Confirmation of Minutes of Glenties Municipal

District Committee Meeting

On the proposal of Cllr. Molloy seconded by Cllr. Ó Gallagher, the minutes of the Municipal District Meeting held on the 12th September 2023 were

confirmed.

#### GMD 52/23 ENVIRONMENT

The Committee noted the Reports circulated with the Agenda and highlighted the following issues for the attention of the Environmental Service:

- · Recycling and Bring Bank requirements
- · Bins for the disposal of dog fouling
- Provision of public toilets at Assaranka Waterfall and also at Maghera Beach
- Provision of bins at Glengesh
- 'No Dumping' sign needed at Carrickatlieve.

In response to concerns highlighted by the Committee regarding recent flooding and the importance of a river cleaning programme, the Environment Director undertook to liaise with the Roads Director.

Cllr. Gallagher recommended a meeting between the Council and the O.P.W.

# GMD 53/23 HOUSING CAPITAL

The Report circulated with the Agenda was welcomed by the Committee.

The Senior Executive Engineer advised the Committee of the current status of turnkey projects in:

- Dungloe Stage 3 45 units reduced to 43.
- Massiness, Creeslough site being cleared
- Gweedore at legal stage
- Part 8 approval in place for Glenties Fire Station.

The Area Manager for Roads advised the Committee that a road closure will most likely be required for 4 to 6 weeks at Chapel Road during construction, to facilitate storm drainage works. He also advised that local access will be maintained.

Cllr. Gallagher expressed frustration regarding the three vacant Údarás properties in Fintown during a housing crisis. Cllr. Molloy undertook to liaise with Údarás officials in this regard.

The A/Area Housing Manager stated that the local Council Engineering team are not interested in acquisition of the properties due to rights of way and easement complications. The Council are also in negotiations to complete the acquisition of an alternative suitable site in the Fintown area.

The Committee noted the Report circulated with the Agenda regarding the following work programmes:

Cllr. Mac Giolla Easbuig referred to his previous requests that the Head of Tourism convene a Workshop regarding the impact of tourism on Housing, Local Environment and sustainability of the Gaeltacht Region.

Cllr. Molloy stated that hotel accommodation capacity is proving a significant issue and requested the Countil to develop initiatives to support local festivals.

Cllr. Gallagher expressed disappointment at the level of service available in offshore Islands and Cllr. McClafferty recommended that the Chief Fire Officer meet Councillors in that regard.

The Youth Councillors made an informative presentation to the Members including a variety of issues such as:

The Roads Manager updated Members on the status of N56 projects.

# 58.3 Burtonport/Letterkenny Greenway

The Roads Manager informed the Committee that an online Workshop for the Glenties and Letterkenny Municipal Districts is proposed for 2 pm on 29<sup>th</sup> November 2023.

# 58.4 Flooding

The Committee commended the Roads Service for their prompt response and assistance to the public in the aftermath of Storm Debi.

The Roads Manager informed the Committee that (i) all Roads Staff were assigned to flood alleviation duties following the intense rainfall and (ii) costings will be prepared to apply for additional funding to resolve major flooding issues.

In response to concerns by Cllr. McClafferty regarding extreme flooding in the Portdale Estate in Dunfanaghy the Roads Manager advised that substantial flood relief funding would be required to resolve the problem.

Cllr. Gallagher requested Senior Management to source major funding for an annual drainage programme as a preventative measure in advance of forecast predicting increasing rainfall as a consequence of climate change.

#### 58.5 Maintenance

Cllr. McClafferty raised the following issues:

Cllr. Mac Giolla Easbuig commended the provision of traffic lights on the Carnmore Road, Dungloe.

# 59.4 Energy Efficiency Retrofit Programme 2023

The Committee were informed of the completion of substantial retrofitting works in the sum of an excess of  $\[mathcal{\in}\]$ 1million - 40 units in Falcarragh and Annagry (Lochan Mhuire X 6) (Ballina X 34).

Clir. Gallagher recommended the installation of Solar panels as part of the retrofitting programme.

