On the proposal of Cllr. Molloy seconded by Cllr. Ó Gallagher, the minutes of the Municipal District Meeting held on the 12^{th} September 2023 were

confirmed.

GMD 52/23 ENVIRONMENT

The Committee noted the Reports circulated with the agenda and highlighted the following issues for the attention of the Environmental Service:

- Recycling and Bring Bank requirements.
- Bins for the disposal of dog fouling.
- Provision of public toilets at Assaranka Waterfall and at Maghera Beach.
- Provision of bins at Glengesh.
- 'No Dumping' sign needed at Carrickatlieve.

In response to concerns highlighted by the Committee regarding recent flooding and the importance of a river cleaning programme, the Environment Director undertook to liaise with the Roads Director.

Cllr. Gallagher recommended a meeting between the Council and the O.P.W.

GMD 53/23 HOUSING CAPITAL

The Report circulated with the agenda was welcomed by the Committee.

The Senior Executive Engineer advised the Committee of the current status of turnkey projects in:

- Dungloe Stage 3 45 units reduced to 43.
- Massiness, Creeslough site being cleared.
- Gweedore at legal stage
- Part 8 approval in place for Glenties Fire Station.

The Area Manager for Roads advised the Committee that a road closure will most likely be required for 4 to 6 weeks at Chapel Road during construction, to facilitate storm drainage works. He also advised that local access will be maintained.

Cllr. Gallagher expressed frustration regarding the three vacant Údarás properties in Fintown during a housing crisis. Cllr. Molloy undertook to liaise with Údarás officials in this regard.

The A/Area Housing Manager stated that the local Council Engineering team are not interested in acquisition of the properties due to right of way and easement complications. The Council are also in negotiations to complete the acquisition of an alternative suitable site in the Fintown area.

GMD 54/23 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, I.S. AND EMERGENCY SERVICES

The Committee noted the Report circulated with the agenda regarding the following work programmes:

Cllr. Molloy stated that hotel accommodation capacity is proving a significant issue and requested the Council to develop initiatives to support local festivals.

Cllr. Gallagher expressed disappointment at the level of fire service available on offshore Islands and Cllr. McClafferty recommended that the Chief Fire Officer meet Councillors in that regard.

GMD 55/23 PLANNING

Cllr. Mac Giolla Esbuig expressed disappointment at the absence of any official to represent Community Development at the meeting. The Members noted Reports circulated with the agenda.

58.1 Roads Workshop

58.2 NRDO

The Roads Manager updated Members on the status of N56 projects.

58.3 Burtonport/Letterkenny Greenway

The Roads Manager informed the Committee that an online Workshop for the Glenties and Letterkenny Municipal Districts is proposed for 2 pm on 29th November 2023.

58.4 Flooding

The Committee commended the Roads Service for their prompt response and assistance to the public in the aftermath of Storm Debi.

The Roads Manager informed the Committee that (i) all Roads Staff were assigned to flood alleviation duties following the intense rainfall and (ii) costings will be prepared to apply for additional funding to resolve major flooding issues.

In response to concerns by Cllr. McClafferty regarding extreme flooding in the Port dale Estate in Dunfanaghy, the Roads Manager advised that substantial flood relief funding would be required to resolve this particular problem.

Cllr. Gallagher requested Senior Management to source major funding for an annual drainage programme as a preventative measure in advance of increasing rainfall predictions as a consequence of climate change.

58.5 Maintenance

Cllr. McClafferty raised the following issues:

- Flooding at Ballyconnell and Shroughan.
- 'No Overtaking' signage at Muckish/Creeslough turnoff.
- Pound St. Dunfanaghy increase pipe capacity.

Cllr. Gallagher requested a follow-up in respect of the following items:

Cllr. Molloy raised the following road matters:

Cllr. Mac Giolla Easbuig welcomed the provision of traffic lights on the Carnmore Road, Dungloe.

Cllr. Mac Giolla Easbuig highlighted the following issues for the attention of the Roads Service:

- Traffic safety measures at Caisleán Óir Hotel and Falcarragh National School.
- Public Lighting Dore and Main Street, Dungloe.

