation of vacant and derelict properties. The main steps of the programme include:

Step 1: Identification of vacant and derelict properties

Step 2: Identification of and engagement with owners.

Step 3: Communication regarding the various schemes and measures in place to support bringing the property back into use, and

Step 4: Where owners of vacant and derelict properties cannot be identified or where they are unwilling to engage, use of available legislative powers to compulsory purchase or acquire such properties. The acquired properties may subsequently be used for social housing, made available for sale on the open market or used for other purposes.

The Council are currently undertaking Step 1 to identify vacant and derelict properties through the GEO Directory. This survey is being undertaken in the following towns, which includes town identified at the workshops held with Elected Members in July 2023. The surveys will be rolled out to other towns over the coming months:

To date, 1,545 properties have been surveyed with 678 confirmed as vacant and 48 as derelict. The next step is for our team to identify and engage with the property owners to make them aware of the supports available to bring the vacant property back into productive use. The Members will be kept up to date as we progress through the work programme.




Figure 1. Turbulent Day Sampling Killahoey

GLENTIES FLOOD RELIEF SCHEME

Briefing Note 11 – September 2023

Progress Summary

The Project Team is currently seeking to identify the Preferred Option for Glenties in conjunction with the Steering Group. Hard defences, increased channel conveyance and natural flood/ catchment management measures are the measures which are currently being assessed. Once the assessments are complete the Steering Group will hold a Public Information Day to inform the public of the outcomes of Stage I.

The RPS Environmental team have now completed specialist surveys, habitat mapping and protected species surveys. This has informed the option assessment process. Further specialist surveys may be required subject to the selection of a Preferred Option.

Next Steps

Hydraulic Analysis: RPS are in the process of finalising the hydraulic reporting.

Scheme Analysis and Development: RPS are working to identify the preferred option in conjunction with the Steering Group. RPS are developing Scheme Analysis and Development reporting including supplementary reporting on the application of nature-based catchment measures, buildability, operation and maintenance and climate change adaptation.

Environmental Assessment: Screening for Appropriate Assessment, Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Screening and, where necessary, the development of the Natura Impact Statement and Environmental Impact Assessment Report (EAIR) will be undertaken on confirmation of the Preferred Option.

Public Information Day: A public information day is planned for late Autumn 2023.

Projected Key Milestone Dates

- Options Development Report September 2023
- Public Information Day October 2023
- Completion of Environmental Impact Assessment Report April 2024
- Completion of Natura Impact Statement January 2024
- Ongoing management of invasive species in line with the management plan

There has been an extension of three months to the Stage I programme for Glenties. This is due to a delay in the completion and issue of the Scheme Analysis and Development phase reporting.

The Public Information Day has been delayed further as RPS and the Steering Group explore further the potential for Nature-based Catchment Management; the potential project partners and the wider objectives of such a scheme.

Shared Island: Work continuing for Shared Island funded projects as follows:

North West RegTech Initiative is a proposal to develop an all-island national institute in Regulatory Technology in the North West with partners DCSDC, Catalyst and ATU. Work is underway by the appointed consultants for the Scoping/Feasibility Study and Business Case/Economic Appraisal (Stratagem Partners) for completion in September 2023. A high-profile conference is also planned for Autumn 2023.

Innovation Plaza to develop cross-border food innovation campuses in Ballyshannon and Irvinestown in partnership with Fermanagh and Omagh District Council (FODC). Key stakeholder consultation, site appraisal and benchmarking are currently being progressed by the appointed consultants. The completed Feasibility Study, Economic Appraisal/Business Case is on track for delivery in October 2023.

Regenerative Tourism Project is a proposal to develop a cross border slow tourism destination which preserves and showcases the region's rich, social, cultural and natural heritage while enabling tourism enterprise clusters to grow and prosper. The preferred option emerging is to develop key recreational hubs at the Knader Forest and Castle Caldwell and to link them physically, promotionally and thematically with regional visitor hubs in Belleek and Ballyshannon, through a shared use trail network to develop a connected, serviced destination for the region.

Ireland West Airport

Ireland West Airport is enjoying a record-breaking year for passenger traffic in 2023. Recently released figures show that a record 367,000 passengers passed through the airport during the period January to June 2023, making it the busiest six-month period in the airports 38-year history.

The Tourism Unit is working with Ireland West Airport marketing team to update branding and imagery on all digital screens and billboards within the airport and ensure that Donegal has maximum exposure within the airport.

Brochures & Promotional Merchandise

For the summer season, Donegal Tourism produced 6,000 A5 brochures in July and 3,000 A4 double sided leaflets. Brochures along with maps were distributed to all tourist offices, hotels, airports and promotional events.

Spirit of Ireland Magazine

Donegal Tourism will be advertising in the next edition of the Spirit of Ireland Magazine. The March issue will be distributed in New York City on St Patrick's Day. Spirit of Ireland is the official magazine of Nacta that brings visitors to Ireland to the value of 3.6 million annually. In addition, Tourism Ireland works very closely with the North American Celtic Trade association and attends the four major Irish Shows. Nacta uses the magazine as a travel brochure promoting Ireland.

Golf Cluster Meeting

Donegal County Council Tourism Unit continues to support golf providers and is organising a meeting which will take place on Wednesday, 27th September 2023 in Cruit Island Golf Club. We have invited all golf providers in the county to attend this meeting with a view to working collaboratively to promote Donegal as a world class golf destination.

Donegal Tourism - Associate Members Committee

The Associate Members Committee of Donegal Tourism CLG provides a forum that enables its members to share views, opinions and insights and to provide a connection between members and the Board of Directors.