Cllr. Gallagher recommended the widening of car parking spaces to facilitate users of services available in the Public Services Centre.

# 59.8 Corporate



The event was hosted at the Regional Cultural Centre on Wednesday, November 29 with a screening of a Palestinian short film followed by






- 1. Drugs, Alcohol, Tobacco and Vaping


# Vaping Conference:


# LCEP (Local Economic and Community Plan):





Information shows that the number of households in the County with a waste collection service has increased further in 2023 to over 49,000. Work required in 2024 to achieve uptake and participation of the three bin service and further validate data.  The team continue to review and analysis information e.g. annual returns, waste collection permit conditions and vehicle checks.
	Multi agency vehicle checkpoints were carried out at locations throughout the County in 2023. These joint operations prove a valuable mechanism to further strengthen relationships with agencies such as An Garda Síochána, Revenue, The Department of Social Protection, The Road Safety Authority and others. They portray an important visual message about multi agency actions to tackle illegal and unauthorised waste activity to prevent pollution and protect the environment.

	National waste statistics and indicators also play an important part in clearly conveying the impacts and opportunities of waste management to Irelands people, its environment and progress towards a 'circular economy'.

In 2023 there were over 80 Waste Collection Permit (WCP) returns for validation by Donegal County Council and more than 50 Waste Facility Permit (WFP) and/or Certificate of Registration (CoR) returns.

In October 2023 90% of WCP's were validated and 94% of WFP/CoR's. Joint online validations were carried out with the Regional Waste Management Planning Office in 2023 in line with the protocol.

A considerable amount of resources were allocated to this body of work in 2023 to further improve the quality of information being submitted and therefore the accuracy of information presented for waste data analysis and projections. A report will be produced in Q1 2024 as part of scheduled reporting to quantify this.


Donegal is an active member of the **AR waste validation working group** and is also represented on various sub groups that have formed to look at key themes associated with this important work area such as waste characterization and waste codes.

Waste characterisation –64% of what is in the household residual bin should not be in it. Education and price incentivisation will help improve things somewhat. Tools to be examined to address this in 2024.

30 in-person household waste surveys were carried out in Sept 2023 in Falcarragh. The particular area selected was chosen as a result of a number of criteria including collectors reporting high refusals of brown bins and / or low participation of the three bin service and the town is also a decarbonisation town, to link with the work of the climate office.

Pocket guides were distributed to participating households. The information gathered through this process will be built on going forward, for example quite a number of those interviewed did not realise that if they were having works done to their house they are responsible for the waste.

Communications work was undertaken to address this including public service announcements on local radio stations and information provided on Donegal County Council social media platforms.



The **pocket guides** are proving very popular and Environment staff have been contacted by other LA's looking to produce similar guides. Environment staff assist other LA's where possible.

The team continue to promote **mywaste.ie** and are looking at ways to direct people to resources on the *mywaste* website.

Donegal's draft household waste presentation by laws are in line to go through public consultation process and work is ongoing in this area. When the by laws are in place they will support targeted enforcement work in problem areas.

**Commercial waste inspections are underway**. These will also provide an opportunity to signpost businesses to the resources available on the mywaste.ie website.

**Further changes in legislation are set for 2024** that will place even greater responsibility on waste collectors to achieve source segregation and Donegal will be working with the Connaught Ulster Waste Enforcement Lead Authority (CU WERLA) to ensure a cohesive and coordinated approach in this area.

**Donegal is part of a National Food Waste Project.** In 2024, thousands of household customers in Donegal will get kitchen caddie packs for food waste as part of this project. Caddie packs were distributed to members of the public at events held throughout the County as part of **National Food Waste Recycling** week.

Environment staff feed into consultation processes and participate in working groups and discussion groups that shape legislation and enforcement priorities e.g.