The Roads Manager informed the Committee of status of a consultation process and safety audit in relation to safety concerns at Cronashallog, Dungloe. He undertook to revisit this issue with the NRDO following a request from Cllr. Mac Giolla Easbuig.




- 1. Drugs, Alcohol, Tobacco and Vaping


LCEP (Local Economic and Community Plan):



no upper limit but projects seeking over €10m would be considered exceptional in nature.

In recognition of the classification by the EU Commission of the North West Region as a Transition Region, grant aid of 90% will apply with 10% to be provided in matching contributions by the Council – this 10% matching contribution can be in the form of Local Authority investment, community investment or philanthropic contributions.

The deadline for submission of applications is **12 pm on Tuesday 8th February 2024**. As confirmed to Elected Members at the November 2023 Plenary meeting of the Council, work is underway to bring forward applications for Regeneration Projects in Rathmullan and Creeslough under this Call.

2.0 Urban Regeneration and Development Fund (URDF).

Funding is provided from the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage for towns with a population in excess of 10,000 which includes Letterkenny in this County, with calls for application to the Fund sought under two categories. **Category 1** relates to projects with all necessary planning and other consents in place and which are ready to proceed, i.e shovel ready. **Category 2** projects are those which require further development to become ready for Category 1 status.

The 'Harbour to Island' Project was conceived on the basis that it would take place in two stages in order to accommodate the existing uses occupying the harbour space including the Harbour Master's office, ticket offices and the public toilets. Phase 1 of the Project was awarded funding under the Second Call for Category 1 Funding announced in November 2019. Phase 1 provides for the following:
	 At Ailt an Chorráin (Burtonport):- Transformation of the harbour infrastructure and environment through the demolition and removal of under-utilised, redundant or vacant buildings, to a new multi-user public realm space with modern transport infrastructure, public amenities and services and parking; At Óilean Árainn Mhór (Arranmore Island):- Landmark shorefront recreation, outdoor amenity and local community inspired amphitheatre style event space including children's playground and car parking.
	The works at Óilean Árainn Mhór (Arranmore Island) are now complete and works at Ailt an Chorráin commenced in January 2022 and are now in progress, with substantial completion anticipated for the end of September 2022.
 	About the Project Phase 2 of the project proposes a new Ferry Terminal Building and Enterprise Building that present as an important physical element of the overall project and provide a valuable opportunity to introduce regenerative physical development, a diversification of uses and quality architecture to the marine and harbour environment. Broadly, the proposed development will provide for the construction of a Ferry Terminal Building which will house Donegal County Council office accommodation, a community meeting room, public facilities, ferry offices, waiting area and tourist desk facility and a separate Enterprise Building containing a number of small mixed-use units that will help create employment opportunities and stimulate entrepreneurship.

Main Provisions

- It is estimated that about 1.9 billion drinks bottles and cans are consumed each year in Ireland, in-house and 'on the go'.
- The Deposit Return Scheme aims to boost the recycling rate for these drinks containers by charging a small, refundable deposit for each plastic bottle or cans.
- The Scheme will be operated by Deposit Return Scheme Ireland CLG, trading as Return, who Minister Smyth appointed in July 2022.
- The Scheme will include PET plastic bottles and aluminium and steel cans between 150ml and 3 litres.
- A deposit of 15c will apply to containers 500mls or less and a deposit of 25c for each container above 500ml.
- All producers and retailers are legally obliged to register with Re-turn. Registration is open at www.re-turn.ie.
- Customers get this money back when they return the container to a retailer or other collection point to be recycled.
- Places supplying beverage bottles and cans will be obliged to take back the containers and reimburse the deposit.

NOTE – Not every place supplying drinks has to take back containers (e.g. chip vans, small shops) but they have to apply for an exemption and if granted have to display their exemption




Notes

This is a deposit return scheme commencing on the 1st February 2024 geared towards promoting recycling and addressing littering concerns by assigning a monetary value to beverage containers. If you purchase a drink in a plastic bottle, aluminium, or steel can bearing the Re-turn logo, a small deposit is added to the drink's price. Upon returning the empty, undamaged container to any retail outlet, the full deposit is refunded. Container size determines the deposit amount, with 15c for 500ml or less and 25c for containers exceeding 500ml. The scheme covers PET plastic bottles and aluminium/steel cans ranging from 150ml to 3 litres.