The committee is made up of members nominated and voted by members of the company with a poll taking every two years.

In April 2023, the process for nomination of members onto the committee commenced. Each member was assigned a business category and was nominated to vote on the membership of the committee.

The Associate Members Committee election process was completed in July and the names of the new committee members have been emailed to all members. The first meeting of this new committee is scheduled for September 13th. The main item on the agenda of this meeting will be the election of three committee members onto the Board of Directors.

Chicago/Milwaukee 2023

Donegal Tourism recently completed a successful trade mission to the USA which saw representatives positively engage with tour operators in Chicago and participation in the world's largest Irish festival.

The schedule included a B2B event in Chicago, with an interactive presentation showcasing the very best Donegal has to offer to the key American decision-makers in attendance.

This event proved to be an excellent opportunity to meet, do business with and present to tour operators from the Chicago area—ensuring Donegal is top of mind for scheduling itineraries for their clients.

The team then moved to the Milwaukee to host an area in the travel section. Milwaukee Irish Fest is North America's largest celebration of Celtic music and culture, showcasing more than 100 entertainment acts on 17 stages.

Irish Fest promotes all aspects of Irish, Irish American and Celtic Cultures and attracted an audience of over 100,000 attendees.

The festival also provided an opportunity for staff to engage with several prominent visitors to the festival including the Mayor of Milwaukee, Cavalier Johnson and Ireland's Minister of State at the *Department* of *Justice* and Equality, James Browne, in addition to Tourism Ireland USA and Aer Lingus and other counties.

Laurentic Forum

Donegal Tourism continues to attend monthly meetings in relation to exploring mutual opportunities.

Big O - Marketing Agency

Donegal Tourism have appointed a marketing agency called Big O to create a campaign that is aligned with our product offering for the shoulder season. Donegal Tourism in conjunction with the trade hosted a fam trip in June to sample for the agency what the county has to offer. Ongoing meetings and plans are in place in advance of the delivery of a campaign later in the year.

2. Takeover of Roads

I refer to previous presentations and discussions regarding the Takeover of Roads at various Workshops and MD Meetings over the last few years.

Based on these, I am satisfied that this Committee is in agreement to take the following Roads over, however as a final step a **Proposer** and **Seconder** is required for each Road to be taken in charge.

I have documented the 4 Roads under consideration in the following documents.

Ref 1: Road to be taken in charge at Fairhill

As a follow up to the Glenties MD meeting of 14th March 2023, Roads Area Manager presented a final report in relation to the proposed Declaration of the following road as a public road;

Dungloe Town

The road in the Town land of Meenmore Dungloe (Fairhill), between end of road L-15432 and junction to road L-1543-2, from grid reference 576786.8 E, 911887.4 N to grid reference 576832.0 E, 911663.1 N, a length of approximately 221m.

The members noted that there were no objections/representations received during the public consultation period following publication of the required notice in accordance with Section 11(1)(b)(iii) of the Roads Act 1993. The members were satisfied that the road is of general public utility, that a public right of way exists over the road, that the cost of bringing the road to a suitable standard for use by the general public, estimated at 0 is within the means of the Glenties MD and that the additional maintenance cost of this section of road into the future is not likely to be significant and in any event is justified by the benefit of having this additional section of road added to the Council's existing public road network.

Ref 2: Road to be taken in charge at Clonbara, Falcarragh

Clonbara Falcarragh

The members noted that there were no objections/representations received during the public consultation period following publication of the required notice in accordance with Section 11(1)(b)(iii) of the Roads Act 1993. The members were satisfied that the road is of general public utility, that a public right of way exists over the road, that the cost of bringing the road to a suitable standard for use by the general public, estimated at €3,000 is within the means of the Glenties MD and that the additional maintenance cost of this section of road into the future is not likely to be significant and in any event is justified by the benefit of having this additional section of road added to the Council's existing public road network.

Ref 3: Road to be taken in charge at Meenaniller

Meenaniller

The road in the town land of Meenaniller and Ardnagappery, between its junction with the road L-1363-1/2 and its junction with the road L-1373-1, from grid reference 582871.5 E, 924618.2 N, to grid reference 582500.2 E, 923938.0 N, a length of approximately 559m.

The members noted that there were no objections/representations received during the public consultation period following publication of the required notice in accordance with Section 11(1)(b)(iii) of the Roads Act 1993. The members were satisfied that the road is of general public utility, that a public right of way exists over the road, that the cost of bringing the road to a suitable standard for use by the general public, estimated at €6,000 is within the means of the Glenties MD and that the additional maintenance cost of this section of road into the future is not likely to be significant and in any event is justified by the benefit of having this additional section of road added to the Council's existing public road network.

Ref 4: Road to be taken in charge near Teach Neddy's, Mullaghdoo Scotch

As a follow up to the Glenties MD meeting of 14th March 2023, Roads Area Manager presented a final report in relation to the proposed Declaration of the following road as a public road;

Mullaghdoo Scotch

The road in the town land of Mullaghdoo Scotch & Braade, between its junction with the R- 257-9 to a private gate at end of road, from grid reference 577354.9 E, 920404.3 N, to grid reference 577497.9 E, 920765.4 N, a length of approximately 612m.

The members noted that there were no objections/representations received during the public consultation period following publication of the required notice in accordance with Section 11(1)(b)(iii) of the Roads Act 1993. The members were satisfied that the road is of general public utility, that a public right of way exists over the road, that the cost of bringing the road to a suitable standard for use by the general public, estimated at €2,000 is within the means of the Glenties MD and that the additional maintenance cost of this section of road into the future is not likely to be significant and in any event is justified by the benefit of having this additional section of road added to the Council's existing public road network.