- Input to incentivised charging study.
- Participated in consultation group re proposed amended commercial kerbside conditions.
- National waste management plan for a circular economy.
- Donegal are an active member of the AR waste validation working group and a member of the 'list of waste codes' sub group.
- Greenfield soil and stone as a by-product consultation

In 2023 the Environment team also provided submissions to the draft climate action plan and the County Development plan for County Donegal.

Donegal County Council have successfully campaigned for legal mechanisms to allow for excess material from construction jobs to be reused and repurposed. This reuse of material is in keeping with the circular economy and Climate Change targets and it is anticipated that there will be sites more involved in this area in 2024.

#### Litter


Between January and October '23, the litter wardens examined over 500 complaints, pursuing legal actions against offenders.

Collaborating with a dedicated team of 5,000 community volunteers, they facilitated more than 500 cleanups through the mobile litter units.

Additionally, the wardens actively engaged with local schools, delivering talks on the importance of litter and recycling.

Complementing these efforts, the environment team crafted various in-house videos for social media campaigns, covering topics such as litter, beaches, and community awareness initiatives like "Man in the Van."

Their unwavering dedication extends to collaborating with Tidy Towns groups throughout the County on a weekly basis, resulting in increased points for all towns in this year's competition.



#### Knowledge exchange

On the 29th and 30th May 2023, delegates from all over Ireland directly involved in environmental legislation and in particular waste enforcement came together at an event organized by the Network for Irelands Environmental Compliance and Enforcement (NIECE) in conjunction with the Waste Enforcement Regional Local Authorities (WERLA's).

Donegal County Council presented at this event alongside speakers from the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the WERLAS, the National Trans Frontier Shipment Office (NTFSO) and local authorities throughout Ireland.

#### Sale and Use of Solid Fuel - Coal

Donegal are leading the way in this area and are providing support to other Local Authorities. This work involves;

- Inspections at retailers



This took place from 14<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> November 2023 and was a very successful trade mission that incorporated both meetings and events showcasing the North West City Region.

- The annual Golden Bridges Conference took place on 17<sup>th</sup> November 2023 attended by the NWCR delegation. Joe Kennedy III, US economic envoy to Northern Ireland also attended.
- As part of the US trade mission the 'Pathfinder Go To Market' programme was very successful in partnership with the LEO and Alpha Innovation and facilitated by Catalyst. 10 businesses from the North West City Region travelled to the US to take part, 4 were from the Life Sciences sector and 6 were from the Tech, Saas, Al sector.
- The 'Ireland's North West City Region' brand was promoted throughout the US Trade Mission and at Golden Bridges 2023 through using new branded marketing collateral.
- The NWCR delegation met with contacts in Philadelphia to discuss tourism collaboration opportunities with agreement to explore the potential of a golf tourism focused initiative between the US and the North West City Region.
- The NWCR delegation met representatives of CSC Station, Wilmington, Delaware in relation to their Innovation Hub and potential collaborations with the North West City Region.
- The Donegal Association Philadelphia hosted an evening reception for NWCR delegates. This event provided an opportunity to build relationships and nurture connections with the Diaspora in Philadelphia and to showcase the latest developments and inward investment initiatives in the North West City Region.
- The NWCR delegation met with management of 'Pennovation Works' an Innovation Centre in Philadelphia. This meeting provided an opportunity to discuss Innovation Centre business models and approaches.

- The NWCR delegation attended the IABCN Life Sciences Summit 2023, which provided an
  opportunity to network and discuss potential collaboration opportunities.
- The Boston State House representatives hosted a reception with NWCR delegates to further strengthen civic links with Boston MA and update on the opportunities and challenges facing the NWCR.
- A meeting between IDA & INI US East Coast with North West City Region representatives took
  place to agree pathways on collective branding and marketing to accelerate inward investment
  location determination for the NWCR.
- Other meetings were held with key US coast contacts including Harvard University and the World Trade Centre in Boston.