Designed for convenience, Re-Turn offers return points throughout Ireland. Any establishment selling drinks with the Re-turn logo is obligated to accept and refund deposits for empty, undamaged containers, except those with a Take Back Exemption. This exemption is applicable to on-site drink-serving businesses (hotels, restaurants, bars, cafes), off-site sellers with small store sizes (250 sq. meters or less), and online drink retailers. These exempted businesses must display a QR code and website link indicating the nearest return points.

Beyond convenience, the scheme is expected to benefit communities by promoting recycling as a potent tool for addressing climate change. Re-Turn seeks to transition away from the 'take-make-dispose' mindset, encouraging the return of valuable materials to the economy for prolonged use.





Final Checklist for Retailers

Re-turn is encouraging all Retailers to do a final checklist in preparation for go live of the Deposit Return Scheme on 1 February. This applies to all Retailers regardless of whether they have been granted a Take Back Exemption.

	 From January 2024, new EU legislation means every household will be entitled to avail of a brown bin collection service; Approximately 69% of households in Ireland up until now, are able to avail of a food waste collection service from their waste service collector; MyWaste.ie is encouraging everyone, here, there, and everywhere to contact their waste collector and request a brown bin service in 2024, because "you're never too remote to recycle!"
	There is good news for households in rural areas. New legislation, came into effect in January 2024, meaning all householders in Ireland are entitled to a brown bin recycling collection service from their waste collector.
	The brown bin service accepts all types of food including raw and cooked meat and fish, plate scrapings, along with fruit and vegetable peelings. Other items that can go into the brown bin include food-soiled paper napkins, paper towels, pizza boxes as well as grass clippings and light garden waste. Donegal household waste collectors will be taking part in the National Food Waste Recycling Activity / Project in 2024 **Project Title** Project Description/ Activity The EPA estimates that Ireland generated 753,000 tonnes (t) of food waste in 2021. Growing, processing and transporting food uses a huge amount of resources, such as land, water, energy and fertiliser. If food is wasted, these resources are wasted too. The EPA estimates that food waste costs the average Irish household about €60 per month or €700 per vear. That's an annual national cost of €1.29 billion. In order to help households to separate their waste and to reduce contamination in the food waste stream Donegal household waste collectors will be taking part in the National Food Waste Recycling Project this year. This project is funded by the Department of Environment, Climate and Communications (DECC) and is being led by the Regional Waste Management Planning Authorities under the guise of mywaste.ie. Through the project Donegal collectors will be provided with thousands of kitchen caddy packs to distribute to their customers. Each pack consists of a 7 litre kitchen caddy, a starter pack of compostable liners and an information leaflet. Householders can use the caddy and liners to separate their food waste in the kitchen and when the liner is full, place it in their kerbside food waste bin. The **Community Climate Action Fund - Public Information Sessions** are ongoing and are being well attended by community groups across the county.



GLENTIES FLOOD RELIEF SCHEME

Briefing Note 12 - January 2024

Progress Summary

The Project Team is currently seeking to identify the Preferred Option for Glenties in conjunction with the Steering Group. Hard defences, increased channel conveyance and natural flood/ catchment management measures are the measures which are currently being assessed.

The Steering Group has appointed RPS to undertake a further study to scope out a pilot project which trials Nature based Solutions to multiple issues in the Stracashel catchment including the potential to mitigate flood risk.

The RPS Environmental team have now completed specialist surveys, habitat mapping and protected species surveys. This has informed the option assessment process. Further specialist surveys may be required subject to the selection of a Preferred Option.

Next Steps

Hydraulic Analysis: RPS are in the process of finalising the hydraulic reporting.

Scheme Analysis and Development: RPS are working to identify the preferred option in conjunction with the Steering Group. RPS are developing Scheme Analysis and Development reporting including supplementary reporting on the application of nature-based catchment measures, buildability, operation and maintenance and climate change adaptation.

Environmental Assessment: Screening for Appropriate Assessment, Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Screening and, where necessary, the development of the Natura Impact Statement and Environmental Impact Assessment Report (EAIR) will be undertaken on confirmation of the Preferred Option.

Projected Key Milestone Dates

- Options Development Report March 2024
- Public Information Day April 2024
- Completion of Environmental Impact Assessment Report February 2025
- Completion of Natura Impact Statement February 2025

There has been an extension of eleven months to the Stage I programme for Glenties. This is due to the addition of the Glenties Nature-based Solutions Pilot Study to the programme.

Major Emergency Management

As part of the MEM structure, Civil Defence continues to support the Principal Response Agencies (PRAs) when the need arises. Already in January of this year, Civil Defence AFS units has been placed on standby to assist with Storm Isha and Strom Joclyn.

Health Service Executive: Severe Weather Events:

During severe weather events, such as snow, frost and icy conditions, Civil Defence provides transport support to the HSE and National Ambulance Service with their 4x4 vehicles. In January of this year, Civil Defence provided transport services to the HSE Home Care Support Teams from 17^{th} January -20^{th} January inclusive. This service allows the Home Care Support workers to continue their twice daily care of the vulnerable in the community, during the severe weather.

Civil Defence Officers Association Conference:

The 3-day National Civil Defence Officers Association Conference was held in Farnham Estate, Cavan on 7th, 8th and 9th November. In attendance was, 234 delegates, over the course of the event, 33 traders exhibited their latest equipment for potential future Civil Defence use.

1. Social Housing Developments – Construction Schemes

Donegal County Council is currently progressing the following proposed social housing development in the Glenties Municipal District:

2. Social Housing through Turnkey Acquisition

Donegal County Council's turnkey acquisition process is continuing throughout the county. A proposal for 29 housing units at Gweedore has Department approval and subject to the signing of contracts, works are expected to commence on site in Q1 2024.

A proposal to construct 11 no. social housing units on lands in Creeslough has planning permission and Uisce Eireann approval. Department Approval has also been obtained. The Council is working with the Developer seeking final agreement on costs and programme delivery. The proposal remains subject to contract.

Donegal County Council has opened a new turnkey acquisition process seeking proposals from Developers to deliver turnkey social housing units to help meet the Council's social housing need. This is a county-wide process and proposals can be made for any town or village throughout the county, on lands suitable for housing purposes. The Council is seeking

developers to make submissions for 1, 2, 3 & 4 bedroom housing units. Proposals must contain a minimum of 5 units and can include:

- Completed units, including potential regeneration projects.
- Units under construction.
- Units to be constructed on suitable sites.

This process has been advertised on eTenders (reference RFT 2461070), where all documentation and information can be obtained. Submissions are currently being accepted under the turnkey process and submissions will be accepted up to a final closing date of 30^{th} September 2026.

3. Lands / Property for Social Housing Purposes

The Council is actively pursuing the acquisition of lands suitable for housing purposes, in towns and villages where there is currently not a social housing solution available.

The Council has made offers to acquire lands for social housing and are sale agreed subject to contract in Fintown and Falcarragh. An offer to acquire land in Gweedore has also been made.

The site at Fintown is subject to contract and planning approval and the site in Falcarragh is subject to contract and confirmation of utility connections.

As part of the process of acquiring land, the team liaises and consults on a cross-directorate basis with other Council services in carrying out due diligence in respect of each acquisition and considers the following: zoning, easements for connections to utilities and vision lines, Uisce Eireann connection agreements, footpath connectivity to town centre, flood risk assessment and surface water discharge point with capacity and easements.

A number of land parcels have and are being considered in Annagry (1 Plot), Ardara (4 plots), Glenties (5 Plots), Kilclooney (1 Plot), Dungloe (2 plots), Burtonport(1 Plot), Arranmore Island(1 Plot), Gweedore (2 Plots), Falcarragh (2 Plots), Dunfanaghy(1 Plot) and Doochary (1 Plot).