#### North West City Region - Irish Embassy Event in London

This North West City Region event was hosted by Ambassador Martin Frazer on 4th December 2023 at the Embassy of Ireland in London. The objective of this event was to promote Ireland's North West City Region in relation to trade and investment and to demonstrate the competitive advantages of doing business in the North West City Region. The event is also marked the 25-year anniversary of the Good Friday agreement and to share success stories of how the region has evolved since from an economic development perspective and highlighted the benefit to businesses of locating in this region which can provide seamless market access to both the EU and UK. The Cathaoirleach of Donegal County Council Cllr. Martin Harley and Mayor of Derry City and Strabane District Council, Patricia Logue along with Council Executive representatives were in attendance.

Approximately 60 guests attended the event including key business and community representatives, partner organisations, key influencers and Diaspora representatives. The event provided an opportunity to strengthen relationships with the Diaspora and other key contacts in the UK.

And included a panel discussion moderated by Tip O'Neill recipient 2023, Caroline McLaughlin, Executive Director at Morgan Stanley, UK. Panelists included Denis Curran, Head of Regions, Property and Enterprise Development at the IDA and Darragh McCarthy, CEO at FinTrU.

The event was also supported by stakeholders including the IDA Ireland, Invest NI, Enterprise Ireland, Atlantic Technological University, Ulster University, Donegal ETB and the North West Regional College along with businesses operating in the region. Those who attended are being invited to continue to engage with the NWCR via the various social media channels and ezines.

Promoting regions as viable locations for digital nomads to work represents an opportunity for the sustainable development of partner regions. The EDIN project intends to engage in knowledge exchange learning on how to adapt or change policy instruments in order to attract digital nomads to the variety of member states involved in the project in order to fully exploit the benefits they can bring to the regions in the form of talent, tech and tourism.

#### **AER Summer Academy 2024**

#### 2. Social Housing through Turnkey Acquisition

Donegal County Council's turnkey acquisition process is continuing throughout the county. A proposal for 29 housing units at Gweedore has Department approval and subject to the signing of contracts, works are expected to commence on site in Q1 2024.

A proposal to construct 11 no. social housing units on lands in Creeslough has planning permission and Uisce Eireann approval. Department Approval has also been obtained. The Council is working with the Developer seeking final agreement on costs and programme delivery. The proposal remains subject to contract.

Donegal County Council has opened a new turnkey acquisition process seeking proposals from Developers to deliver turnkey social housing units to help meet the Council's social housing need. This is a county-wide process and proposals can be made for any town or village throughout the county, on lands suitable for housing purposes.

The Council is seeking developers to make submissions for 1, 2, 3 & 4 bedroom housing units. Proposals must contain a minimum of 5 units and can include:

- Completed units, including potential regeneration projects.
- Units under construction.
- Units to be constructed on suitable sites.

This process has been advertised on eTenders (reference RFT 2461070), where all documentation and information can be obtained. Submissions must be made in strict accordance with the requirements of the procurement documentation and the deadline for submission is 16.30 on Wednesday, 30th of September 2026. Any enquiries from interested parties should be sent via eTenders.

# 3. Lands / Property for Social Housing Purposes

The Council is actively pursuing the acquisition of lands suitable for housing purposes, in towns and villages where there is currently not a social housing solution available.

The Council has made offers to acquire lands for social housing and are sale agreed subject to contract in Fintown and Falcarragh. An offer to acquire land in Gweedore has also been made.

The site at Fintown is subject to contract and planning approval and the site in Falcarragh is subject to contract and confirmation of utility connections.

As part of the process of acquiring land, the team liaises and consults on a cross-directorate basis with other Council services in carrying out due diligence in respect of each acquisition and considers the following: zoning, easements for connections to utilities and vision lines, Uisce Eireann connection agreements, footpath connectivity to town centre, flood risk assessment and surface water discharge point with capacity and easements.

A number of land parcels have and are being considered in Annagry (1 Plot), Ardara (4 plots), Glenties (5 Plots), Kilclooney (1 Plot), Dungloe (2 plots), Burtonport(1 Plot), Arranmore Island(1 Plot), Gweedore (2 Plots), Falcarragh (2 Plots), Dunfanaghy(1 Plot) and Doochary (1 Plot).
